DU CODE OF CONDUCT

I understand and will adhere to the following policies throughout the duration of the 2026 Leadership Institute:

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will know and understand our Founding Principles—Friendship, Character, Culture and Justice—and will strive to incorporate them into my daily life.

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will respect the dignity of all persons; therefore I will not physically, mentally, psychologically or sexually abuse or haze any human being.

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will protect the health and safety of all human beings.

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will respect my property and the property of others; therefore, I will neither abuse nor tolerate abuse of property.

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will neither use nor support the use of illegal drugs; I will neither misuse nor support the misuse of alcohol.

As a Delta Upsilon brother, I will challenge all my Fraternity brothers to abide by these fraternal expectations and will confront those who violate them.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Educational programs, meetings and meals are mandatory for all undergraduates. Failure to attend an event or program may result in your dismissal from the conference and hotel, as well as forfeiture of any registration fee or scholarships.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

State laws concerning the consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly enforced. Alcoholic beverages may not be carried in hallways or elevators. Be prepared to show valid proof of age. Outside beverages are not permitted in the hotel.

CHECK-OUT TIME

Check-out from the Hyatt Regency is required by 11 a.m. on the day of your departure. If you need extra time, make your own arrangements with the hotel front desk.

CELL PHONES

Keep cell phones silent and refrain from using them during educational programs, meetings and meals unless accessing social media sites for DU purposes.

JEREMY GOSCH, IOWA '97

SLOAN-KETTERING AWARD OF MERIT IN BUSINESS



Brother Jeremy Gosch is Chairman of the Board and CEO of Hy-Vee, Inc., one of the largest privately-owned companies in the U.S., with 70,000 employees across retail, healthcare, supply chain and technology.

Jeremy joined Hy-Vee as a part-time clerk when as a student at the University of Iowa and has remained with the company for more than 30 years, managing stores, overseeing retail regions and leading company-wide operations for the \$14 billion retailer. In 2022, Jeremy was named CEO and vice chairman, becoming only the fifth CEO in Hy-Vee history. In 2024, he was appointed chairman and CEO.

Under his leadership, Hy-Vee has been nationally recognized as one of the Most Trustworthy Companies in America by Newsweek, as well as one of the top grocery stores in the nation by USA TODAY. Individually, Jeremy has been named one of the Most Influential People in Retail Health by Drug Store News, and in 2024, was named Retail Leader of the Year by the Iowa Grocery Industry Association. Jeremy serves as an executive committee director for FMI – The Food Industry Association, on the Retail Industry Leaders Association board of directors, the Iowa Business Council, and the Greater Des Moines Partnership's Executive Committee and Board of Directors.

SCOTT HUDSON, IOWA STATE '84

SLOAN-KETTERING AWARD OF MERIT IN BUSINESS



Brother Scott Hudson is President and Chief Executive Officer of Gallagher Bassett, which is the global claims and risk management business of Gallagher, the world's third largest insurance broker.

Born and raised in Mason City, Iowa, Scott attended Iowa State University and built friendships and connections that have remained meaningful throughout his life and career. After moving to Chicago in 1984, Scott built a 25-year career in management consulting, beginning at Arthur Andersen and later joining McKinsey & Company. In 1998, he co-founded Bridge Strategy Group with seven colleagues, advising insurance industry clients on strategy, operations and organizational performance.

In 2010, he joined Gallagher—then one of his clients—to lead Gallagher Bassett. Under Scott's leadership, Gallagher Bassett has grown from approximately \$450 million in annual revenue in 2010 to more than \$1.6 billion today, with more than 12,000 employees globally.

Scott lives in downtown Chicago with his partner, Laura Litterer. Outside of work, they enjoy spending time with Scott's three adult sons, their growing families, and Laura's two adult daughters. They also enjoy staying active, exploring Chicago, and traveling the world.

DR. IAN PARNEY, MCGILL '90

LINUS PAULING AWARD OF MERIT IN SCIENCE



Dr. Parney is a neurosurgeon and cancer researcher at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota where he is Professor and Vice-Chair (Academic Affairs) in the Department of Neurological Surgery. Born and raised in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, Dr. Parney has an undergraduate degree from McGill University in Montreal; his MD and PhD from the University of Alberta; as well as sub-specialty training in neurosurgical oncology from the University of California, San Francisco.

Dr. Parney was recruited by Mayo in 2008 where he has a large clinical practice focused on brain tumor patients and has performed more than 4,000 brain tumor procedures, making him one of the most experienced brain tumor surgeons in the U.S. He is the author of more than 200 peer-reviewed publications and more than 20 book chapters. He has helped lead the Glioblastoma Therapeutics Network for the past five years, established an enfolded PhD program within the Mayo Clinic Neurosurgery Residency, is the founding Program Director for the Mayo Clinic Neurosurgical Oncology Fellowship, and has served on the Mayo Clinic Alix School of Medicine Admissions Committee for the past decade. Dr. Parney also holds multiple national leadership positions within neurosurgery and neuro-oncology. He lives in Rochester, Minnesota with his wife Dr. Elizabeth Yan, a Mayo Clinic radiation oncologist. They have two adult sons.

Dr. Parney will receive his Award of Merit during the Recognition Luncheon on Saturday. He will also host a breakout session Saturday morning.

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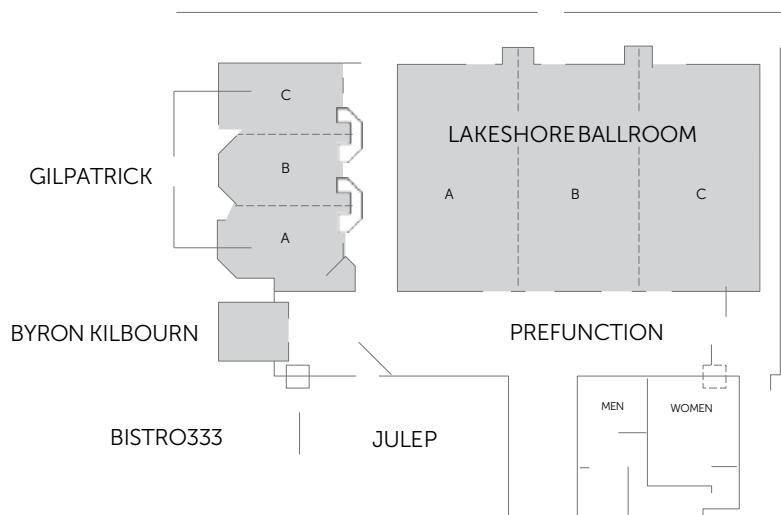
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Hotel Map

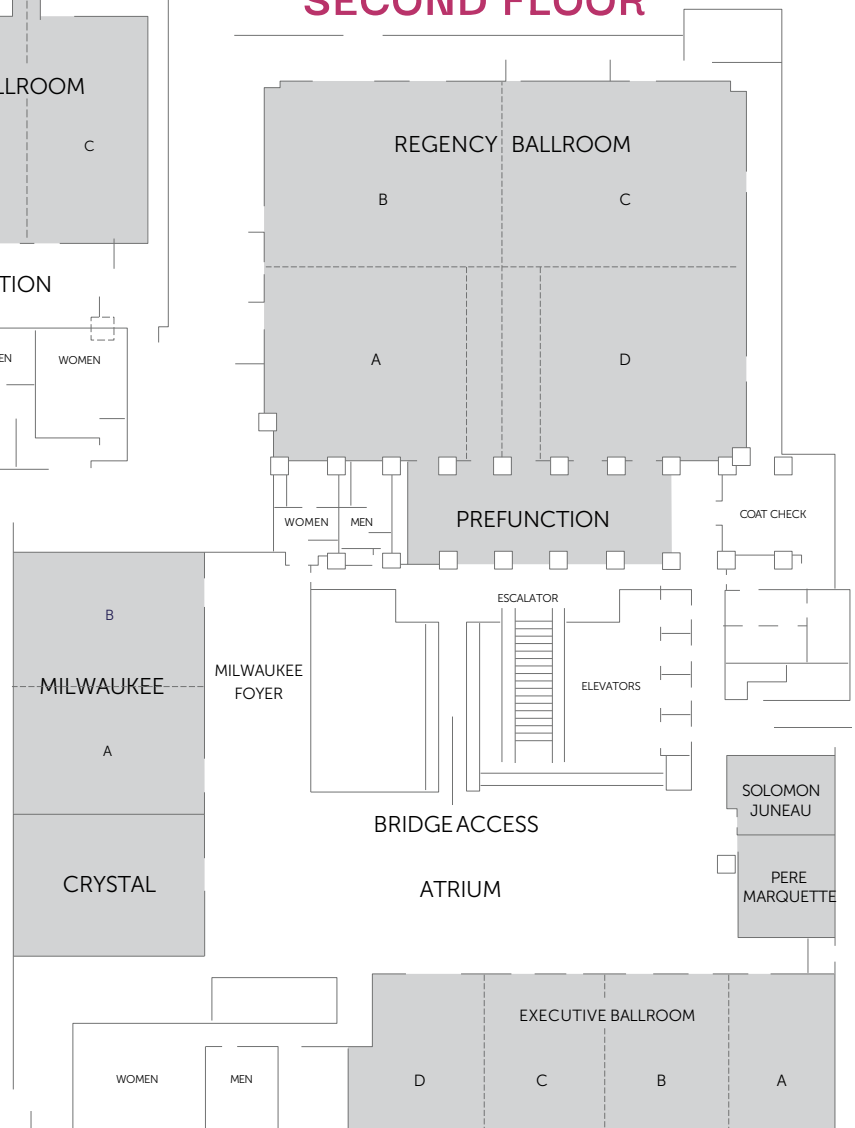
