NHJ Schools offer breakfast every morning to all students...

Research has shown that starting the day with a nutritious breakfast helps students stay alert and perform better in school. Breakfast is offered each morning to all students at all schools the beginning of the school day. Students may get a breakfast as soon as they arrive at school.

The price for breakfast is \$1.40 at the elementary and intermediate schools and is \$1.45 at the middle and high schools. The reduced breakfast price is \$.30. Breakfast includes milk, a fruit or vegetable or juice, a grain and/or a protein.

If your child is eligible for free or reduced priced lunch, he/she is eligible for free or reduced priced breakfast as well.



Several area churches and businesses contact our schools each year to obtain names of families who would like assistance during the holidays. If you are in need of assistance, please contact the school nurse. All requests are kept confidential.
