#### **MAMMOGRAPHY**

If you see a lot of pink around in October, it's not because it's a new fall color. It's because October is National Breast Cancer Awareness month, and its official color of pink serves as a visual cue for women to learn more about breast cancer and the importance of regular testing and early detection.

#### THE BEST IN TECHNOLOGY

Many diagnostic tests and screenings done through DeKalb Health Imaging require the use of a Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) machine. As the name implies, these machines use highquality, strong magnets to create images that doctors can use to assess and diagnose patients for a variety of illnesses and injuries. With MRI machines, the higher-quality and stronger the magnets, the clearer and more resonant the image, meaning the easier it is for doctors to clearly view images and correctly diagnose illness and injury.

#### **SPORTS MEDICINE PROGRAM**

DeKalb Health offers area schools its own talented and experienced team of athletic trainers who work closely with are student athletes.

Young athletes in just about every sport face any number of aches, pains, sore muscles, twisted ankles and other minor injuries that can keep them from competition, so DeKalb Health partners with area school to have its four athletic trainers on-site on a weekly basis to attend to injured student athletes. This includes schools not just in DeKalb County, but Noble and Steuben counties as well.

Jamie Leeper, director of wellness and rehabilitation for DeKalb Health, says having our athletic trainers available to student athletes through these partnerships with area middle and high schools makes

# CONCUSSION TESTING PROGRAM

Preventing short-term injuries from having long-term impacts has never been more important than when it comes to concussions. This is a big reason why DeKalb Health is rolling out a pioneering new program that makes it easier to assess and diagnose potential concussions in middle and high-school student athletes in all sports this year.

The process starts by putting each student athlete at participating schools through an initial test, known as the ImPACT (Immediate Post-Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing) program. The approximate 20-minute test measures athlete levels across a variety of symptoms and baseline levels, including verbal and visual memory, reaction time and processing speed. Those test results are loaded into a database and made part of a smartphone app. (Yes, there's even an app for that.)

Then, if an athlete is suspected of having suffered a concussion on the field of play, a certified ImPACT provider with access to the app can compare the results of a newly administered ImPACT test with the athlete's original, baseline one. This is important because it takes much of the guesswork out of diagnosing a concussion, says Bret Kueber, MD, of DeKalb Health Medical Group.

"There's been an incredible amount of thought and research put into this program," he explains. "As more and more people understand how dangerous concussions can be, they are also learning how crucial proper diagnosis and post-concussion treatment is. This program is a huge step forward in doing that."

If ImPACT confirms a concussion in the athlete, the athlete's activity is restricted until the symptoms subside and the athlete returns to their baseline level. Only after they are symptom free and released by the provider he or she is put through a five-day "Return to Play" protocol. It's a progressive, multistep recovery process, one that is highly structured and closely monitored by a certified ImPACT provider and athletic trainer.

"Again, our primary focus is preventing long-term lasting health effects in these young people," Kueber adds. "The brain is not an easy thing to fix. Our focus is on protecting these young people and giving them the chance to fully recover."


### WELCOME TO THE TEAM.
