



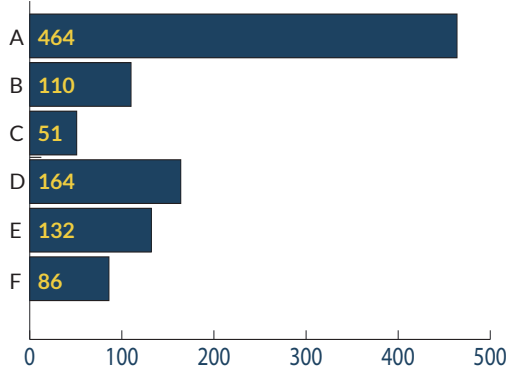

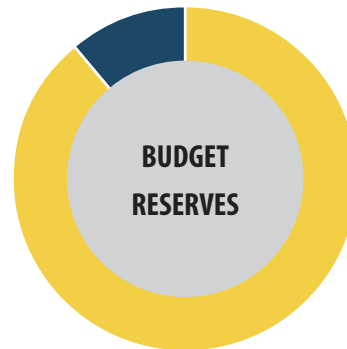

 F) Other



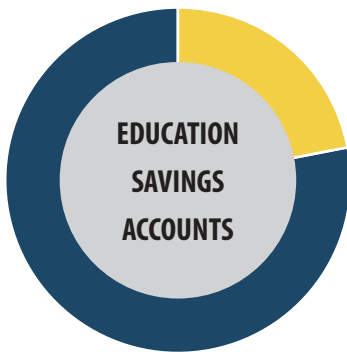

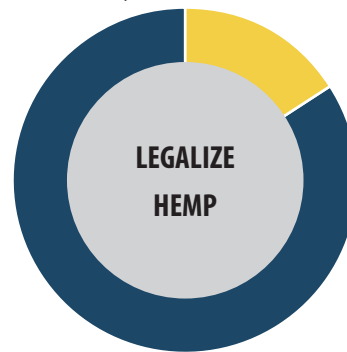
- 3.** Do you support or oppose giving parents of special-needs children the option to use state educational funding for services such as private-school tuition and developmental therapy?
