1 **RESOLUTION #17-04** 2 **ENTITLED:** Health Plan Medical Director Accountability 3 **SUBMITTED BY:** Bernard Emkes, MD 4 5 WHEREAS, the approval and especially the denial of requested medical or therapeutic services has 6 significant impact on patients and the care they receive, and 7 WHEREAS, health plan medical directors often hide behind "We do not make medical decisions – we 8 9 only decide what services get covered and paid", and 10 11 WHEREAS, a denial of SNF by a major health plan because "We think the patient should be in Hospice" is in fact making a medical judgement decision, and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, coverage and payment decisions do impact and affect the care and services provided to a 15 health plan's members, and 16 17 WHEREAS, these decisions are often made by physicians who have little or no knowledge about the 18 care they are reviewing but rather are following some written guideline that in some cases should not 19 even apply to a given case, and 20 21 WHEREAS, especially FP and IM physicians have a broad based knowledge of care and care 22 patterns, unlike other physicians who often have a very narrow focus of specialization, and 23 24 WHEREAS, physicians and patients should expect reliable and competent decision-making at health 25 plans; therefore be it 26 27 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) support the concept of medical 28 competency at health plan medical director levels by defining and creating policy that coverage 29 decisions are indeed the practice of medicine and therefore subject to all laws and regulations 30 attached to that designation, and be it further 31 32 RESOLVED, that only physicians with a broad knowledge of medical services, or a physician of the 33 same specialty of the requesting physician (when feasible), make care determinations impacting both patients and practicing physicians. 34
