
Info about the book:

The developing brains of our children need to "feel" safe. Children who carry chronic behavioral challenges are often met with reactive and punitive practices that can potentially reactivate the developing stress response systems. This book addresses the need for coregulatory and relational touch point practices, shifting student-focused behavior management protocols to adult regulated brain and body states which are brain aligned, preventive, and relational discipline protocols. This new lens for discipline benefits all students by reaching for sustainable behavioral changes through brain state awareness rather than compliance and obedience.

REMINDER: TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS MUST MATCH DAILY ACCOMMODATIONS


Please make certain that any accommodations selected for state assessment in a student's IEP are also used by/available to the student on a daily basis to increase the student's access to and progress in the general curriculum.

Text-to-Speech for state testing without use on a daily basis seems to be the area of greatest discrepancy. Specifically, students should be using Text-to-Speech on a routine basis to accessing instructional materials classroom tests, etc. as well as on state assessments. If the student does not have access to and use of Text-to-Speech for routine purposes, then Text-to-Speech should NOT be selected for state assessment in the IEP.

SECONDARY TEACHERS: PSAT AND SAT ACCOMMODATIONS NEED APPROVAL FROM COLLEGE BOARD

Accommodations must be approved by the College Board's <u>Services for Students with</u> <u>Disabilities</u> for students taking the SAT (as well as other College Board tests including, but not limited to, the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, SAT Subject Tests, and AP Exams). **Scores will be canceled if accommodations are used without College Board approval.**

It can take up to 7 weeks (or longer in some situations) for accommodations to be approved, so please complete this process during the student's freshman year. At the student's freshman ACR or before, have the parent sign the consent form below. This consent form only needs to be signed once in a student's career and will cover any/all College Board exams taken by the student. Then, fill out the College Board Accommodation form below and provide it your school's test coordinator (usually guidance counselor) with a copy of the student's most recent IEP. If any accommodations are noted as requiring documentation, provide a copy of the student's most recent psychoeducational evaluation. For some students such as those who are D/HH or B/LV, medical records may also be required.
