# "HOPE FOR THE BEST, BUT PLAN FOR THE WORST!"


- All activities in IIEP should be completed prior to May 14 due to the transition of the IIEP program to the LINK. Please make sure to plan accordingly!

#### Register for "Use It Tomorrow AAC: Data Ideas on March 1


