Academic Probation Level 1 (AP L1):

- 12 required weekly study hours
- 8 required weekly hours at Library Study Tables
- Must attend weekly Sunday and Monday library hours
- 3 required weekly tutor hours (at Library Study Tables or with tutor / professor)
- Bi-weekly academic check-in meeting with Academic Committee
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)
- Attend Tutoring Session at the Holman Success Center (located in Halle Library)

Academic Probation Level 2 (AP L2):

- 14 required weekly study hours
- 10 required weekly hours at Library Study Tables
- Must attend weekly Sunday and Monday library hours
- 5 required weekly tutor hours (at Library Study Tables or with tutor / professor)
- Weekly academic check-in meeting with Academic Committee
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)
- Required weekly attendance sheet (may not have any unexcused absences)
- Attend Tutoring Session at the Holman Success Center (located in Halle Library)

Academic Probation Level 3 (AP L3):

- 16 required weekly study hours
- 12 required weekly hours at Library Study Tables
- Must attend weekly Sunday and Monday Library hours
- 8 required weekly tutor hours (at Library Study Tables or with tutor / professor)

- Weekly academic check-in meeting with Academic Committee
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)
- 2 consecutive semesters on AP L3 status will result in member being brought up to the chapter for suspension
- 3 consecutive semesters on AP L3 status will result in member being brought up to the chapter for expulsion
- Required weekly attendance sheet (may not have any unexcused absences)
- Attend Tutoring Session at the Holman Success Center (located in Halle Library)

Good Standing Level 1 (GS L1):

- 8 required weekly study hours
- 4 required weekly hours at Library Study Tables
- Must attend weekly Sunday and Monday library hours
- Monthly academic check-in meeting with Academic Committee
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)

Good Standing Level 2 (GS L2):

- 8 required weekly study hours
- 2 required weekly hours at Library Study Tables
- Monthly academic check-in meeting with Academic Committee
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)

Good Standing Level 3 (GS L3):

- 8 required weekly study hours
- Monthly grade reports (due by the 15th of every month)
- Academic check-in meetings with Academic Committee as requested (based on monthly grade reports)

New Members:

- First semester freshman will be given a status of GS L2 once they are affiliated with the fraternity.
- New members with an established GPA with the University are given a status in line with their previous semesters' GPA and current cumulative GPA once they are affiliated with the fraternity.
- Grade reports are required to be submitted by first the New Member education meeting (at which point Academic Committee will assess individual situations and adjust academic plans accordingly)

Other notes:

- Brothers must have a standing of GS L1 or higher in order to hold a position on the Administrative Board.
 - Exceptions
 - Can be obtained by brothers on AP L1 status.
 - Appeals for exception will be made to the Academic Committee.
 - If granted, the Academic Committee shall create a custom academic plan for the brother to ensure their academic success for their term.
 - Appeals must be made within one week of being appointed to an Administrative Board position, or within one week of receiving a semester grade report that would see that brother move from GS L1 to AP L1.
- Brothers must have a standing of GS L2 or higher in order to hold a position on the Executive Board.
 - Exceptions

- Can be obtained by brothers who are in GS L1 status, but very close to GS L2 status (i.e. if an addition of 0.1 to either or both Semester GPA and / or Cumulative GPA would put them in GS L2 status).
 - Appeals for exception will be made to the Academic Committee.
 - If granted, the brother will be allowed to hold an Executive Board position, but will otherwise remain on the GS L1 academic plan.
 - Appeals must be made within one week of being elected to an Executive Board position, or within one week of receiving a semester grade report that would see that brother move from GS L2 to GS L1.
- Recognizing that every student learns differently and might need an alternate road to academic success, any brother may propose an alternative academic plan to the Academic Committee. Plans will be considered on an individual basis and adjusted as necessary.
- Extenuating circumstances may result in actions not listed here. For example, extremely poor academic performance might result in the brother being brought to the chapter for suspension or expulsion, regardless of the plan for their academic standing.
- Academic Committee may adjust an individual's plan (regardless of academic standing) based on grade reports or academic check-in meeting. It will be the responsibility of the Academic Committee to track every member's plan and whether or not they are meeting the criteria.
- Brothers who are suspended due to academics will be brought up for a conditional suspension, where they will have to complete the requirements of a brother in AP L3 standing.
- The Academic Committee, with the help of alumni and various chapter members, will prepare various academic programs to present to the Chapter and New Member class. Subjects might include, but are not limited to; Identifying learning disabilities, good study habits, how to succeed in college academically, the role of the University's Ombudsman, etc.
- The Academic Committee, headed by the Director of Academic Affairs, will be responsible for tracking every brother's adherence to their academic plan.
 - A shared Google Doc spreadsheet will be created every semester, with a separate tab for every brother to detail their individual academic plan.
 - The spreadsheet will be updated for every brother weekly during the Academic Committee meeting.
- Failure to adhere to any part of an individual academic plan will result in a write-up to Honor Board. If, during the course of one semester, a write-up to Honor Board has already been made, and a brother further fails to adhere to any part of their academic plan, that brother will be brought up to the chapter for academic suspension.

Tiered Accountability

1st Semester Below GPA Good Standing: Academic Probation

- Probation Levels are explained above. Failure to comply with Academic Probation will be brought up to Honor Board.

2nd Semester Below GPA Good Standing: Academic Suspension

- During this suspension period members would meet with the Director of Academic Affairs more frequently determined based on last semesters GPA.
- Members are also not able to attend Social events held by the chapter during the semester they were on suspension.

3rd Semester Below GPA Good Standing: Brought up for Expulsion

- School is the number 1 priority for Theta Xi chapter at Eastern Michigan. If a member is unable to meet this priority while receiving help they need to find a new plan for success.
- Members are still able to assist the previous brother with school when they need it but they will no longer be allowed on chapter premises after expulsion or any chapter events/socials.

Personalized Academic Success Plans

Holman Success Center

Members on Academic Probation/Suspension level 3 are required to meet up at least once for 1 on 1 help from the Holman Success Center as well as the Director of Academic Affairs. While the others are required to meet up during Sunday/Monday study hours with the Director of Academic Affairs but are still encouraged to get help from the Holman Success Center. This provides our members with help in writing, reading and studying for exams. As well as helping out with Academic support for dealing with stress and anxiety. They also are able provide this help for drop in tutoring when need be. All members in chapter are told about the Holman Success Center and we give the information when the individual members need it.
