Title: Brotherhood and Goal Sheets Presenter: Brother Nick Hennemann Date: 2/15/16 at 7 P.M. Brothers In Attendance: 27

Summary/Goals: The presentation was on what the meaning of brotherhood is for one another, this was worked out with structured discussion lead by the presenter. It segwayed into how to help one another achieve goals and how to both give and receive constructive criticisms with examples of both. It ended with a handout of goal sheets where it was encouraged to team up with brothers to help with keeping one another accountable. The sheet included planning for goals for the chapter, academic goals, personal goals, relationship goals, and brotherhood goals.

Summary/Goals: To prepare for the presentation Nate developed an extensive excel budget program which included income and expenditure breakdowns and visual aids within the program to display trends. This included the traditional Stein Song, sporting traditions, and many of the resources and regular events hosted for students by the University. The goal was to educate members on how to maximize their use of opportunities on campus and ensure that they have a productive and fun college experience.

Title: Robert's Rules of Order Presenter: Brother Levi Boudreau Date: 3/29/16 Brothers In Attendance: 25 New Members in Attendance: 1

Title: Being a Gentleman Presenter: Brother Levi Boudreau Date: 3/31/16 Brothers In Attendance: 27 New Members in Attendance:1 Summary/Goals: The idea behind this presentation was to tie in the expected code of conduct of a delt, both inside and out of the fraternity. It covered professional etiquette, our social media policy and its impact in the current and future work place, and expectations of what is considered acceptable and not acceptable behavior for a delt to display in public. The importance of this presentation is relevant to the general face of the fraternity and how our fraternity reflects itself in the community.

Title: Semester Goal Reflection Presenter: Brother Nick Hennemann Date: 5/7/16 4P.M. Brothers In Attendance: 22

Summary/Goals: With the end of the semester rolling around the road presentation was a reflection on the goals that were set early in the semester. The chapter discussed successes and shortcomings in their planning and execution of their goals.
