

Cross-Bores In Sewers Up for Discussion

Drain cleaning, a call plumbers get everyday.

Clearing roots, grease build-up, and broken lines now have a new component added to the mix. As many contractors know, utility cross-bores are becoming a more frequent occurrence. A cross-bore is the result of directional boring of utilities that could include gas lines, electric distribution lines, or fiber optic communication cables, cutting through sewer laterals.

Some utilities have been distributing public awareness literature to consumers and contractors outlining the issue and its attendant risks. Many of these documents are giving the impression that utility locators are required to be notified prior to drain cleaning work. The safety risks can be significant, cutting gas or electric lines can be disastrous.

Delays to consumers while awaiting locates could additionally be costly to contractors in terms of manhours lost waiting for locating services. Consumers may elect to seek lesser informed drain cleaning companies

and ignore the hazard. A greater problem scenario would be having called for a locate, the locate markings suggest a conflict, the contractor excavating to find the incursion, then



ultimately finding the stoppage was actually roots. It is unclear how this expense would be handled, consumers would feel burdened by this and utilities may not be inclined to pay; the contractor is.

PHCC has been looking into this problem and was represented by Dave Frame, of Bob Frame Plumbing Services, and Chuck White, PHCC VP of Regulatory Affairs, at an Indiana stakeholders meeting hosted by Safe Dig Indiana. A major point of discussion was on the topic of

utility cross-bores in sewer laterals. Others present at the meeting were representatives from the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission; most gas, telecom, and electrical utilities; several underground locator agencies; and major excavating firms doing business in Indiana.

Initially, the problem awareness level of the non-plumbing/excavating participants varied with gas providers seeming to be most aware. At times the discussion was lively but productive, it was readily apparent that request for locates on all sewer cleaning calls would swamp the locating system and the related locator contractors. As a loss of service call, these would be priority locates for that industry. At the end of the meeting all parties had a full explanation of the problems that excavators and drain cleaning contractors face due to cross-bores. Further the plumbing industry and excavators emphasized the hazard was created by the placement of bored in utilities.

Two utilities have started procedures to verify sewer line locations on future boring jobs and to verify sewer laterals have not been impacted as a result of their work. Communication will continue on this issue and all parties agreed to work towards a permanent solution. For more information, contact Chuck White, white@naphcc.org.




