2	Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) works with the hospital associations and Centers for Medicare
3	and Medicaid Services (CMS) to mandate that all inpatient hospitalized patients are required to have a
4	participating physician or mid-level provider contact the primary care physician and directly discuss the
5	case. In the event that a patient does not have a primary care physician, then it would be required that
6	the discharging physician/team at least attempt to place the patient into a medical home where timely
7	follow up can be obtained
