



Franklin College will host the final lecture of its 2017-18 Convocation Lecture Series, while also recognizing Black History Month. The lecture, titled "Fighting for Justice in a Moment of Chaos," will be presented by Marc Lamont Hill, Ph.D., at 7 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 22 in the Branigin Room located in the Napolitan Student Center.

Hill, the Distinguished Professor of African American Studies at Morehouse College, also is the current host of "BET News" and "VH1 Live" as well as a political contributor for CNN. EBONY magazine has named him one of America's most influential black leaders. Trained as an anthropologist of education, his research focuses on the intersection between culture, politics and education. Join us as Hill discusses how diverse communities can organize, resist and reimagine their current social, economic and political landscapes.
