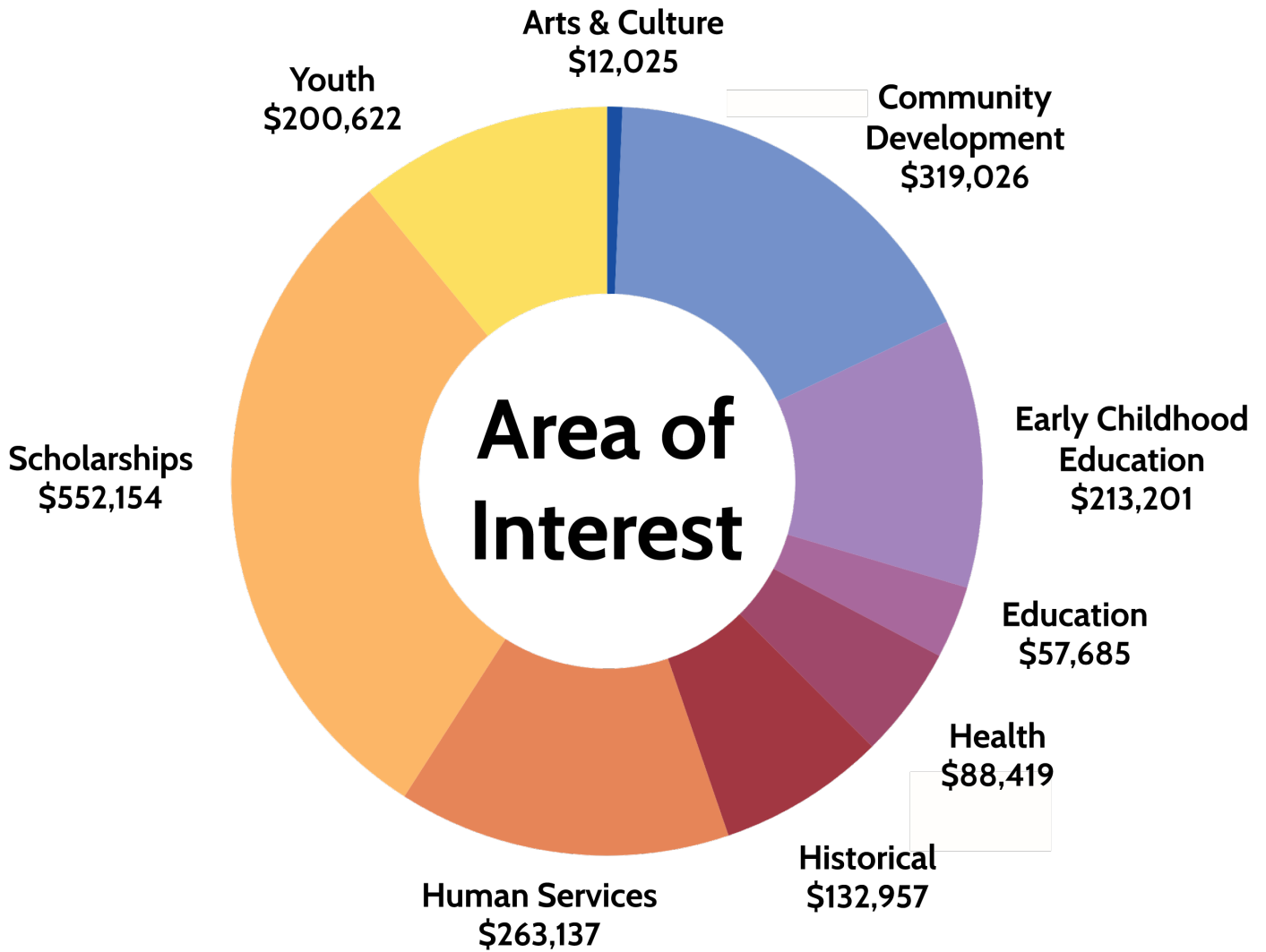

# Investing in Local History

If walls could talk, the carriage house that sits on the grounds of the Lew Wallace Study and Museum would most likely have plenty to say. Over the past 156 years, the bright yellow, two-story building has witnessed a lot of changes and served a variety of purposes.

Lew and Susan Wallace had the carriage house built behind their home in 1870. It contained a carriage room, hayloft, stable, and space for Lew to work on his inventions. In the 1940s it was remodeled and used by various scout groups until the 1960s. In 2004, it was once again remodeled to become the museum office and a starting point for visitors, an exhibit space, and collections storage.

Twenty years later, an assessment of the building revealed some structural concerns that were in critical need of being addressed. As the oldest building in Crawfordsville directly associated with Lew Wallace, the carriage house has long been a preservation priority of the Lew Wallace Study Preservation Society.

With the help of a \$75,000 MCCF grant, awarded in 2024, work on the Carriage House took place throughout 2025. New beams were added to reinforce the upstairs, rotting siding was removed, and two windows were replaced. Now complete, the Carriage House is sturdier than ever and can continue welcoming visitors from all over.

# Investing in Art for All to Enjoy

Artist Jenna Morello returned to Montgomery County in July to create another amazing mural in Downtown Crawfordsville! Many might remember Jenna from her first visit to the community in 2021, when she transformed the alley next to the MCCF office.

This time around, Jenna took a much different approach, creating a stained glass-like mural on Green Street, also in Downtown Crawfordsville. The piece features a few “nods” to Indiana and Montgomery County, including Sugar Creek, a cardinal, and a spin on the many historic homes in the area. Jenna shared that she was inspired by her walks through the neighborhoods surrounding Wabash College.

The latest mural project was the result of a READI Quality of Life grant awarded to the City of Crawfordsville. MCCF provided an additional \$10,000 grant to help meet matching fund requirements. We are so excited for the community to enjoy this beautiful new addition to downtown Crawfordsville.





# Investing in *Peace, Safety, and Hope*

The Family Crisis Shelter continues to be a vital source of peace, safety, and hope for women who have been victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. An MCCF grant of \$9,632 was awarded in 2025 to fund the purchase of new appliances for four of the Shelter's apartments. This included washers and dryers, stoves, refrigerators, and microwaves. These basic items ensure that each unit is fully functional, allowing residents to meet their daily needs in a safe and dependable environment.

Admission into the Shelter's apartment program is guided by a matrix designed to ensure each resident is ready for this step toward stability. Once accepted, women partner with staff to set personal goals and connect with resources that support their long-term success, from employment to child care and financial planning. The program typically lasts about a year, during which residents pay an affordable monthly fee. This is especially helpful for those navigating inconsistent income and unreliable child support.

More than housing, the Shelter provides consistent, around-the-clock support. Staff are available 24/7, offering guidance, accountability, and reassurance during a critical time of transition. With safe shelter, practical resources, and a strong support system, residents are able to focus on building stability for themselves and their families.

# Investing in Every Mile

Sunshine Vans has been a fixture in the community for decades, serving senior citizens and those with disabilities. When conversations began around developing a public transportation system for all ages, it quickly caught interest, and a committee was formed. They found that the most logical solution was to expand the existing Sunshine Vans program.

To prepare for the expansion, MCF awarded an \$88,031 grant to the Crawfordsville Parks and Recreation Department, which manages the program. This helped purchase three vehicles (one low-floor wheelchair minivan and two multi-passenger wheelchair accessible vehicles) as well as Trip Master Software, tablets for trip-tracking, and two-way radios. The newly rebranded service, now called Crawfordsville Area Transportation, launched in January and has been a great success.

“A lot of people don’t realize that this is some clients’ only way to get out of their homes and in the community,” said Belinda Young, Director of Senior Programs for Crawfordsville Parks and Recreation. “It’s more than just doctors appointments. Some are using it to get to work, run errands, meet with friends, and so many other things.”



Crawfordsville Area Transportation is open to all ages and operates Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It offers both demand response and advance reservations to destinations within Montgomery County, as well as out-of-county medical facilities. Fares vary based on trip mileage and age. The shared-ride service currently has twelve drivers, all ready to safely transport riders to their destinations with a smile.

# Investing in Our Children

A crowd of nearly 100 gathered on a cold, blustery afternoon in March for the long-awaited ribbon cutting for the new Montgomery County Early Learning Center (MCELC). In attendance were representatives from the 16 partners, along with many others who supported the project in countless ways.

This transformational community project officially opened March 17, 2025, providing 124 high-quality child care seats for infants through age five. Located at 110 W South Boulevard in Crawfordsville, the facility was constructed to meet and exceed state licensing requirements.

KinderCare operates the MCELC, providing high-quality education to children in a safe and reliable environment with qualified staff. With over 55 years of experience in early childhood care and education, KinderCare utilizes research-based curriculum designed for young children.

Now that the doors are open, the center's unique model has gained attention on both a state and national level. The MCELC project was a \$5 million investment made possible through a unique partnership of businesses, government, and philanthropy working together to create long-term, sustainable solutions to meet the critical need for additional high-quality child care. Many are interested in replicating it in their own communities.



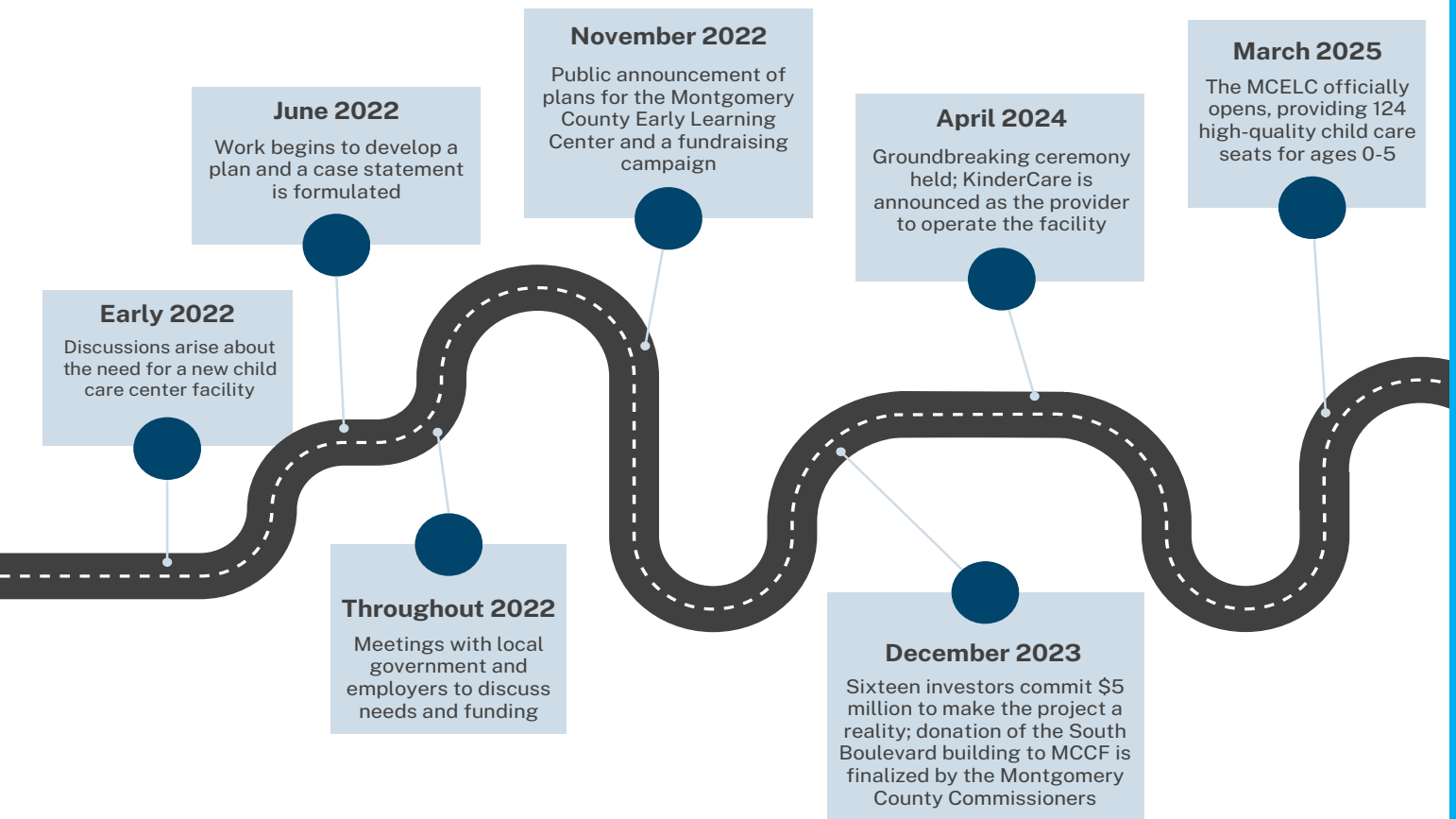

Camp Milligan was created in 2022 as a partnership between MCCF and the City of Crawfordsville Parks and Recreation Department after working parents shared the struggles of finding summer care for their school-age children. Three of the current counselors are also MCCF scholarship recipients working toward careers in education. ### Q: What is the most rewarding part of serving as a counselor at Camp Milligan?

**Adam:** Seeing campers experience the highlights of summer camp: creating meaningful friendships, learning group games, participating in crafts and activities, and visiting field trip locations. It is so fulfilling to help support the next generation and see them have such positive experiences during the summer.

### Q: How has working as a counselor helped prepare you for your future career?

**Adam:** When I first started working at Camp Milligan, I had just graduated high school and never really had experience overseeing a big group of kids. Over the past few years, I have learned how to direct, lead, and most importantly connect with campers in a class-like setting.

**Rylie:** This experience has helped prepare me for my career by giving me the chance to make connections with campers, aid in their learning, watch them grow, and so much more. I have learned a lot about working as part of a team and how important it is to collaborate.

**Teegan:** My experience working for Camp Milligan has helped me work on leadership skills and my classroom management skills. Being able to work with a group of kids and give direction is something you don't get as often in field experiences outside of student teaching.

### Q: How has receiving scholarships from MCCF helped support your education?

**Adam:** Purdue University is well known for its rigorous math program, and as a math education student it can be very stressful at times. Because of the generosity of MCCF, I have had the opportunity to only work part-time during school and focus primarily on my education.

**Rylie:** Receiving scholarships from MCCF has given me the opportunity to continue my education in a field that I am so passionate about. My scholarships have helped me throughout my undergraduate career and into graduate school.

**Teegan:** Receiving scholarships has helped me better fund my education so I am able to focus a little less on financials, and put that extra energy into my education.

### Q: What are some of your goals for the future?

**Adam:** First and foremost, a big goal of mine is to graduate college and become an educator. Following this, I would like to work towards a master's degree in administration while I teach at a high school. Outside of my career, I want to be a high-impact citizen in my community through church, volunteer work, and anything else I can do to give back.

**Rylie:** I hope to work as a speech-language pathologist focusing on working with pediatrics. I would love to be in a school setting or in a medical setting, but I am undecided right now. I hope to continue to serve Montgomery County and our youth in some way in the future.

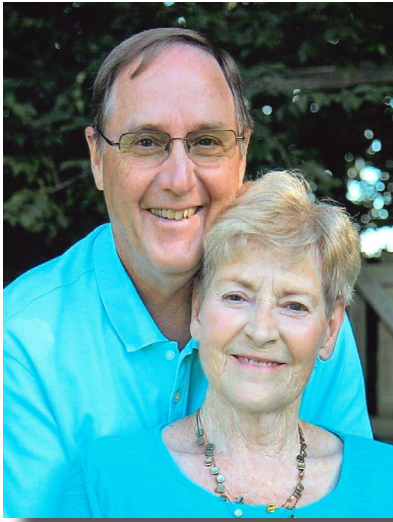
***A Note from Ava:***

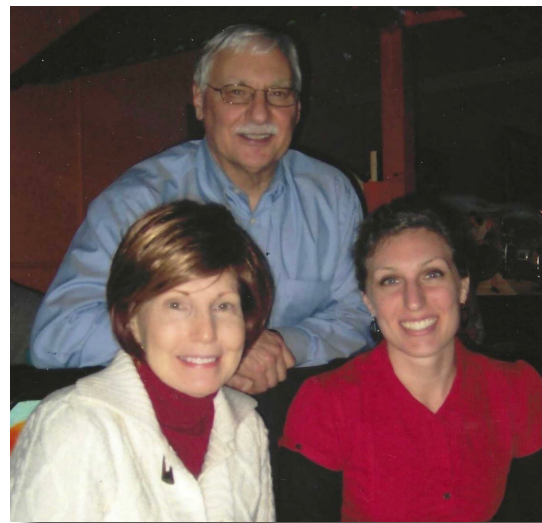
## The Mike Grant Fund

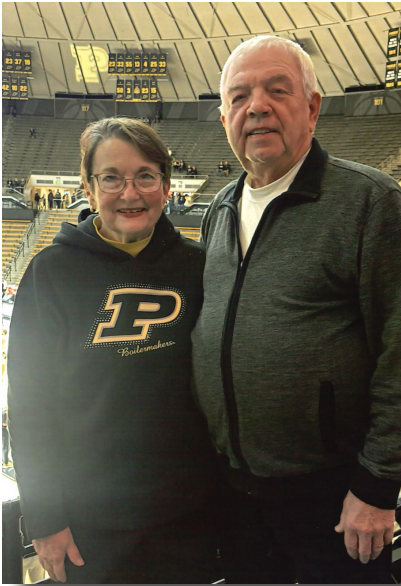
## The Dale Milligan Family Fund

## How does an endowment work?

An endowment is a “savings account” within which a substantial amount of money can be built from contributions both large and small. These gifts are invested in a balanced, diversified portfolio and the proceeds are used to support specific nonprofits or projects as determined by the foundation's community leaders. The scope of the endowment is defined by the people creating it. The staff of the Community Foundation handles the “administrative detail” and frees up those critical volunteers to evaluate and assess the needs and opportunities within the community.

Generally, donors to endowments are those who want to ensure the future of their community. Most endowment gifts are “planned” and donors use such charitable vehicles as bequests, trusts, life insurance policies and retirement accounts. Whatever the gift, donors make it with the intention of having it prudently invested and protected for the future. When the foundation accepts an endowment gift, the foundation promises the donor that their wishes will be observed.

## Field of Interest Funds

A Field of Interest Fund allows you to choose a particular area of charitable interest that you would like to support. The MCCF Board of Directors then identifies the most qualified local charities which work to support your area of interest. **Fund minimum: \$5,000**

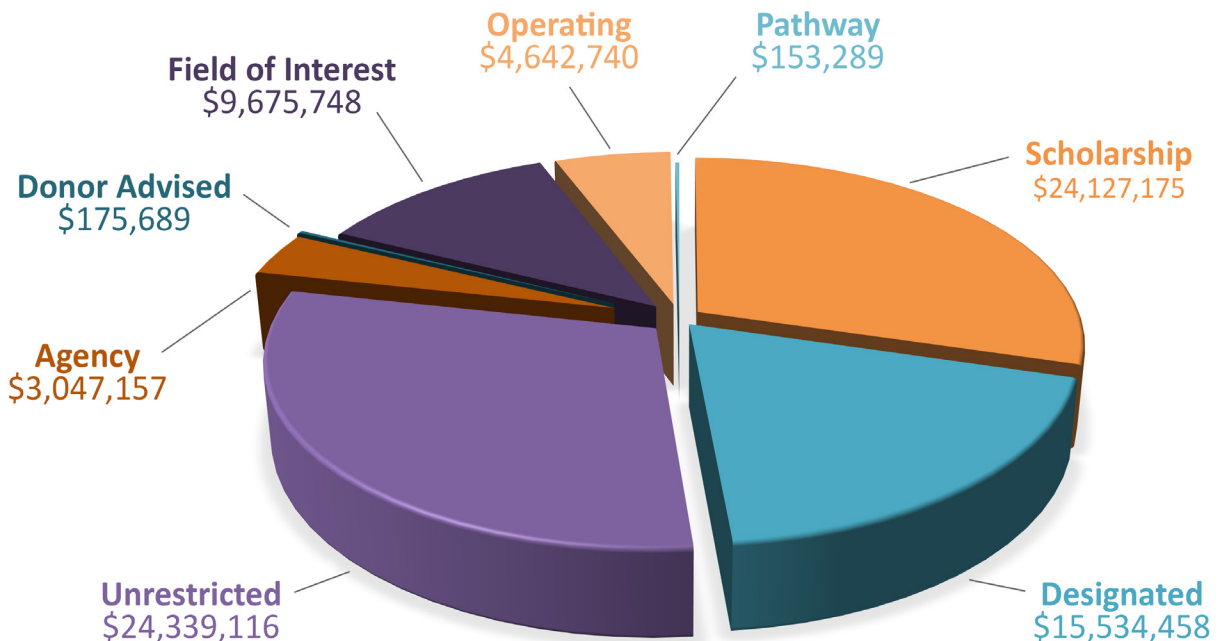
