7 The Commission on Education has been very active on its email listserv and has utilized this format to
8 discuss possible live CME topics, abstracts received from prospective speakers, and other issues
9 relevant to the Commission such as educational content for our member magazine. Later in the year a
10 conference call will be planned to discuss member education needs for 2019. The Commission has
11 several new members who have actively participated in discussions.

13 The Commission is excited to bring a two-day Essential Evidence program to this year's Annual
14 Convention at The Alexander in Indianapolis. Other state chapters have experienced great success
15 with this format, taught by nationally-recognized faculty, and we hope that Indiana members also find
16 value in the program. We will review evaluations and carefully consider whether to offer this program
17 again in the future, possibly when we return to French Lick next year.

19 The Virtual KSA Study Group that we offered in October 2017 was another collaboration with the Ohio
20 chapter, as well as several other states. Each state, including Indiana, had about ten members register
21 for this online study group. As the Virtual KSA was well reviewed as it has been in the past, we have
22 been able to partner with the Ohio chapter again this year, for a relatively low cost, to offer another
23 Virtual KSA in October 2018 as a member benefit. Pricing will be the same as for in-person KSA Study
24 Groups. The topic will be Coronary Artery Disease.

26 This year we continued the tradition of combining a morning KSA Study Group and an afternoon of
27 free CME with our annual legislative reception, all of which were held on February 21, 2018 at the
28 Westin in downtown Indianapolis. The KSA and CME were attended by approximately 60 IAFP
29 members and included a legislative update with discussion of important talking points to use at the
30 reception. All aspects of the day were very well reviewed by attendees, with notes that several of the
31 speakers should be asked to return in the future.

33 The Commission also planned the 2018 IAFP Annual Convention's CME program. We reviewed
34 evaluations and comments from the 2017 Annual Convention, which were generally positive. We
35 reviewed CME Needs Assessments from members and developed ideas for multiple topics and
36 speakers based on member suggestions.

38 The Commission has begun to plan a two-day CME meeting in December 2018. This is an attempt to
39 provide live CME credit for members who do not have enough credits to satisfy their AAFP CME
40 requirements before the end of the year. A wide variety of hot topic CME will be offered and we hope
41 to attract members from surrounding states as well as Indiana. The meeting will be held at the Medical
42 Academic Center in Carmel, located inside the Indiana Spine Group building. This is a very popular
43 venue for our members.

45 As always, the Commission bases its decisions on IAFP member's CME Needs Assessments and
46 member comments from previous CME events. Our goal is to meet our members' educational needs in
47 as efficient a manner as possible.
