



The Faculty Fellows program supports professional development by bringing together representatives from ICC partner campuses for social and intellectual collaboration, and providing grants to help support high-impact teaching and engagement practices. Each Fellow's employer also must provide some funding in support of the work.

Crisafulli was selected for the Faculty Fellows program and a \$3,800 grant based on her proposal, "Communications Consulting Project: A Partnership between Poverty-Focused Nonprofits and Franklin College."
