Computer Science

- **Intro to Computer Science**
 - Offered as a one semester or two semester course
 - Students can earn up to two credits in Intro to CS
 - Covers HTML/CSS and Block Coding and the Design Process
 - Code.org CS: Discoveries Curriculum
- **Computer Science I**
 - Computer Science Principles
 - 2 semester course
 - Students have the opportunity to take the AP exam to earn college credit.
 - Code.org AP CS Principles Curriculum
- **Information Technology Support (Tech Tribe)**
 - 2 semesters each year
 - Students learn the basics of customer service, following procedures, device repair, and have the opportunity to earn their Dell Certification

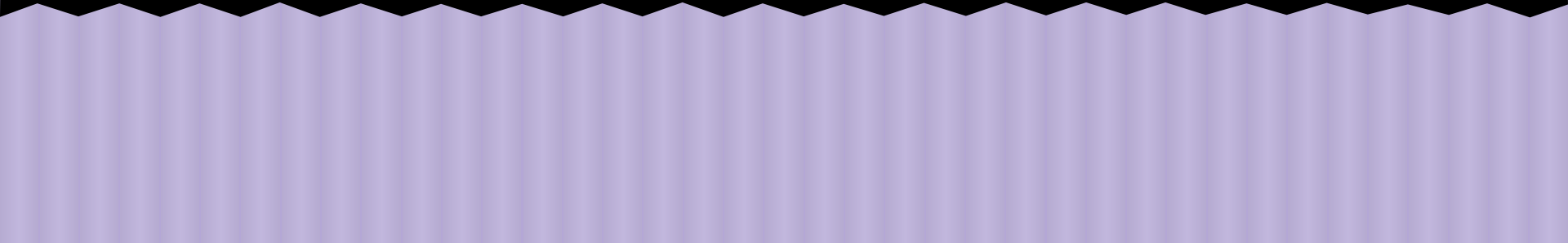

- Students must have and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA

- b. Work Based Learning (WBL or Career Exploration Internship in grade 12 or a job with proof of 180 hours during grade 11 or 12.)

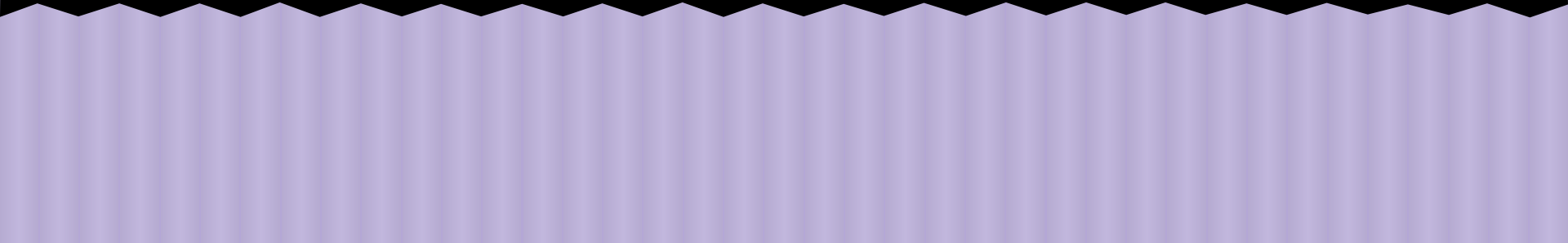

2020-2021 Scheduling Process

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Scheduling Process

- ★ Counselor Presentations in IRP
- ★ Complete scheduling worksheet
- ★ Confirm diploma choice and review requirements
- ★ Online Course Requests beginning January 28th
 - Worksheet must be completed in order to request courses online
- ★ Request Summary, signature required
- ★ Email course request changes through May 1st
 - Most requests approved through March 20th
 - Requests approved by availability through May 1st

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- ★ Review diploma requirements
- ★ Review prerequisites
 - Digital Curriculum Guide
- ★ Complete ICHS course applications
- ★ Complete course worksheet
 - 14 course requests
 - 4 minimum alternate requests

Freshmen Timeline

- ★ Request courses: Week of Jan 28th in IRP
 - ★ Course Request Sheets: Feb 14th
 - ★ Course Request Changes: May 1st
- These deadlines are important. There will be no exceptions.

May 1st

- ★ No Schedule Changes Allowed After May 1st
 - Request via Email for any changes through Mar 20
 - Request via Email for any elective changes through May 1.
These will be approved only if availability allows

- ★ Rationale
 - Course fees
 - Class offerings
 - Rosters and Section Balancing
 - Smooth transition to a new school year
