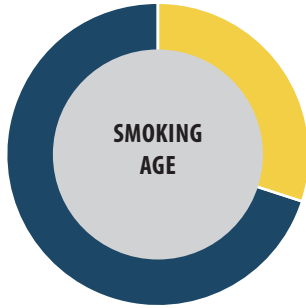




2020 SURVEY RESULTS

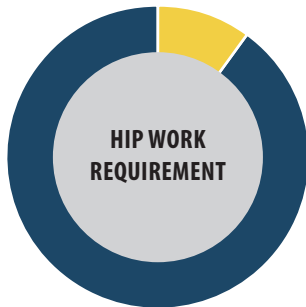

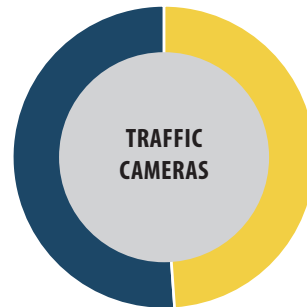
3. Should Indiana require able-bodied adults to work or look for work in order to receive publicly funded health care coverage under the Healthy Indiana Plan?

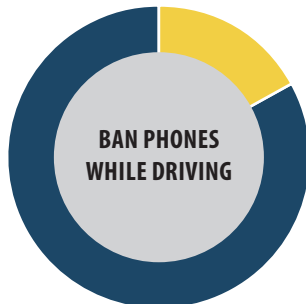
4. In order to increase highway work-zone safety, should cameras be used to issue tickets to drivers who speed in work zones?

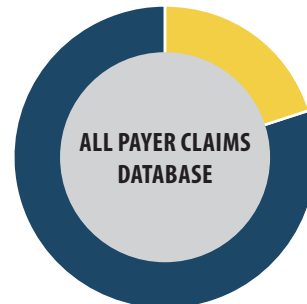
5. Do you support or oppose banning the use of cell phones while driving, except for hands-free applications?
