

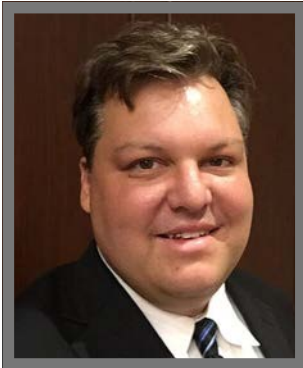

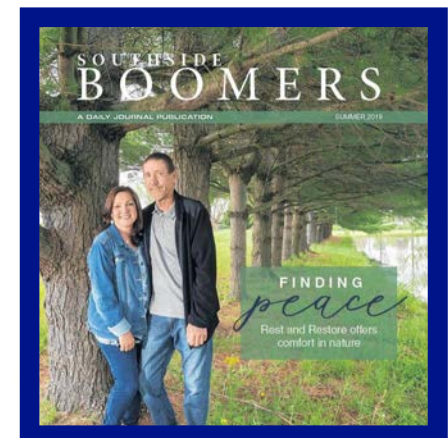



FRANKLIN COLLEGE SEEKING FACILITATORS FOR PIVOT PROGRAM

On January 27 & 28, Franklin College will implement the second year of Pivot. This program is an opportunity to expose students to different topics than they would otherwise experience at college. Approximately 500 students will participate and Franklin College is in need of 100 facilitators.

The topics and sessions are meant to be engaging, fun, relevant and hands-on. THESE ARE NOT LECTURE BASED SESSIONS. Pick a topic you are passionate about, think young people should know about (or learn to do)...and go for it! Pivot 2019 had facilitators from staff, faculty, many areas of campus, alumni, board and community members.

Examples from last year include: teaching students how to cook or knit or write thank-you notes, creating a budget, meditation, how to calmly and civilly talk about politics, religion, acceptance, how to chit-chat like a grown up over tea and cookies, how to fly fish, network, manage your time, find a summer job, tie a tie, spot fake news, and many more!

Topics must fall under these four areas: Life skills, Inclusion/Appreciation of Difference, Professional Development, or Wellness.
