Pats fan enjoys Patricia article



Dear Brothers, Parents, and Friends,

Earlier this year, a student at Penn State University lost his life in a place where he was supposed to be safe. That young man was Timothy Piazza, who was pledging another fraternity. You may have seen or heard national media coverage about this horrific tragedy.

People who are not members of a fraternity or sorority often just see a jumble of Greek letters when one of our organizations makes the news. Even though Timothy was not pledging Theta Chi, his loss has been felt by all Greeks. In fact, when Timothy's death was first reported by the national media, your International President and Executive Director both received telephone calls from their mothers with the question, "that wasn't your fraternity, was it?"

The answer to this question is complex. Although Timothy was not a member of our Fraternity, his death still greatly impacts Theta Chi since we are part of a larger interfraternal community that shares many

common ideals, namely the health, safety, and well-being of its members.

The top priority of the Grand Chapter and International Headquarters staff is to promote the health and safety of our collegiate brothers and pledges by providing meaningful leadership and education opportunities. Here are just a few examples:

- **Sacred Purpose**—Established in 2013, the mission of Sacred Purpose is simple: to protect our brothers and the broader campus community by providing health and safety education. Topics of primary focus are: Hazing Prevention, Responsible Use of Alcohol, Drug Use/Abuse Prevention, Suicide Prevention/Intervention, Recognizing Depression and Getting Help, Sexual Assault Prevention, and Fire/Life Safety. This fall, every chapter participated in an educational session addressing these topics.
- **The Resolute Man**—In 2016, we officially introduced a framework to define desired outcomes of membership in Theta Chi. We want to build leaders, emphasize the importance of commitment to alma mater, promote social competence, and ensure that Theta Chi remains relevant and beneficial to its members regardless of their age or phase of life.
- **The Resolute Journey**—This fall, we unveiled a standardized pledge program that is designed to properly introduce our pledges to Theta Chi and to serve as a smooth segue into The Resolute Man framework. In January 2018, Chapter Marshals will travel to Indiana to be formally trained as the owners of these initiatives at the chapter level.

- **Increased interfraternal collaboration**—Two years ago, the North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) underwent a significant restructuring and has placed focus on building interfraternal trust, camaraderie, and mutual accountability. Theta Chi Fraternity played a leading role in this restructure. At the NIC Annual Meeting of Members held this past August, a number of resolutions were collectively adopted with the goal of promoting health and safety.
- **Support from International Headquarters staff**—Our International Headquarters is truly a chapter support center. We have more Field Staff members than ever before and a top priority of the International Headquarters staff is to help our chapters navigate the various situations that arise in today's collegiate environment.

These are but a few examples of the outreach that Theta Chi's leadership is providing to its collegiate members. Each of these initiatives is heavily rooted in our core ideals. You need not look further than the words of The Creed of Theta Chi Fraternity for proof of this. Theta Chi is born of sturdy manhood, nurtured by resolute men, and ennobled by high and sacred purpose.

Our goal is to provide our collegiate brothers with the most meaningful fraternal experience possible. We need your support and awareness to help make sure that we remain able to do so. To that end, we invite you to participate in the newly launched **Helping Hand Initiative**, a renewed effort to increase alumni engagement with our collegiate members. Through this initiative, we are asking all alumnus brothers to make a commitment to serve on a Chapter Advisory Board (CAB), serve as a mentor to one of our collegiate members, or make a tax-deductible gift to The Foundation Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity, Inc. By supporting the Fraternity in one or more of these manners, we play a leadership role in ensuring that our ideals will be perpetuated for generations to come. Finally, mark your calendars on July 27–31, 2018 for Theta Chi Fraternity's 162nd Anniversary Convention in Las Vegas. We hope you will join us for an event filled with educational programming for collegians and alumni, an opportunity to participate in the government of your Fraternity, and brotherhood.

For me, it's humbling to realize that as a young man who is only 23 years old, the majority of what I value—the people I've met, the places I've seen, the opportunities I've had—can be credited to something that I joined just three years ago.

As much as I'm appreciative for these benefits I've received, I wonder: how do I return the favor? I've always been taught to leave something better than I find it, so I felt the pressure to give back to the Fraternity.

As a Field Executive, no matter how hard I've tried—the hours clocked, the phone calls answered, the meetings attended—I couldn't seem to get even. With each sacrifice I'd make, I'd form a new friendship. Enduring unexpected changes in

my travel schedule one moment, I'd find myself in Punxsutawney in the next—watching Phil call for more winter. Traversing multiple states, fingers gripping the steering wheel with exhaustion, I'd arrive to a greeting from a brother, a grip, and a chapter house that felt like home despite never having been there before.

I've toured huge schools like Ohio State, West Virginia, South Carolina, Syracuse, and Michigan State. I've explored small towns that I might have never otherwise seen, like Clinton, SC; Clarion, PA; Ada, OH; and Buckhannon, WV. I've crossed unfamiliar state borders, and I've stood proudly at the wedding of close friends whom I've met along the way.

It seems that I'll never be able to repay my debt to Freeman and Chase and that it's impossible not to continue to benefit from Theta Chi.

This idea is relevant in recruiting a new member, in reviving the Fraternity spirit within an alumnus, and in challenging the collegian to get the most of his undergraduate experience before graduation. It is the notion that by benefiting from Theta Chi and returning its Assisting Hand, we are both honoring and preserving its usefulness.

The day will come where I enter the Chapter Eternal and am of no more use to Theta Chi. The day will never come, though, where Theta Chi is of no use to me, to my fellow brothers, and to our brothers to come. It's by this cycle that I realize: serving the Fraternity—whether on staff, as a volunteer, by donating to the Foundation Chapter, or by simply remaining an active and loyal brother—ensures that it continues to benefit future men, just as it has benefitted me.

Take advantage of the benefits of our Fraternity by calling up a brother whom you've lost contact with; by checking out the map of chapters and saying hello to the guys who have always been just-across-town; or by showing up to the next golf tournament, homecoming, roast, or convention. Always seek to perpetuate our Fraternity, in whatever way you're best suited. After all, Theta Chi wouldn't have been here for you and I, had those before us not paid their dues. ■

Can Theta Chi Fraternity houses compete in today's collegiate housing markets?

The Norwich Housing Corporation says, "Yes, and we can help!"


During my twelve years of service at the International Headquarters, I have heard many alumni tell me, "I visited my chapter at homecoming this year and the men are doing great; the house, however, needs some work." With Theta Chi Fraternity experiencing record growth over the last few years, we have also seen an increase in the demand for newly renovated and updated houses. That is where the Norwich Housing Corporation is stepping in and stepping up to the challenge.

Two excellent examples of the "Helping Hand" of the Norwich Housing Corporation (NHC) are the houses at Tau/Florida and Gamma Xi/San Jose State.

This past September, the Tau Chapter House Corporation was able to pay off its loan to the NHC in its entirety. That smaller NHC loan was initially used to help secure a much larger loan with a lower interest rate at a local bank. "The support of the Norwich Housing Corporation was a critical complement to the generosity of Tau Chapter alumni and brothers in making this house a reality," said Tau Chapter House Corporation officer Matthew Marshall (1998).

Along with mortgages to help build and purchase new houses, the NHC also loans money to house corporations to renovate and update existing homes. The Gamma Xi House Corporation recently refinanced their current loan with the NHC to lower their interest rate and for additional funding to complete critical repairs to the aging roof. The updates to the physical house have made a world of difference for the chapter's status on campus and in the community.

As a reminder: NHC loans are only available to established house corporations that are associated with an active collegiate chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity. The NHC offers three different types of loans depending on the needs of the chapter. You can find out more about those loans by visiting www.thetachi.org/housing. THE PIANO MAN

After learning to play the piano by ear in high school and serenading his teammates and party-goers in college, Phil Vassar (Eta Kappa/James Madison 1984) left JMU and moved to Nashville to pursue a career in the music industry. Through hard work, persistence, and patience, Vassar played piano bars, tended bar, owned the Hard Day's Nightclub, continued to network, and finally made his presence known as his songs were performed by country music stars in the late 1990s. Today, he has 10 Number 1s, 15 Top 10s, and 26 TOP 40s including hits such as: "Just Another Day in Paradise," "Carlene," "Six Pack Summer," "American Child," "For a Little While," and "My Next Thirty Years" (Tim McGraw); "Right on the Money" (Alan Jackson); "I'm Alright" and "Bye Bye" (Jodee Messina), and many more. "Bye, Bye" earned Vassar his first American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) award for Song of the Year, and in 1999, he was named ASCAP's Songwriter of the Year. We caught up with Phil Vassar before he performed at the 2nd Annual Bob Nicol Memorial Concert and Golf Tournament, named for an Eta Kappa Chapter President.

The Rattle: Tell us why you decided to go to JMU.

Phil Vassar: I went there to run track. The track coach was Eddie Witt and I was a really big fan of his. He was legendary in the Seminole District where I grew up and ran in Lynchburg. He knew a lot about jumps and hurdling and they were my events. At that time it was about a 70/30 women to men ratio, so I knew I was in the right place (*laughing*.)

R: Why did you join Theta Chi?

PV: I just became friends with some of the brothers and of course they're all here this weekend. What a great bunch of guys. We're still close. We still talk all the time. And the cool thing is that I play all over the planet and I'll see these guys everywhere. It's really, really fun. It's like we're still those 18 year old kids in these older bodies, but I love it.

R: What are your memories of music at Theta Chi events?

PV: Music was such a huge part of our parties and our house. Back then we all had record players in our rooms and we'd play

everybody. That's when I got turned on to Bruce Springsteen and a lot of the guys from New Jersey and a lot of that music. It was really kind of a neat time and that's when I first heard [Springsteen's] River album and it was just awesome. I mean I loved it. We still talk about music and guys will send me a snippet of a Springsteen song or Petty or whoever it was at the time we were listening to in the parties on Thursday nights. We made our own mix tapes, we had our own deejays, and we'd deejay our own parties. It was so much fun.

R: What do you remember most about your time in the chapter?

PV: I lived in the dorms and then I moved over to the Theta Chi house. And then everything went downhill. My grades and everything. No just kidding, that was a joke. (*chuckles*.) No, it got fun after that, really. Everybody was pretty close. We stuck together and we still do. And it's just such a tight knit bunch of guys which is really kind of a special thing and I'll always remember that. We lost one of our brothers: An apartment caught on fire and my Big Brother, Dave Dunagan (1983) died, so that

was a tough thing. It was a weird time, but everybody stuck together. Seriously, these are some of the best friends I have in the whole world right now and all these years later—35 years later—we're still all hanging out, and acting like we're still on the lake at JMU.

R: Any other stories you'd want to share?

PV: Oh my God, there's a bunch of them (*laughing*.) One time, one of our phones tapped into the WATS line at the University and everybody was using it to call long distance. Some people would just come and call their girlfriends for an hour. At the end of the year we got a \$20,000 phone bill! It was unbelievable! So we had like \$7,000 in our Fraternity account and I think we bet it on a football game. (*laughing*.) We bet it on the Cowboys on a Monday night game and they were down 21 to nothing at half-time. Oh my God! They came back and won! I don't know how that happened and I don't know if you can print this—it's probably not a good idea—but we somehow paid the University back for those phone calls that were made from our room.



R: How do you define being a Resolute Man?

PV: I think as I've grown older, I've become more resolute. It's important to have values and strength and power and work ethic and to become more goal-oriented and make sure things happen. I think that's what it's about, and it's very, very important. I'm very thankful to be a Theta Chi. Very Thankful.

R: Did you hold any positions in the chapter?

PV: I ran track and I was also in [a show choir] called the Madisonians. I was probably one of the busier ones. Between music and school and track and everything, I was actually gone a lot of weekends for track meets and doing all that stuff. So it was harder for me to hold positions.

R: Who was a great leader in the chapter?

PV: Our President, Bob Nicol (1982). That's why we're here for this event. He was a great guy and he was an amazing President. He's the most even-keeled human being I've ever met. So when everybody else at 18, 19, 20, and 21 was freaking out, he always had his composure. He was the same guy before he died as he was when he was at JMU.

R: Why is this Bob Nicol Memorial important to you—Why do you come and help it out?

PV: Bob was a dear friend. Since college we stayed close and I had just seen Bob in New York City. He came to one of my shows and not long after that, they called me and said he'd gotten really sick and

then he died. It was a really bizarre deal. I mean—nobody's supposed to—dying in your 50s is not cool. Chris Owens (1983) and all these guys came together and said, 'Let's do a memorial kind of thing' and then it's bloomed into this and a lot of the guys have done really, really well and we all kind of contribute in a way. I think we're going to raise a lot of money this year for this foundation in his name. I'm sure [Bob] would be thrilled about it.

R: I think he'd be excited to see everybody come back together every year.

PV: He was that guy who wanted everybody to be together and hang out and go golfing. These guys go on Myrtle Beach trips, about 30 of them. [Bob] was there every year trying to get me to do it, but of course I'm always working on weekends and I'm like, 'Look dude, I'd be there if I could. I'm there in spirit, I promise.'

R: What's something you experienced at Eta Kappa Chapter that you wish every Theta Chi everywhere would have experienced?

PV: I don't know if it's any different. We would go visit other Theta Chis at [Virginia] Tech or UVA, even other schools

in Pennsylvania. I just remember how it was just like a brother. And I think every [chapter] I've been to—even on the road now—I'll do a concert and I'll see guys with Theta Chi shirts on and they know I'm a Theta Chi or I'm at Stephen F. Austin in Texas or wherever and they're coming to the show and it's amazing. These guys with open arms just invite me in to stop by their house. It's just like I'm 18 again. I think it was a special time for us and a special time in our lives. Eta Kappa Chapter—it was really a good group of guys and it still is.

R: What did you learn from Theta Chi that has helped you in your career?

PV: I think a fraternity and the social aspect is always going to resonate with me. I'm in the social business. Having socials, having the parties, it's not like a high school. It's a whole different thing being in a fraternity. Greek parties, Greek row, Greek Week competitions, Greek Sing—we had so much fun doing that. I mean I still look back and I just go, 'Man you had so much fun.' I want to go back! (*laughing*.) I'm trying to see if I could go back and be Social Chairman at Eta Kappa Chapter!



R: Why is the piano your instrument of choice?

PV: Probably Billy Joel and Elton John—even Lionel Richie and Bruce Hornsby. We had this piano we were storing in the basement of my little house back home and I would go down there and just mess around on it and I loved it. I just became interested in it. I'd find myself going back down there and playing and doodling around and learning songs by ear whenever I had the chance. I can't even pass a piano without playing it anymore. It's just a love.

R: Who are some of your mentors in the music industry?

PV: I love the Billy Joels, Elton Johns. Jackson Browns—the singer-songwriters are my heroes. Huey Lewis is one of my mentors and he's one of my good friends. Kenny Rogers, people like that, who actually sat me down and had a glass of wine and long, long conversations and talked about music. I just love those guys. I'm really appreciative of the times that I got to talk to guys like Conway Twitty and Waylon Jennings, and Merle Haggard was one of my heroes. We'd sit and talk for hours. I've gotten to do shows with all of them—and Willie Nelson. They still love music and they love playing and they didn't do it because they needed the money. They just did it because they loved it and I think getting to a point where you don't have to worry about things like [money] but you just love it because you love music. I think that's the greatest thing you can do and I love playing music more now than I ever had.

R: Who would you really like to work with that you just haven't had the opportunity yet?

PV: I'd say Billy Joel or Elton. There's just so, so many. I've gotten to do shows with some really cool people but I've always loved those guys and they'll always be my heroes. I don't know if anything like that will ever happen, but you never know.

R: Who are you listening to right now?

PV: It's always somebody different. I always listen to the old stuff, too: Sting, The Police, The Eagles, Elton John, Billy Joel, Jackson Browne, Tom Petty, Springsteen, and Steely Dan. I also listen to older stuff like Glen Campbell and Buck Owen. My phone and my iPod are all over the

place. It's just kind of the nature of the biz. I like a lot of new stuff, too, because my daughter will turn me on to new artists: when I first heard Ed Sheeran, I said, 'Oh man, this guy's great!' I think for me I'm really always going to be intrigued by singer-songwriters and what people are writing. I think there's a lot of really bad music out, but I think there always has been. But I also think there's always something really, really good, if you're listening for it.

R: Tell us about the first time you played the Grand Ole Opry.

PV: Well that's a special place. I love it, to this day. Just knowing all the folks who have played that stage, it's a real honor. As a matter of fact, I played a couple weeks ago with Vince Gill and a couple of guys, and just to have the opportunity to do that all the time like I do, it's hard to fathom. I always kind of have to shake my head and go, 'Am I really here?' Porter Wagner and all these older guys who brought me on 15 or 20 years ago, a lot of them are gone now. What's really crazy is *we're* kind of becoming the guard (*laughing.*) The old guard.

R: Thinking back to your earliest days in Nashville, can you describe one of your most challenging moments where you just thought about giving up on your dream?

PV: Well I can honestly say I never had any intention of ever moving away. Never. It took a long time for me to ever have success there. It took me 10 or 12 years to have my first number one song. I played bars. I was bartending. I was doing everything I could to try to meet people and was getting doors slammed in my face, literally. It took me forever to break through and I think I'm stubborn to a fault. It probably bodes well for my career, because there are a lot of times I should have left, but I didn't. I'm glad I didn't. There were a lot of times I was [thinking] 'How in the hell is this not happening for me? I think this is pretty good stuff,' and have people say, 'Well your songs just aren't very good.' But eventually they're the same songs that were number one five years later or 10 years later, in some cases. So I think it was just about being persistent and you just have to get up every day. The bottom line is I just love Nashville. I love the city. I love raising my family there.

R: During those stressful times, other than yourself, who were your biggest supporters?

PV: Well, always my mom and my sisters. I lost my dad many years ago, but I don't think he would have ever wanted me to do this. But I think my mom has always been there for me. She's an amazing lady. Even in the days when I couldn't figure out how I was going to pay my rent, she was supportive. But I just worked hard. Thank God I always had this work ethic. I was working 20 hours a day just to try to make it and eventually it happened. I had my own restaurant, my own bar, I did all that stuff and I was playing in it. I was cooking breakfast at 6:00 a.m. and then I was playing bar at night and I don't even know how I got through that time in my life. It was five years I didn't sleep, but I had a lot of fun. I heard I had fun, at least that's what my friends tell me.

R: Advice for brothers trying to break into the music industry?

PV: Well, stay in school. Be a doctor or something. Go to law school. (*chuckles.*) No, I really don't mean that—I think music is an amazing gift and if you can do it and make a living at it like I have my whole life, I mean, I tell you what, I'm the luckiest guy in the whole world. I think about it every day. I've got a lot of friends who are attorneys who hate their jobs and I know guys who quit their jobs that were successful. They decided they wanted to be songwriters and they wanted to do this or whatever and they [left] amazing careers.

You’ve got to love it. You can’t do it for the money. Money definitely dictates a lot of folks’ lives and their careers or whatever. I think how you measure success is your own deal. That’s your own issue. But I think for me, I’m so lucky to know that every day I wake up and get to go sing, right, it’s like, are you kidding me? And I’m lucky enough, I’ve been successful, too. You’ve got to love it and do your own thing and you can’t try to copy anybody. It’s the same thing I tell everybody: Be your own person. Be your own artist. Otherwise you’re just going to blend in with everybody else. There’s got to be a point of difference.

R: What are your future goals or ambitions for your career?

PV: I want to go back to college and back to Eta Kappa and be the Social Chairman. That would be great. *(laughs.)* We have this Christmas tour that we’re excited about with Kelly [Pickler] and we’re doing a lot of shows in the Northeast and Midwest, so hopefully, we’ll get a bunch of Theta Chis out there. It’ll be fun, so I’m excited about

that. I’m working on my “Songs from the Cellar” TV show. It’s been great. We’ve shot two years of episodes and I’m looking forward to sharing them. Keeping my daughters between the lines and keeping them on the path is another goal and to spend as much time with my girls as I can, and just watch them be amazing ladies.

R: Are any of your songs influenced by or reference Theta Chi?

PV: Yeah, a lot of it. I always think about songs like “I’m Alright” and songs like that. You look back and all your friends and the nights you had and the camaraderie. I’ve got a lot of songs that I write about friends. So a lot of it is definitely influenced by my buddies. I reflect a lot in my song writing, so it’s definitely a big part of it. For sure, I have pulled from some of those nights. And days, but mostly nights.

R: If you were to write a song about Theta Chi, what would it be about?

PV: *(Laughing.)* Well, I’m sure that there would probably be a cocktail or two

involved. But, just smiling and laughing and friends—I think that’s what it’s about. It’s what it’s about tonight. And I’m excited to be here doing the stuff with these guys and I think it’s going to be a pretty good time. I think that’s exactly what [the song] would be about: the good times we had and the good times we still have.

R: Last April, you received the Distinguished Achievement Award from the Grand Chapter. What does that mean to you?

PV: Well, it’s amazing. It’s up in my house. And people walk in and go, ‘Are you serious—you?—of all people?’ I think it’s just a huge honor to be bestowed upon. I just still can’t get over it. I really, really can’t, but I don’t take it lightly. I really don’t take it lightly at all. It’s something I’m very proud of and maybe we can get everybody down to Nashville some day and have fun again. That was a great time. I’m very appreciative of that.

R: Any comments you’d like to share about Theta Chi’s national partner, the USO? You’ve been performing for the USO recently.

PV: The USO has been so good to us. We’ve had fun doing just all kinds of things. As a matter of fact, the USO Choir came and sang the Anthem with me to open CMA Music Fest. They played with me on “Fox and Friends.” They’re just so good and I just love being a part of that and all they are and what they represent. And the servicemen and women—talk about badassess—they are badassess. To me still, they don’t get enough credit and any organization that can make that happen, I’m all about it. We get to see them all over the world. We’re excited to be going back overseas next year.

R: Any final thoughts or words of wisdom to share with your brothers of Theta Chi, the readers of *The Rattle*?

PV: I love *The Rattle*, it’s great. I love getting it in the mail. It just makes me proud. It makes me proud to be part of an organization like Theta Chi and I’m excited to see where it goes and take it into the future. We have a pretty storied past and I’m excited about where it’s going. ■

ESPRIT DE CORPS:

FROM GUADALCANAL TO FLORIDA AND BACK TO BLOODY RIDGE

BY WILLIAM W. PALMER (BETA ALPHA/UCLA 1985)

The young Marine Corps fighter pilot had been sitting, strapped into his cockpit, for almost 75 years before he was discovered by a Solomon Islander. Three-quarters of a century after the landing at Guadalcanal on August 7, 1942, there is a very active Marine Remains Recovery Unit working the jungles and beaches in the Solomon Islands looking for the bodies of servicemen. The ultimate goal is to honor and remember the sacrifices made by those who fought and died at Guadalcanal.

Nearly 40,000 men died during the land, air, and naval battles that comprised the Guadalcanal campaign, a decisive turning point of the Pacific War. The detritus of war lingers. There are still trenches with spent shell casings, rusting ships washed up on beaches, old bayonets, fins of exploded mortar rounds, decayed helmets, and naval shells mixed with the beach sand. A conversation with my chapter brother, Marine Col. Robert Rigbee (Beta Alpha/UCLA, 1983), resonated, “Bill, that is hallowed ground to the Marine Corps.” I knew that I had to take the opportunity to extend my Helping Hand.

My personal involvement began when I accepted a position with the United Nations. My role was to draft a set of model laws and regulations to help the Solomon Islands and the surrounding Island Nations enter the global economy. I had written other laws, like Holocaust reparations treaties for Israel, Europe, and our country. For me, these projects were never about money—they are about working hard, giving back, and straightening the Arc of Justice.

I visited one excavation site where the jungle battlelines of the U.S. Marines and the Imperial Japanese were the width of a high school basketball court apart. Sand-bagged holes and trenches lined with yellow bags showed where human remains were discovered and excavated. The bodies are DNA-tested and returned to their families. During my visit, a Solomon Islander came and offered a Marine the remains of an unidentified combatant in a thick, clear plastic bag. The bones were only slightly yellowed—the human skull was clearly visible. Because the soil of the Solomon Islands is not acidic, the remains were well-preserved. There was no reward—no money

changed hands. The Islander was given a GPS, so that coordinates where the body was found could be used to locate other lost remains—perhaps the rest of a patrol. The gracious Solomon Islander left with a handshake and the gratitude of the Marine.

Later, the famous Guadalcanal historian John Innes handed me a bottle of sand that he had personally gathered and asked if I could deliver it to a family in Florida. The Marines were unable to locate the Marine's body, but Innes wanted to provide sand from the exact spot where Pvt. John Carmen Buckhalt was killed. "Bill, please treat this as very special sand," he said.

When I returned to California, I contacted three brothers I knew in Florida: Mark Hillis (Gamma Rho/Florida State 1964), Christopher Oprison (Beta Alpha/UCLA 1994), and Patrick Kilbane (Zeta Beta/Adrian 2002). Each responded immediately, "Happy to help, Brother!"

Mark Hillis and his wife Nan drove the 1.5 hours to meet with Carmen Buckhalt Lawson, named after her Marine uncle. Mark brought a letter from the Governor expressing the people of Florida's condolences and thanks. A portion of the sand was taken to the grave of J. Carmen Buckhalt's brother, who never recovered from the loss. The family divided up the rest of the sand. Afterwards, Carmen Lawson sent an email from Florida, which said, in part, "My heart is full . . . thank you."

Brothers currently known to have participated in the Guadalcanal Campaign include:

Lt. A. Lowell Adams (Iota/Colgate 1940), USMC

Lt. James B. Ashley, M.D. (Alpha Gamma/Michigan 1938), Army Medical Corps— Killed in Action while tending to wounded and awarded the Bronze Star.

Robert Ayres (Alpha Psi/Maryland 1943), USMC— Dive bomber pilot who later received the Distinguished Flying Cross for sinking a Japanese Destroyer, among other acts.

Col. Rodger R. Bankson (Alpha Omicron/Washington State 1936), USA— arrived on December 26 to relieve the Marines.

Capt. Francis L. Cooper (Alpha Pi/Minnesota 1941), USMC— served with Marine Raiders atop Bloody Ridge.

Lt. John J. Donahue (Iota/Colgate 1941), USMC

William Foster (Theta/Massachusetts 1940), USA

Lt. Cmdr. John H. Gill (Alpha Epsilon/Stanford 1935), USN— landed on Guadalcanal on August 7, 1942.

Lt. Alfred A. Haas (Zeta/New Hampshire 1943), USMC— served with the First Marine Raider Battalion atop Bloody Ridge, which later received the Presidential Unit Citation.

Capt. John P. Nevins (Iota/Colgate 1940), USMC— Killed in Action. *Life Magazine* ran a picture of the graves of U.S. Marines at Guadalcanal in October 1942 where members of Iota Chapter saw the cross bearing his name.

Capt. George Newgard (Phi/North Dakota State 1928), USA— Killed in Action.

Capt. George Pitts (Theta/Massachusetts 1942), USA

Col. Robert H. Pepper (Alpha Xi/Delaware 1917), USMC— was cited by Admiral "Bull" Halsey and awarded the Legion of Merit.

Sgt. Robert C. Ratliff (Rho/Illinois 1933), USA— served on Guadalcanal and was later Killed in Action in Bougainville. Received the Bronze Star, posthumously.

Lt. John R. Stack (Beta Eta/Washington (MD) 1940), USMC— Fighter pilot who received the Distinguished Flying Cross while serving with the top-scoring "Wolfpack Squadron," with 2 confirmed and 5 probable Zero fighter kills.

Lt. Howard N. Steff (Theta/Massachusetts 1939), USA— received noteworthy commendation from the commander of the South Pacific Army Forces.

Capt. Howard E. Wertman (Alpha Tau/Ohio 1940), USMC— among the first who landed on August 7, 1942.

Also of note:

Maj. Frederick P. Henderson (Alpha Delta/Purdue 1934), USMC— The Japanese airfield was renamed after his brother, Maj. Lofton Henderson, a decorated Marine pilot who lost his life leading his squadron during the Battle of Midway. Lofton Henderson was pledged to a fraternity that later merged with Alpha Delta/Purdue, but transferred to the United States Naval Academy.

During my UN work, I became friends with U.S. Consulate Keithie Saunders and her husband, Sir Bruce Saunders, KBE.OBE, who asked for my help securing the 400-acres encompassing and surrounding the famous Bloody Ridge, where 800 Marines held “the thin red line” (as it is known today) against 3,000 undefeated Imperial Japanese Marines during several frontal assaults made throughout the night. Sir Bruce explained that the property acquisition had been tied up for years and that squatters were now moving onto the site, which could potentially compromise its historical importance, and that he was asking for my help on behalf of the Prime Minister, the Parliament, and the Solomon Islanders. I received an honorary ambassador appointment.

My work was purely pro bono, and, with special thanks to Sir Bruce and others, was ultimately successful. A new national park was secured with Solomon Island funds, and a one-ton granite monument was transported by the Marine Raiders Association from the United States to Henderson Airfield, where it sat, just short of the money necessary to transport it to the top of the Ridge and to construct the concrete base. Again, with Mark Hillis’ and Sir Bruce’s energy, and others, we raised the funds.

I drafted the Congressional statement (shown below), and with bipartisan support, it was placed into the permanent Congressional Record of the United States on August 7, 2017, the 75th Anniversary of the Marines’ landing. My summer intern, Rick Zapardiel (Zeta Xi/UC-Davis 2018), a veteran Marine Corps Scout Sniper/Team Leader, liasoned with Congresswoman Masui’s office staff.

On August 6, 2017, I stood on the deck of the destroyer USS Barry and met the Commandant of the United States Marine Corps, Gen. Robert B. Neller (Xi/Virginia 1975), who took the opportunity for a photo with myself and Sir Bruce’s grandson, Noah Jarrah (Alpha Psi/Maryland 2019).

At the August 7 wreath-laying ceremony, Gen. Neller described his trip to Guadalcanal as “a pilgrimage,” and shared that as a young boy he recalled reading the best-selling 1943 “*Guadalcanal Diary*” by Richard Tregaskis. In light rain, the Commandant said, “It is critical that we remember this place and the sacrifices of our young men that were made here.” After the ceremony, Gen. Neller counseled my youngest son Jack (now a pledge at Zeta Phi/Cal Poly) with words from the Creed on the importance of his school grades—“the primacy of alma mater.” Sir Bruce turned to me, and with a touch of humor in his British accent, said, “I must read up on this Theta Chi organization, you men are everywhere!”

The hallowed ground is secure as a national park, the new monument sits atop Bloody Ridge, the historical Congressional record is protected, and the young men of Bloody Ridge and Guadalcanal are not forgotten. I remain touched by the sacrifices made at Guadalcanal, by those who helped me throughout this quest, and I finish this project reminded once again of the values that make this a great country and of the concluding words of our Creed, “I shall do all in my power to perpetuate its ideals, thereby serving my God, my country, and my fellow man.” ■

In Recognition of the 75th Anniversary of Marines Landing at Guadalcanal

**THE HON. DORIS O. MATSUI OF CALIFORNIA
IN THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES**

August 7, 2017

Mr. Speaker, I rise today to recognize the 75th Anniversary of our United States Marines’ landing at Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands during World War II. Three-quarters of a century after this momentous event, the memory and sacrifice of these brave men should not be forgotten.

On August 7, 1942, Marines joined by our allies landed on the shores of the Solomon Islands to deny their use to our then-adversary, Imperial Japan. These Marines were joined by U.S. Navy vessels, as well as by ships and troops supplied by our Australian and British allies, in a series of 26 land and naval battles that collectively became known as the Battle of Guadalcanal. Two of our future presidents served there: John F. Kennedy and Richard M. Nixon. Other Solomon Islanders served bravely as the famous Coastwatchers, providing the early warnings that allowed our outnumbered Marines to prevail against their enemies. Today, we look to the future with the knowledge that the Marines’ landing on this day three-quarters of a century ago was an important turning point in World War II’s Pacific Theater.

To commemorate this important event, Marines and private citizens are currently in the process of dedicating a new monument atop the battlefield known as Bloody Ridge in Guadalcanal. Their efforts are supported and aided by the citizens and government of the Solomon Islands. The approaching ceremony to occur on the famous Bloody Ridge battle site recognizes the unity of spirit that today prevails among our allies and former adversaries, all of which are now charged with maintaining peace in the Pacific Ocean.

Mr. Speaker, as the efforts to create a monument to the heroism displayed by so many at Guadalcanal move forward, I ask my colleagues to join me in remembering the 75th anniversary of our Marines’ historic landing at Guadalcanal.



Theta Chi was a lifelong passion for Harry. For 61 years, Harry kept abreast of the happenings of Beta Chi Chapter. Brother Bonner was a staunch believer in providing philanthropic support to Theta Chi Fraternity in the form of giving to The Foundation Chapter of Theta Chi. Over his lifetime Harry gave for 40 years, with his lifetime giving reaching the Chairman's Council of \$10,175 in tax-deductible gifts. Upon his death, Harry made an estate gift to The Foundation Chapter, as he wanted to support our students beyond his lifetime. As a member of Theta Chi's Legacy Society, Harry's estate gift is ensuring the success of our men for the next 160 years.

He also served the Fraternity as a Regional Counselor and Regional Director for the Southeast Region. In 2008, Brother Johnson was elected to the Grand Chapter and served one term: two years as International Historian and two years as International Treasurer.

Terry was undoubtedly the most instrumental alumnus volunteer in orchestrating the resurrection of one of FSU's original seven fraternities and one of Theta Chi's most distinguished chapters back to active status. Terry treated us as his own sons. He loved us. And he gave us his tough love often. He relished in our accolades and helped guide us through the challenges of growth and success. Though he wasn't initiated as one, he will forever be as much a Gamma Rho as any of us. Truly a great example of Theta Chi for Life."
