2. Gale Courses offer a wide range of highly interactive courses led by expert instructors that run for six weeks at no cost. web design and programming, that you can take from your office, home or corner coffee shop...on your schedule. Check out Gale's small business resource center - Gale Business Entrepreneurship – that includes sample business plans and how-to guides on starting, financing or managing your small business.

> 3. Indiana Legal Forms includes searchable and printable forms for bankruptcy, divorce, name change, power of attorney, real estate, wills and more. This resource doesn't replace a licensed attorney, but it can get your started on what

you need to fill in and file before you invest in professional services.

- 4. Lynda.com is another online learning option that provides access to over 130,000 professionally produced video tutorials in Microsoft Office, Photoshop, web design, business, marketing and much more.
- **5. Hoopla** offers so much more than entertainment. Hoopla features thousands of business and economic eBooks and e-audioBooks both online and in the hoopla app. Read up on the hottest trends and learn from the experts wherever, whenever.

I have been privileged to visit many of our manufacturing facilities during my first year as Chamber director.

It is amazing to learn about the types of manufacturers we have right in our own backyard. From medical devices with parts so small they can barely be seen to large automotive parts to 3D printing that rivals the most intricate and beautiful works of art. We are so fortunate to have these facilities in Johnson County. Their contribution to the local economy is tremendous.

As I met with these businesses, it became clear that there are more open

positions than there are qualified applicants. With that reality, the Chamber partnered with Franklin Community High School (FCHS) to host a manufacturing career fair to coincide with National Manufacturing Day, held on the first Friday in October. It was a wonderful way to showcase careers in manufacturing, engineering and logistics to area students.

It was also an eye-opening experience to many who are not familiar with manufacturing in our community.

Manufacturing employs many of our residents and is vital to the health of our community. Yet as a career field, it is often overlooked by students (and their parents.) The perception that a manufacturing facility is dirty, dark and dank could not be further from the reality of modern manufacturing. The 800+ students who attended

the manufacturing career fair came away with a greater understanding of in-demand, high paying careers and what it takes to work in the industry.
