## Learn About Different Scientists at the Trafalgar Branch

Franklin, Ind. – Be a chemist, a physicist or an archaeologist! Learn about a different scientist and the kind of work they do each month at the Trafalgar Branch.

**Be a Chemist March 7:** What does a chemist do at work? Perform experiments and explore the work of chemists like Marie Curie who discovered a new element, and Reatha Clark King, who contributed important research to NASA.

**Be a Physicist April 11:** What does a physicist do at work? Perform experiments and explore the work of physicists like Isaac Newton and Katharine Burr Blodgett, the first woman to get her Ph.D. from Cambridge and discovered a way to measure things you can't see.

**Be an Archaeologist May 16:** What does an archaeologist do at work? Perform experiments and explore the work of archaeologists like Gertrude Bell, who was also a spy, and Howard Carter, who discovered King Tut's tomb.
