

Parent Corner: Suggestions for talking to your student about reading!

- Take a moment to ask your child what they are reading and what they are enjoying about it.
- Encourage your child to use lots of details in their responses.
- Older students should be able to tell you what <u>genre</u> they are reading and details about the characters, setting, and the problems in the story.
- Younger students should be able to describe the setting and talk about the main characters.
- Encourage your child to make connections from the story to real-world experiences.

Halloween Parade

- 1. On the school web site, under the tab for Student Resources, there is a link that students can go to report bullying. The report sends an email to the principal.
- The second way to report bullying is to fill out a **Bullying** sheet and put it in the **Bully Box** which is located in the school library.

Throughout the month of October, teachers, staff, and students will spend time discussing related issues and how students can handle different situations when it comes to being bullied or witnessing someone else being bullied.
