

Beginning Knitting February 3 at 2:00pm


At this session you will learn basic knitting techniques. No need to bring anything, yard and needles will be provided. Registration required and seats are limited.

A wealth of resources in the Indiana Room can help you get started with your family tree research. We offer free in-house access to database giants like Ancestry.com, Newspapers.com, and special expanded access to FamilySearch.org. If your family happens to be from Anderson or Madison County, we also have a wide variety of records and historical resources that can help.

In addition to great resources, we have three certified librarians whose specialty is genealogy research and local history. They are happy to show you our resources and assist with your research. If you need more in-depth assistance, you can even make an appointment with our new "Book-A-Genealogist" service. If you are just starting out or you have been working for years and are stuck, you can make a 30-or 60-minute appointment with a librarian. Just give us a call or visit our website to schedule an appointment.

The Indiana Room isn't solely for family history research. We also specialize in Anderson and Madison County history. We have local newspapers from as early as 1853, city directories from 1876, high school yearbooks from 1897 and much, much, more!
