A PROVENTRACK RECORD

The last 15 years represent one of the most remarkable periods in Delta Upsilon's history. At a time when some questioned the relevance of the college fraternity, our progress in membership, academics, leadership development and alumni support has solidified North America's oldest non-secret Fraternity as *the premier brotherhood experience for college men*.

Through years of cutting-edge leadership programming, increased local chapter support, and bold *Building Better Men* initiatives, Delta Upsilon has seen an indisputable rise to prominence. Although our organizational progress has been impressive, the crowning achievement of the last 15 years has been our undergraduates' undying loyalty to DU's Four Founding Principles. **Friendship, Character, Culture** and **Justice** are the ideals that our men, our Fraternity and our world need now more than ever.

WHYTHIS CAMPAIGN?



INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT – Our members cite their individual growth and development as a major benefit of the DU experience, but currently only 38% of costs for our developmental programming are being funded by the DUEF. This is putting significant financial strain on the backs of undergraduates and local DU chapters every year, and lack of funding is often why young DUs don't take advantage of the critical educational programs and resources being offered.

CHAPTER ENHANCEMENT – It is clear our programs and initiatives—which are rooted in DU's Founding Principles—make our local chapters better when fully utilized. Our best DU chapters send 30+ students to programs annually and utilize all *Building Better Men* resources. However, DU currently only averages 12 program participants per chapter. A thriving Delta Upsilon in the future begins with a commitment to supporting students and volunteers at the local level.





FRATERNAL RELEVANCE & INNOVATION – Today's students are hungry for a collegiate experience that affords them authentic friendships and opportunities for growth—qualities rarely found in the typical classroom. Solidifying DU as a vital collegiate experience requires significant investment to evolve our current programming and to develop new initiatives that will ensure our founding ideals nurture and inspire the college men of tomorrow.




IGNITE THE CHARGE

I. THE CHARGE OF ...

INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT - \$2.4 MILLION

The hallmark of the Fraternity's *Building Better Men* mission is our ongoing investment in the hearts and minds of our undergraduates. Every year, bright and capable young men aspire to attend our award-winning educational programs, which are rooted in DU's Four Founding Principles and proven leadership development curriculum.



\$2.4 MILLION WILL IGNITE THE CHARGE OF INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT BY:

- · Funding the annual Presidents Academy for all DU Chapter Presidents.
- Launching a second session of the Delta Upsilon Emerging Leadership Experience (DUEL) at Williams College.
- Creating an ongoing member development program with local chapter activities, self-paced exploration, and online education sessions using modern technology.
- Funding 1,500+ educational program experiences annually, which removes the financial burden on local chapters and undergraduates.

II. THE CHARGE OF...

CHAPTER ENHANCEMENT - \$2.3 MILLION

Many DU educational programs are offered throughout North America, but this campaign will bring more of our *Building Better Men* resources to the local chapter level. Building a thriving DU chapter requires regional Executive Board training, ongoing volunteer coaching and annual chapter retreats designed specifically to meet local needs.



\$2.3 MILLION WILL IGNITE THE CHARGE OF CHAPTER ENHANCEMENT BY:

- Establishing an endowment to ensure 25 DU chapters receive customized Building Better Men Retreats each year.
- Funding scholarships for five Regional Leadership Academies benefiting all individual chapter officers and executive committees, annually.
- Ensuring local chapter advisors learn effective coaching and operational best-practices at the Advisors Academy.
- Launching Chapter Legacy Plans to allow alumni to endow 15 or more educational program scholarships exclusively for their DU chapter.

III. THE CHARGE OF ...

FRATERNAL RELEVANCE & INNOVATION - \$1.3 MILLION

Solidifying Delta Upsilon as a relevant and innovative organization in the decades ahead requires both the evolution of our current *Building Better Men* resources and the execution of forward-thinking research and initiatives. The vitality of the college fraternity hinges on DU and like-minded organizations that prove to the world we are meeting the needs of college men in unmatched ways.



\$1.3 MILLION WILL IGNITE THE CHARGE OF FRATERNAL RELEVANCE & INNOVATION BY:

- Launching a new Senior Leadership Experience for undergraduate seniors and distinguished DU alumni focused on professional development and career coaching.
- Funding three years of the DYAD Membership Outcomes Assessment, which measures DU's educational programming and undergraduate behaviors, values and problem-solving skills.
- Ensuring Delta Upsilon serves as a leader within the North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) through ongoing advocacy and research initiatives.
- Investing in modern technologies that enhance our programs and provide local chapters with online coaching and ongoing developmental webinars.
