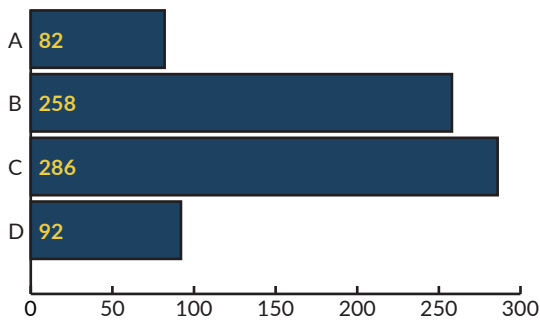

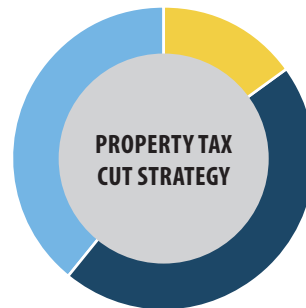
1. Which **one** of these taxes would you most like to see Indiana reduce/eliminate in the future?

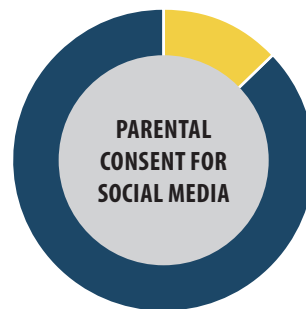

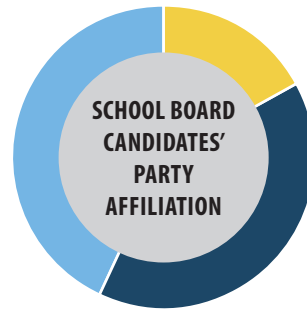

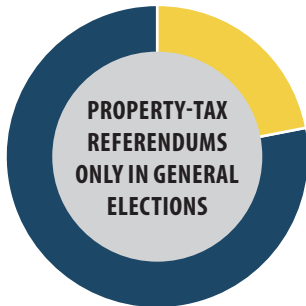

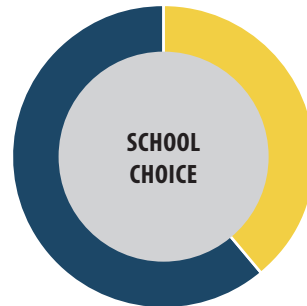
7. Voter turnout is normally the highest during November General Elections. Would you **support** or **oppose** a law requiring local property-tax referendums to be conducted only during General Elections?

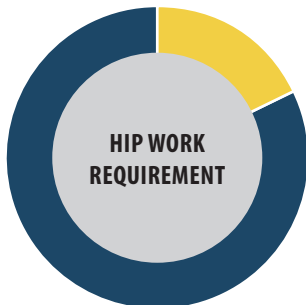
8. Should Indiana give every Hoosier family the right to use state education dollars to attend the school of their choice – whether it's a public or private school?

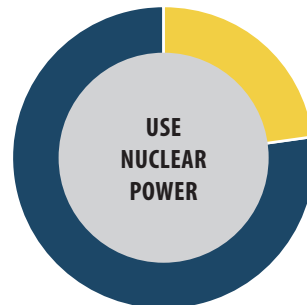
9. Should Indiana require able-bodied adults to work or look for work in order to receive publicly funded health-care coverage under the Healthy Indiana Plan?
