LJC Staff Shares Top Gift Ideas

As we pause to give thanks and begin to look forward to the holiday season, we asked the LJC staff to offer up a few "go-to" gift ideas! We hope you enjoy!

- For the creative person in your life, I recommend **Messy**, by Tim Harford. Harford explores how a bit of chaos may help with collaboration, winning in the marketplace, and (surprisingly) being more productive. Lots of good ideas in these pages for someone that likes to read.
- If you can find a group of 5 or more people, try the game **Nanuk**. We played it with my family of six people and had a great time. It can be with adults, middle to older kids, or a mixture of both. The game involves going on an Arctic hunt and setting goals for the hunt. Each round, players decide which team to join: the team hunting, or the team that forecasts DOOM! A fast-paced social game that people can pick up quickly and enjoy.
- If you have kids (or creative adults) that want to explore how to make simple circuits with a computer, consider a **Makey Makey** kit. The kit has the pieces to design projects like a piano made of gummi worms or a staircase, or a game controller out of Play-Doh or bananas. It really works! NOTE: it is not a "step-by-step kit" with specific directions, but there are online directions and ideas, and tons of expansion possibilities. Your house may never be the same. Check out more at <u>makeymakey.com</u>, or search for examples on YouTube.
- My family loves the "Would Your Rather" game it is great for discussions and makes you think about different difficult situations that one might find themselves in (and some of them probably won't happen but just make you think) and you are forced to decide between two things. Would you rather not be able to see or not be able to hear? Why?
- Any book by Simple Truths easy to read books that typically have great leadership messages. A couple of my favorites are Finish Strong and 212 Degrees – The Extra Degree.
- A gift card to experience something new as adults we sometimes forget to keep stretching outside our comfort zone to keep learning new things. Johnson County is full of creative learning opportunities where leaders can learn to do something new. Kira's Art Studio, Franklin Parks and Recreation, The Nook, etc. Just keep learning!
- Subscription Box ...because what's easier to gift someone than a monthly subscription box you don't have to actually leave your house to buy?! Perfect as a last minute idea or just the genius option for that special someone who has everything.
 - -Birchbox for that makeup, skincare, beauty lover in your life -Hello Fresh, Blue Apron, Treatsie – for those that love to cook and bake -Wine, Book, Chocolate, Whiskey, Beer, Cheese, Ice Cream of the month clubs -The options are endless!

Get out there on Small Business Saturday (November 26th) to get some items marked off your list for the loved ones in your life. Franklin College Board of Trustees Approves Science Center Building

The Franklin College Board of Trustees approved moving forward on the construction and redevelopment of a campus science center at their fall board meeting on Friday, Oct. 7, 2016.

Through extensive interviews with Indiana business and science leaders and national science associations, the science faculty reinvented the curriculum in 2011, aligning it more closely with the growing demands of the industry. The college also launched a master's degree program in athletic training just this summer, and plans are underway to offer a master's degree program in physician assistant studies.

"The renovated and expanded science facility, coupled with our "learning science by doing science" curriculum, will engage students in project-based learning, crossfunctional collaboration, research opportunities as early as the freshman year, and sharpened oral and written scientific communication skills," said Steve Browder, Franklin College professor of biology and division head of natural sciences. "Graduates with these kinds of educational experiences and training are highly sought after by employers and graduate schools."

The college anticipates breaking ground in May and launching construction no later than June 2017. The goal is to move instruction into the new facility in fall 2018.

FC Music Department Announces Free Concerts

The Franklin College Music Department has announced its upcoming performances. All performances will be held in the Custer Theatre in Old Main at FC.

The choral concerts will feature all three college choirs: The FC Singers, the Women's Chorus and the Men's Chorus. They will perform an array of music at 7 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 9, 2016, and at 2 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 10, 2016.

The instrumental concerts will showcase Franklin College students who participate in the FC String Ensemble and the FC Wind Ensemble. Performances will take place at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 6, 2016.
