



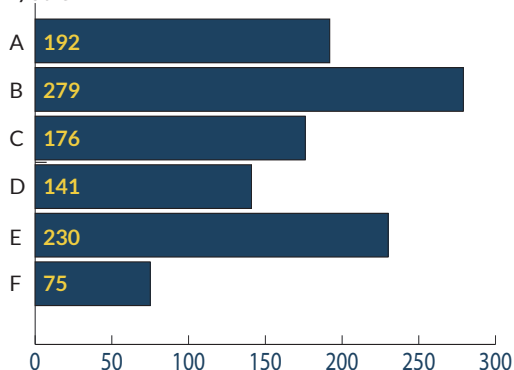

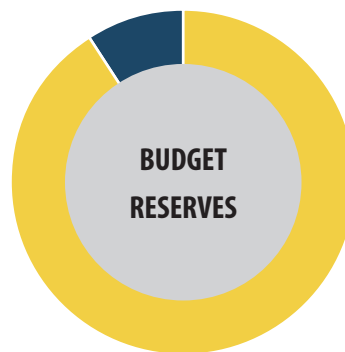
- 1.** When the legislature adopts a new state budget during the 2019 session, which one of the following do you think should be the top priority?

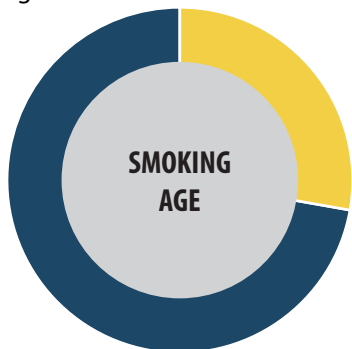

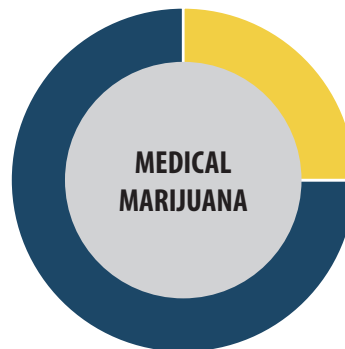

- 3.** The minimum legal age to buy cigarettes in Indiana is currently 18. Do you support or oppose raising the smoking age to 21?



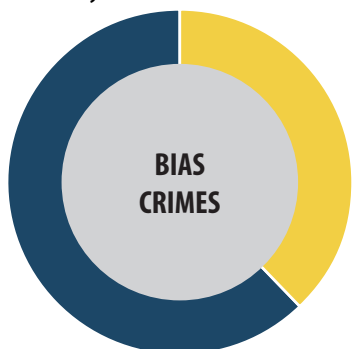

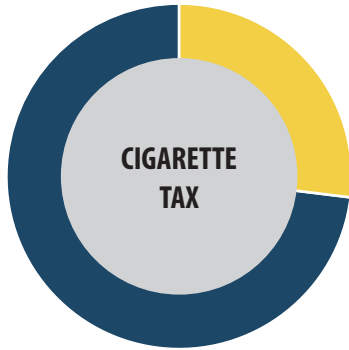

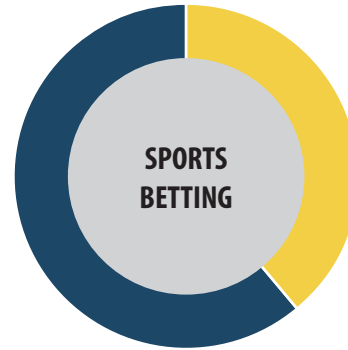
- 6.** Do you support or oppose raising Indiana's cigarette tax by \$1.50 per pack in order to deter smoking and pay for health programs?

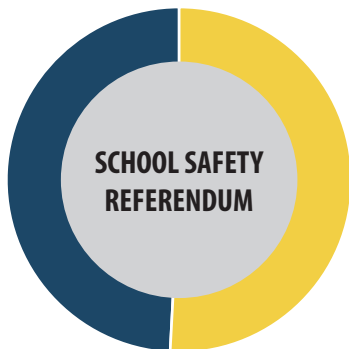
- 7.** Do you support or oppose legalizing sports betting in Indiana?

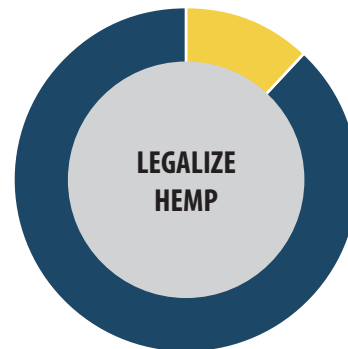
- 8.** Do you support or oppose giving schools the ability to propose property-tax referendums specifically to pay for school safety improvements?
