

From Tanks to Toys

e has held many impressive positions of leadership and had larger than life experiences that few of us can even imagine. He has had power, important titles and many significant responsibilities in his life. And now...he's into toys.

It's not that he collects antiques from his childhood or builds model trains. It's not that he buys the electronic gadgets, the fishing boats or even the small private aircraft that are the downfall of so many guys. No, Brother Pete Osman is into toys in a much, much bigger way.

After 37 years in the United States Marine Corps, Lieutenant General H.P. (Pete) Osman (Zeta Pi/ODU '69) is now the Executive Vice President, and in training to become the President and CEO, of the Marine Corps Reserve Toys For Tots Program.

Brother Pete Osman's career in the Marines began while he was enrolled at Old Dominion University. At that same time, he was a moving force in changing Old Dominion Colony into Zeta Pi Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity. He became the chapter president in 1968. Upon graduation in 1969, he was officially commissioned into the Marine Corps.

Following The Basic School, Brother Osman served in several infantry platoon commander billets, including duty as a file platoon commander with 2d Battalion, 1st Marines in the Republic of

Vietnam. In July 1971, he was assigned to Marine Corps Base in Quantico, Virginia where he stayed as company commander, aide to the base commander and on the staff at The Basic School until 1976 when he himself returned to school.

After attending the Amphibious Warfare School in 1979, Brother Osman assumed command of the Marine Detachment aboard the aircraft carrier, USS EISENHOWER.

In 1989 his career took him to the NATO Defense College in Rome, Italy. Upon graduation, he was assigned to the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe where he served as Chief of Strategy.

His promotion to Brigadier General came in 1995 and he was assigned as the Director, Personnel Management Division, Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps. In April 2000, he was assigned as Director, Operational Plans and Joint Force Development (J-7), Joint Staff, Washington D.C.

Brother Osman's career continued as the Commanding General, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, NC from August 2002 to July 2004. During this assignment, General Osman lead a small Joint Task Force into Northern Iraq to coordinate political and military activities in that region during the Iraq war.

In 2004, he became the Deputy Commandant for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Headquarters Marine Corps, Washington, D.C. and continued there until his "retirement" this past year.

As he looked to move forward in his life, General Osman states that he knew he wanted to "serve in a different light." Rather than focus on obtaining a post retirement job in the Defense industry, a natural place for former military officers, he decided to search in the non-profit sector. Throughout his career in the Marines, he had participated in outreach programs at orphanages and with social agencies helping children who needed father figures. He knew he was interested in supporting local communities. What better place could he look than a Marine based non-profit focused on needy children!

There are approximately 1,500,000 non-profit organizations in the United States. In 2005, the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program was ranked #66 among the Philanthropy 400. That is really big business! And, learning that business is what consumes Brother Osman's time at this point.

In an interview for this article, Brother Osman openly admitted that nothing about his degree in chemistry or even his experiences as an infantry officer prepared him for this new venture. But some-





thing in his past did help, and that "something" was his experience in Theta Chi Fraternity. During the interview for this article, General Osman repeated something he indicated that he has said many times. If any experiences in his four years of college helped prepare him for his future in the Marines, and now with such a large philanthropy, it was the leadership opportunities he had in Theta Chi. There is no question in his mind that the challenges he faced as chapter secretary and president helped him the most in learning to deal with and lead people.

His primary suggestion for all the readers of this magazine—take advantage of those opportunities regardless of your primary field of interest.

To conclude in his own words:

It was a pleasure to spend a few minutes with you yesterday afternoon. I am truly honored to have my story serve as an article for *The Rattle...*You offered me the opportunity to add any other thoughts to the discussion we had. There are two things that I would like to add.

First, I have tremendous confidence in today's youth. Our society often sends mixed signals with drugs, violence, morality and integrity issues, greed, etc. Yet, in spite of the poor examples they so often witness, today's youth seem to be rising above it. I have certainly seen it in the quality of the young men and women we have entering our Marine Corps. I am convinced in my 39 years as a Marine these are the best young folks I've seen. In short, I am big on today's youth!

Second, I'd like to ensure the readers appreciate the impact that Toys for Tots is having. A couple of numbers really help tell the story. Last year Toys for Tots distributed over 19.2 million toys to over 7.6 million needy children. This was achieved through the efforts of the 557 local Toys for Tots campaigns. With revenue and expenses that exceed \$230,000,000, this was a huge effort, but there is still much to be done when one considers that there are over 13 million children in our country living in poverty. If any of our Theta Chi Chapters wish to become involved in their local Toys for Tots campaigns, I can assure you their efforts would be welcomed and greatly appreciated.

Toys for Tots

The Toys for Tots Program was established 59 years ago with a goal to deliver, through a shiny, new toy at Christmas, a message of hope to needy youngsters. Hope that is intended to motivate them to grow into responsible, productive, patriotic citizens and community leaders. The objectives of the program are to help needy children, to play an active role in the development of one of our nation's most valuable natural resources, our children; to unite all members of local communities in a common cause for three months each year during the annual toy collection and distribution campaign; and to contribute to better communities in the future. The program has touched the hearts of thousands of individuals.

The Program has also captured the imagination of major corporations around the nation. National corporations support Toys for Tots by establishing affiliations with the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation. Support comes in the form of funding as corporations make donations to the Foundation or advertising as they conduct marketing initiatives that add visibility campaigns at national and local levels. The well recognized Toys for Tots logo was created for the Program by Disney Corporation, a company that generously donated \$1,000,000 last year.

In 1991, as the Program's growth exceeded the Marine Corps Reserve's capacity to administer it, the Secretary of Defense approved the creation of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation. Administration, fundraising and financial support for the Program was transferred to the Foundation, whose new headquarters is currently under construction in Quantico, Virginia.

The Unknown Hero from the Class of '56

orn at Norwich, Vermont over 150 years ago, Edward Bancroft Williston still receives accolades as one of Theta Chi's most renown recruits. However, his name wasn't exactly common knowledge among other circles until a group of Norwich alumni, who also came of age during a

knowledge among other circles until a group of Norwich alumni, who also came of age during a time of war, joined together in an effort to educate and inspire. The Class of 1970 Reunion Committee wanted to leave their mark at their alma mater.

Their plan was to commission a painting of a fellow alumnus whose conduct represented the values of their institution—a gift to inspire further generations of students. They wanted their gift to embody the Norwich motto, "I Will Try."

The person whom they chose for the honor was, however, not from their class. He was E.B. Williston, from the class of '56...1856, that is.

As a recipient of the Medal of Honor, the nations' highest military honor, Brother Williston's name was suggested, but little was known about him. So an effort was launched to learn more about the man.

What they found was the little known story of a hero.

The Reunion Committee commissioned well-known Civil War artist, Dale Gallon, to make their vision a reality. Gallon's paintings, praised as history lessons on canvas, are displayed at the Pentagon, the U.S. Army War College and the Minnesota State Capitol. Known for his attention to detail and historical accuracy, Dale Gallon was assisted by staff historian, Bob Poirier, and a team of researchers in uncovering telling details of Brother Williston's bravery under fire.

"The subject matter became more real when we tried to ascertain what Williston did to earn his Medal of Honor," said Giff Slater, Reunion Gifts Officer with the Institutional Advancement Office at Norwich University, who helped coordinate the project. "As we tried to understand more about him, we found out some things that the Norwich community didn't know before," he said.

Edward B. Williston, Commander, Battery D, 2nd U.S. Artillery, received the Medal of Honor for "distinguished gallantry in action" while engaging the 4th, 5th and 6th South Carolina Cavalry of General M.C. Butler in a battle that took place on June 11–12, 1864. The action occurred during a two-day Civil War battle at Trevilian Station, Virginia, where an estimated 1,600 Confederate and Union Soldiers lost their lives.

Much of what is known of Brother Williston's actions during the battle comes from Brigadier General Wesley Merritt's official report of the incident. "Right gallantly did the battery come up in the midst of heavy musketry fire," Merritt wrote. "We being at that time so close to the enemy that their shells all flew far over us." The report goes on to state, "Planting three guns of the battery in this position, where it dealt the enemy heavy blows, Lieutenant Williston moved one of his brass 12-pounders onto the skirmish line. In fact, the line was moved to the front to allow him to get an eligible position, where he

remained with his gun, in the face of the strengthened enemy who advanced to its very muzzle dealing death and destruction in their ranks with double loads of canister."

Bob Poirier '66, a retired intelligence officer, Civil War expert and published author, led the research team that uncovered telling details of Williston's bravery under fire. "If you can picture the battle field, here is Williston moving a single gun forward—right up to, if not ahead of, the troops he is supporting," Poirier explains. "He's an American hero."

Brother Edward Bancroft Williston continued his service to his country progressing up the military ranks until he retired July 15, 1900.



He was advanced to the rank of Brigadier General while on the retired list by an Act of Congress on April 23, 1904. He made his retirement home in Portland, Oregon and passed away April 24, 1920. Williston is buried in Arlington National Cemetery, Virginia with his wife, Flora E. Chatfield Williston (September 26, 1861–December 24, 1944).

The print, For Distinguished Gallantry, depicts Williston directing the fire of his forward placed 12-pound Napoleon cannon. The original was unveiled at the Partridge Society and Class Reunion Luncheon September 16, 2006 at the Kreitzberg Arena of Norwich University and now hangs in Jackman Hall, the Medal of Honor Room.

Interested in owning a print?

Arrangements have been made for a Norwich limited-edition print to be produced from the original oil painting. This "Norwich only" edition print will be signed by the artist, certified and numbered. The Norwich regimental crest and a University Partridge logo with Centennial stairs will appear in the lower margin. The actual image of this print will measure approximately 16x22 inches. A printed brochure providing a full description of the battle scene and action of the main participants will accompany each print. No more than 304 of the prints will be prepared.

Proceeds derived from the sale of the print will be used to enhance the Norwich historical heritage by purchasing the Dale Gallon oil painting for the new Gordon Sullivan Museum and History Center.

Copies of the print, which will bear the distinctive Norwich cadet regimental crest, may be purchased from the Norwich Advancement Office for \$175 (unframed) with \$20 shipping. Framed editions may be purchased for \$350 plus \$55 shipping costs east of the Mississippi and \$85 west of the Mississippi.

Signed limited edition prints are also available without the Norwich cadet crest.

After 41 years, a Brother's love letters bring him home.

ost of us these days are familiar with the popular TV series, CSI. We watch and marvel at fictious crimes solved through scientific analysis of carpet fibers, bullet striations, and 3-D skeletal recreation.

This, however, is the true story of a brother in Theta Chi, Colonel Charles J. Scharf, (Gamma Theta/San Diego State '54) who was returned to his loved ones through the miraculous use of DNA.

On October 1, 1965, Captain Charles Scharf and his company of three F-4C Phantom II fighter planes were assigned to road reconnaissance. Their mission was to attack an enemy concentration and a major highway in North Vietnam. Hit by enemy fire on the third bombing run while leading two others in his flight, Brother Scharf's radio communication recorded his "Mayday" call and the return broadcast from a fellow pilot advising him to bail out due to fire in the rear of his aircraft. Scharf's plane began to disintegrate and a parachute was seen leaving the aircraft. The other two planes lost sight of his parachute, and, despite circling for ten

minutes where Scharf's aircraft crashed, no radio or visual contact was ever made again.

Captain Charles J. Scharf was officially listed missing in action.

In January 1990, the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (S.R.V.) provided information to the U.S. officials indicating two men were buried near their crash site, but that one had been washed away during flooding. Within a month, a joint U.S.-S.R.V. team, led by the Joint POW/ MIA Accounting Command, interviewed three witnesses to the crash and located scattered wreckage at the site. The 1992 excavation of that site yielded human remains, a dental prosthesis, and numerous personal effects, including the rank insignia of Scharf's fellow crewman. A second joint excavation in 1992 recovered additional artifacts, but no remains.

A third excavation in 2004 recovered additional evidence including pilot-related life support artifacts, a metal captain's insignia (Scharf's rank at the time) and a plastic denture tooth.

Along with dental records, other forensic tools and circumstantial evidence, scientists from JPAC and the Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory also attempted to use DNA from a known maternal relative to establish the identification. However, the tests were inconclusive.

Military scientists recently compared the bone recovered in a North Vietnamese jungle where the Air Force pilot's plane went down 40 years ago to saliva on letters he had sent his wife. It was a DNA match, they announced. At last, they said, the remains of Colonel Charles J. Scharf had been found.

The bone identified as Charles J. Scharf, the other items from the crash site, a uniform complete with badges and medals, as if he were wearing it, were buried at Arlington National Cemetery on November 30th, 2006.

Also placed in the coffin were the love letters that brought him home.



Theta Chi Hands Extend to the World

Sacrifice for a Greater Cause

Editor's Note: The following email is being published with the consent of the author, Rob Lytle (Zeta Lambda/Westminster '97). Just as our cover story demonstrates a real life application of Theta Chi's "helping hand" philosophy, so, the uplifting message in this email demonstrates how a soldier was able to incorporate that same philosophy into a generally dismal real life situation to enrich both his own life and the lives of those around him.

20 October 2006

Brothers.

I'm just writing to touch base and wish you well. I returned from my deployment a couple of months ago and have been playing catch up with my life, my wife, my daughter and the fraternity.

I want to share a little with you about this deployment.

I came off my orders after demobilizing in the middle of June. This tour has truly been both a character building and a trying experience. I had just turned 31 and, for the first time in my life, I felt weathered and old. I guess that's because I was exhausted. I was the main Point of Contact responsible for coordinating the movement and helping prepare and move troops in and out of the Area of Responsibility/Afghani Theatre.

I can't disclose numbers over e-mail, but our rotation moved more than double in our first month what our predecessors did in their monthly average. In one particular week, we moved more troops than the prior group had moved in two months.



I had my first full day off after being there 31 days, and, believe me, working a month straight in sub-zero weather wears you out. Until our replacements arrived, we averaged about four days a month off. My typical day began at 4:30 a.m. and went until 8:00 p.m. After that I tried to go to the gym, eat dinner, and then go to bed. We averaged 12–15 hour days every day, but I did about a week straight of 20-hour shifts (4a.m. to midnight) when it was about 20 below zero and snowing. Not only the hours, but the cold, too, really takes a toll on your system. Luckily, the weather broke in mid-March, all of the snow melted, spring came and went, and the temps were in the 80s. It snowed on Palm Sunday and was 100 degrees on Easter. When I got there, it was 20 below with a foot of snow on the ground. I guess that I had become acclimated to the weather after a few weeks when I thought 30–40 degrees was warm.

The place I was stationed was definitely different, and for the first time I think that I've really understood sacrifice for a greater cause. I had missed more than half of my daughter's life, as well as many of her firsts—rolling over, crawling, sitting up by herself, standing up while holding on to something, and her first word. My wife had been working with her and she's also started to use sign language. But that small sacrifice I made, and that several more like me are still making, is so she and my wife can be safe. So my family, my friends, my brothers, like you, can be safe.

With all of the troops coming through there, one of the most rewarding things was when we were able to send them back home to the States or to Europe. With every one we put on that aircraft home, I felt a great sense of joy and accomplishment. But, unfortunately, most positives have a negative. For all of the troops that we were sending home, we were sending at least one replacement troop down range, and, unfortunately, statistics and the media show that there are casualties and injuries from war. I bear a sense of responsibility for the soldiers, Marines, sailors and airmen that I sent into theatre and that

fall into that group. Even though I was just doing my job, I'm sure that I will feel guilty for some time, but it's a tough reality of war, one I have to face and one that I push back. It could have been worse, and I could have been closer to harm's way, but we were safer where I was stationed and I was thankful for that every day.

My family, friends, mentors, co-workers, brothers, fraternity, etc. are the reason I could not wait to be home, but all of you are the biggest reason that I wanted to be there, too. I was, and am, willing to do what it takes so all of you can be safe at home and so my daughter's/our children's generation doesn't have to be there in 18 to 20 years. If needed again, I will proudly serve.

Throughout the monotony of the groundhog days we lived there, we looked forward to a few general things: getting an e-mail from home and getting mail. We were, also, authorized two beers a night (more presently than the chapter!). For the first two months, I focused on studying and passing a test in my free time.

In addition to supporting Operation Enduring Freedom, I wanted to make a difference while deployed. Theta Chi's philosophy is to live by the "Helping Hand" and that is what I try to do. I joined an outreach society and we went out to the local community on our days off. I visited a children's cancer center and a children's heart ward. We got to play and interact with the kids. We played games, put together puzzles and just played. It was amazing how little they had. They're in the clinic for at least a year with their family.

After my first visit, I made the choice to do something. These kids needed toys, games, etc., as well as clothes and toiletries, so I contacted family members and my co-workers, and I had

over 25 boxes arrive there for the children. I also made an effort to see how I would do as a philanthropist and I raised enough money to sponsor heart surgeries for three children (two little girls, ages 5 and 6, and one child to be determined).

I am proud of what I accomplished over there as I have proven to myself that if I set my mind to something, I can accomplish it. The "Helping Hand" can take place at any time and any place. We need to strive to make a difference and extend the "Helping Hand" to all who seek it always, even in harder times. More importantly, enjoy life. Seeing young soldiers, men the same age or younger than myself, die so we can live free, puts things in perspective.

Since my return home, I have thoroughly enjoyed watching my daughter grow and watch-

ing her develop from a baby to a little girl. My wife and I have also started to expand my family with the addition of my son (due today, 2/27/07). I have been appointed to the title of Marketing Manager in my civilian job. After 12 years, the Air Force Reserves still remains a key part of my life, and I have been selected for the Deserving Airmen Commissioning Program. I am currently waiting for my date to attend Officer's Training School/bootcamp to earn my commission as a Second Lieutenant.

Although I decided to transfer my Alumni Corporation presidential duties to a new brother last fall, I was asked and happily accepted the role to remain on the board as a advisory member and mentor, as well as a Chapter Adviser

I have shared and encouraged my chapter brothers that we, as a brotherhood, can continue to make a difference in giving back to the chapter that has given to us. Our Board has taken a significant dent out of our mortgage, so if we work together as brothers, we can own our chapter house. Once it's paid off, we can start doing more chapter house improvements, have more/better alumni events, start a scholarship fund, and, most importantly, start a trust or other type of fund should something ever happen to the fraternity or chapter. With all of that said, I hope that we've made a difference with our fraternity and chapter over the last six years.

It has truly been a privilege and an honor working with all of you.

Hudgins is a First Lieutenant in the Marines and lives in Maryland. Upon his return, 1st Lt. Hudgins intends to submit photos of his time in the Middle East for publication in *The Rattle*. Brother Lamb Receives Bronze Star

More than 90,000 fans watched as Colonel Duane Lamb (Alpha Phi/University of Alabama '73), an Air War College instructor at Maxwell Air Force Base, was presented a

Bronze Star from his former commander in Iraq. Colonel Lamb served as the 732nd Expeditionary Mission Support Group commander at Balad Air Base.

Colonel Lamb commanded more than 1,400 Airmen—some of whom were performing missions not typically done by the Air Force. Most of the missions Colonel Lamb's Airmen performed for the Army and Marine Corps required work outside of a base that had been hit by more than 320 mortar and rocket attacks in six months. Colonel Lamb's Airmen helped train the Iraqi army, police and judicial representatives and provided civil engineer support in local communities.

"Our group played a key role in planting the seeds that will help grow a democracy in Iraq," he explained. "It was a very honorable mission, but it was also very dangerous for our Airmen." "It didn't matter if you worked in civil engineering or if you were a lawyer," Brother Lamb

cult thing for a leader in a combat zone is realizing that every decision you make could get someone killed. You must always weigh all the risks, make sure everyone is trained, and never cut corners because people can get seriously injured or killed in combat."

General Gorenc applauded Colonel Lamb's efforts to protect his troops while accomplishing such a challenging mission.

The Colonel plans to retire to Tuscaloosa, Alabama next year with his wife.





Tubbs Jones Introduces Campus Fire Safety Legislation



Washington, D.C.-January 23, 2007, Congresswoman Stephanie Tubbs Jones re-introduced three bipartisan pieces of legislation regarding Campus Fire Safety; the Campus Fire Safety Month Resolution, The College Fire and Prevention Act and the Collegiate Housing and Infrastructure Act. Rep. Ed Whitefield (R-KY) is the original co-sponsor for both the Campus Fire Safety Month Resolution and the College Fire and Prevention Act and Rep. Paul Ryan (R-WI) is the original co-sponsor of the Collegiate Housing and Infrastructure Act.

A Resolution Establishing Campus Fire Safety Month

This legislation would establish September as "Campus Fire Safety Month" and encourage administrators and municipalities across the country to provide educational programs to all students during September and throughout the school year on fire safety. Additionally, the resolution encourages administrators and municipalities across the country to evaluate the level of fire safety being pro-

vided in both on- and off-campus student housing and taking the necessary steps to ensure fire-safe living environments through fire safety education, installation of fire suppression and detection systems and the development and enforcement of applicable codes relating to fire safety. This legislation was adopted in the 109th Congress on September 27, 2006 by unanimous consent.

The College Fire and Infrastructure Act


The College Fire and Prevention Act would establish a demonstration incentive program within the Department of Education to promote installation of fire sprinkler systems, or other fire suppression or prevention technologies, in qualified student housing or dormitories, and for other purposes. The National Educational Association, The National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, National Fire Sprinkler Association and the National Fire Protection Association have endorsed this legislation. This bill has twenty original co-sponsors. This legislation was originally introduced in the 107th Congress, and re-introduced in the 108th and 109th Congresses.

The College Housing and Infrastructure Act

This legislation erases the disparity between gifts made to colleges and universities for infrastructure improvements and gifts made to fraternities and sororities for the benefit of similarly situated students. This allows tax deductible contributions to fraternity and sorority foundations to be used for the same purposes that a college of university could use such contributions (except for physical fitness equipment).

"Fire safety and prevention is an issue that needs to be addressed on College Campuses across the United States," said Rep. Tubbs Jones. "Over the past few years we have seen many tragedies involving fire at colleges, places of business, entertainment venues and places of residence. We must begin to put in place suppression measures against fires and increase support and resources for our fire fighters to ensure that no more lives are lost to fires that could have been prevented. These three pieces of legislation will help to put those measures in place and ultimately save lives."

Nationwide, 99 people have been killed in student housing since January 2000 and Ohio has had the most deaths of any state, as identified by the Center for Campus Fire Safety, a non-profit organization that compiles information on campus-related fires. Almost 80 percent of the fire fatalities have occurred in off-campus occupancies such as rented houses and apartments. Common factors in a number of these fires include: lack of automatic sprinklers, disabled smoke alarms, careless disposal of smoking materials, and alcohol consumption.
