Criteria for 200

The chapter host events during a "formal" recruitment period.

- See the Spring and Fall 2019 recruitment schedules on pages 9 and 12 of this document.
- The Sections highlighted in yellow satisfy are events coordinated during SHSU's formal recruitment process.
- Formal recruitment at SHSU is one week a semester. The week involves recruits travelling from Fraternity recruitment site to fraternity recruitment site. For Epsilon Zeta they travel to the Delt Shelter. This process is repeated for three nights Tuesday-Thursday. Friday night each chapter has a formal bidding session where they decide who they want to give rush bids too.

Criteria for 400

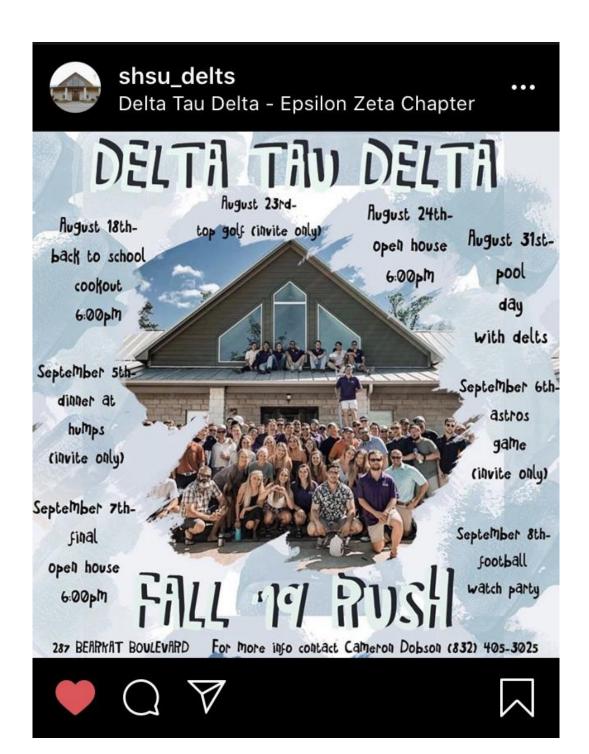

1. What is the Purpose of the Recruitment Committee?

Support the coordination of chapter growth by assisting the director of recruitment to identify and add men who uphold our values to the chapter. (Long Version)

Help the recruitment chair to plan and execute. (Short version)

- 2. What is a chapter growth goal?
- A ideal chapter size after calculating the number of men graduating or leaving the chapter due to suspensions, expulsions, transfers, or otherwise leaving the chapter for uncontrollable circumstances.
- 3. How do we establish a chapter growth goal, and a goal for adding numbers of potential new members? (Desired Chapter Size should be a range and not a set number i.e. 50 to 55 men or 55 to 60 men, not just 55 or 60 by its self.)

Desired Chapter Size = Current Chapter Size - Men Leaving Chapter + Growth Goal (Or Desired Chapter Size - Current Chapter Size + Men Leaving Chapter = Growth Goal)

Number of recruitment referrals needed to achieve growth goal:

10 x Growth Goal = Number of referrals needed

4. SWOT Analysis

Strengths

- 1. Shelter Proximity to Campus/Quality and Clean Structure
- 2. Youthful chapter with good access to underclassmen looking to join a student org
- 3. Proactive communication from the membership
- 4. Good retention of membership (well better than normal shsu students)
- 5. good at setting up a devoted early following of men
- 6. Good organization involvement (campus outreach)
- 7. scholarships provide good data on quality of men, their level of interest, and prior commitment

Weaknesses

- 1. Poor programming at events: not a set schedule, not enough coordinated activities
- 2. 'Kitchen Crew' -> we could better educate and find ways to engage the men who are not extroverts or super sociable (have them read good guys/ 'How to win friends and influence people' by dale carnegie)

Opportunities

- 1. IFC open houses help bring guys to our shelter, we have a relative good venue vs the rest of IFC
- 2. Campus Outreach
- 3. Involved Brothers on Campus (Edgar/Zach Hutson)

- 4. Getting brothers as part of the visitor center
- 5. getting brothers to be orientation leaders
- 6. Non-greek IM sports teams
- 7. recruiting from varsity and club sports
- 8. Better utilize sweethearts (Identify men dating sorority women who are not greek; identify men coming from the same high schools as sorority women)
- 9. high school pipelines (Send scholarship to guidance counselors from schools that send many men to SHSU)
- 10. Alumni (Use news letters/social media to seek referrals)
- 11. Professors (Give referral cards out at the Faculty and Staff Appreciation Dinner; Invite Doug Kreinke to a recruitment meeting)
- 12. Utilize philanthropy events as a gate to talk to potentials easier to approach someone and invite to dog days versus "hey wanna rush delt?"

Threats

- 1. Risk Management
- 2. Other fraternities may try and tarnish our reputation
- 3. Be wary of recruiting men who dropped other fraternities (Not a hard no, but need to do due diligence: contact the chapter they dropped, speak with friends/girls of the individual; ask the individual directly why they dropped)
- 4. Perception of Women's Organizations (Need to have a comprehensive strategy that engages all women's organization and doesn't act snobby or elitist to chapters we don't normally interact with; i.e. we could better participate in events with chapters we haven't in the past)
