

Franklin College Department of Mathematics Receives National Honor

Franklin College announced that its mathematics and computing department has been awarded a prestigious national honor by the American Mathematical Society (AMS). The society, after a review of the department's programs, has recognized the college as the recipient of its 2019 Award for an Exemplary Program or Achievement in a Mathematics Department.

"In the arena of higher education programs in mathematics, the prestige of this award is beyond compare," said Lori Schroeder, provost and dean of Franklin College. "This award is highly coveted and is sought after by thousands of colleges and universities across the nation, and it is rare for a small, liberal arts college to be chosen in the face of so many large university mathematics programs. We are so very proud of our faculty for garnering this singular recognition."
