


















12. Thinking about schools and what is being taught in the classroom, which of the following statements comes closer to your own opinion?


CURRICULUM OPINION

B) I feel schools are forcing a political agenda that doesn't belong in the classroom.




Do you feel more confident that your vote will be counted if you A) vote in person or B) vote by mail?




11. Which one of the following do you feel would do most to improve K-12 education in Indiana?

IMPROVE K-12 EDUCATION



Would you support or oppose requiring schools to be closed on Election Day in order to make it easier for school buildings to be used as polling places?







16. Indiana law currently allows counties to opt in to post-election audits that check the accuracy of voting results. Should Indiana *require* counties to participate in these post-election audits?




18. Which is more important to you? A) Election security B) Ease of voting




How satisfied are you with your access to reliable broadband internet?

BROADBAND ACCESS SATISFACTION




19. Do you support or oppose allowing the Attorney General to prosecute crimes if a local prosecutor refuses to do so?
