Using the resources families and individuals already have available



Accessing additional resources



Budgeting assistance



Returning to the workforce

Financial assistance to individuals and families to keep individuals in current housing situation or improve the housing situation of those who are homeless and to keep individuals employed and provide employment essentials.

## Who is eligible for assistance?

Johnson County residents who have lost their jobs or 50 percent of their household income due to COVID-19 after March 1, 2020 and who meet eligibility requirements.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Current resident of Johnson County.
- Resident of Johnson County at time of job/income loss.
- Job/income loss occurring after March 1, 2020. Loss of job must be due to employer closing or furloughing workers due to COVID-19.
- Income loss because a household wage earner died due to COVID-19.
- Job loss due to childcare issues due to COVID-19.
- Job loss due to illness of the individual or household member with COVID-19.
- Must agree to be in case management and be a part of their recovery process.
