Service Summary



Survivors Served

Some survivors utilize multiple programs. In total 463 unduplicated survivors were served (a 7% increase)—168 in emergency shelter; 118 in long term housing; and 237 through our nonresidential program.



Prevention Presentations

Our prevention specialists provided 432 classroom presentations for 1,482 unduplicated youth, teaching them the elements of a healthy relationship.



Crisis Calls Answered

Staff responded to 3,869 crisis calls this year, providing safety planning, crisis response, and support over the phone.



Nights of Safety

The agency provided 4,415 nights of safety for survivors residing in our emergency shelter program.



Support Groups

Survivors participated in over 56 support, education, and therapy groups where they learned new skills and fellowshiped with one another.



Professionals Trained

Over 270 professionals throughout our service area participated in specific training related to domestic violence and sexual assault.

Impact

"The first night I left my abusive relationship I had a sense of peace. Like a huge weight had been lifted off my shoulders. For the first time, I felt free. I laid my head down on my pillow that night cuddling with my babies and that was the first time that I felt safe."

"Alternatives has helped me find myself, helped let me know it was okay to be alone. They helped me when I had nothing and nowhere to go."

"They showed me how to believe in myself again, how to save and budget, and how to spot red flag signs of what to accept and not accept. They also helped me and my family gain housing."

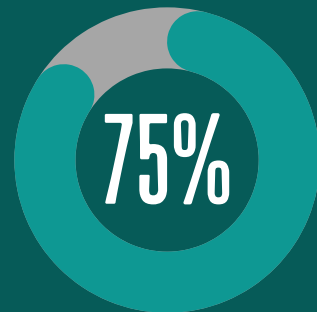
"I have already overcome so many milestones. I see myself doing better and being able to do it on my own."



88% of housing program residents participating in case management increased their self-sufficiency.



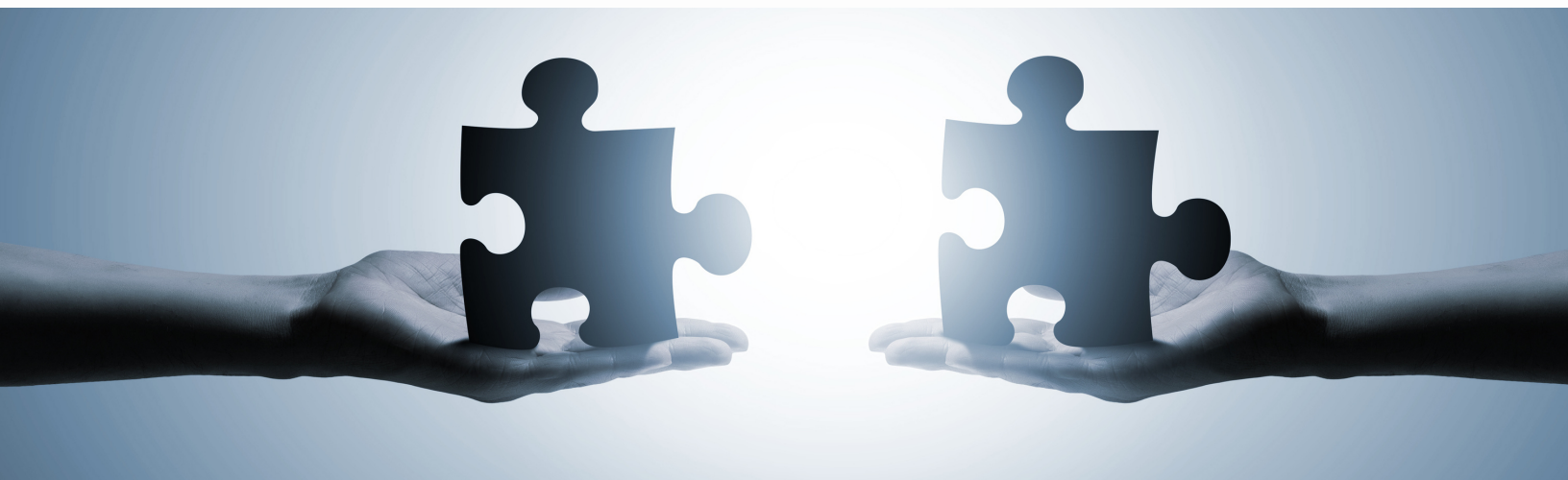
93% of survivors working with our programs established a safety plan.



75% of prevention program participants felt ready to intervene after completing the program.

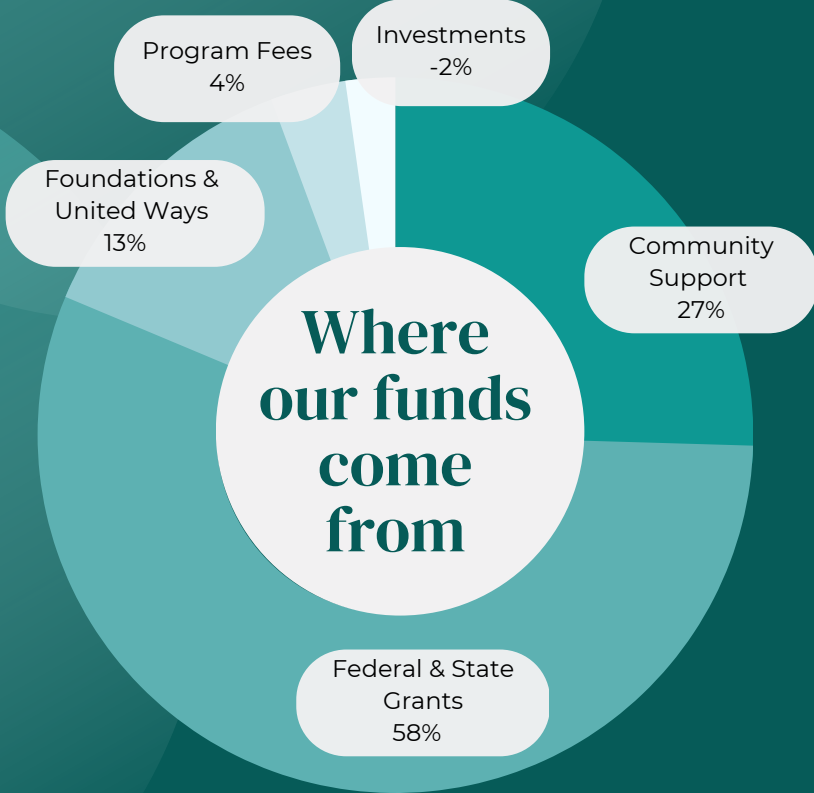

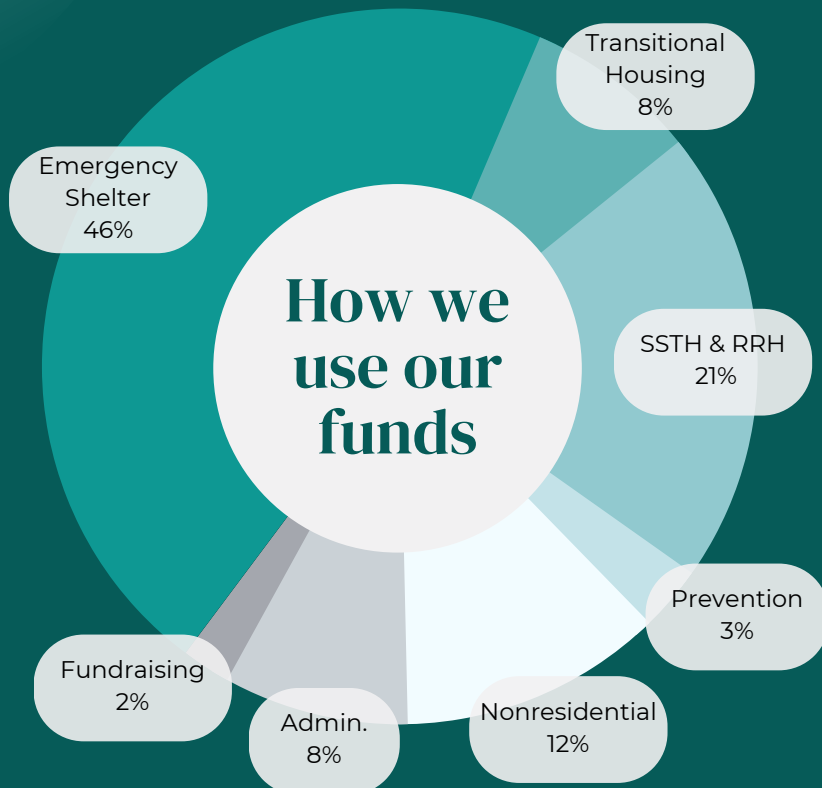
