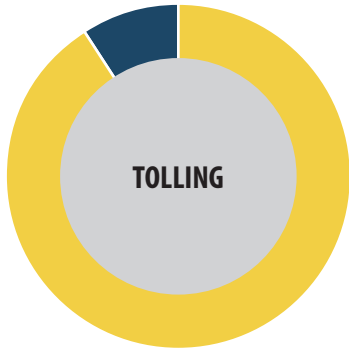

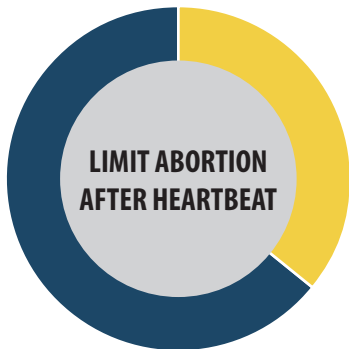
2. Should the remaining three Marion County township fire departments (Decatur, Pike and Wayne) merge with the Indianapolis Fire Department?

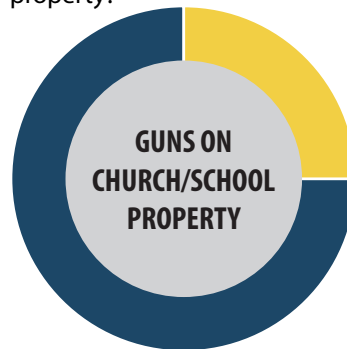
3. Except in cases of emergencies, should abortions be prohibited when the baby's heart begins to beat?

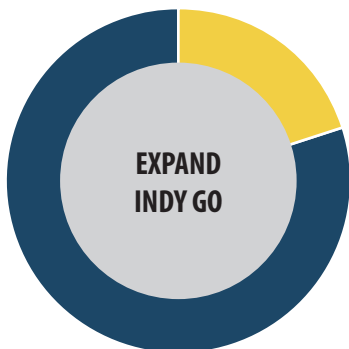

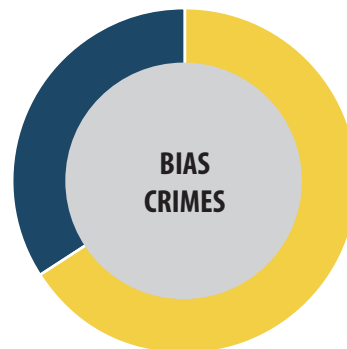
5. Should the state of Indiana allow Hendricks County to vote to extend the Indy Go bus line into Hendricks County?

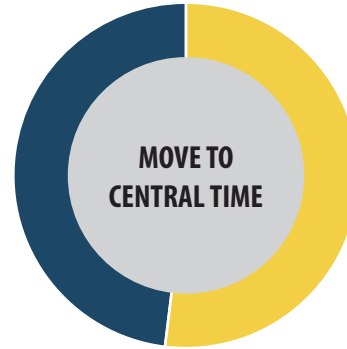
7. Should drug dealers be given immunity from being charged with a crime if they stay on the scene and call for emergency personnel to help someone who has overdosed on drugs?

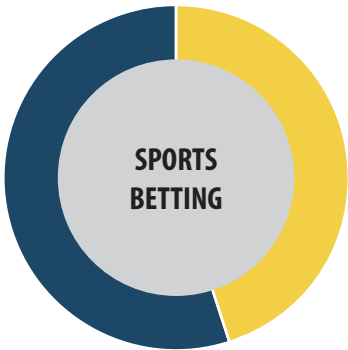
8. Twelve of Indiana's 92 counties follow Central time while the rest follow Eastern time. Should all of Indiana be moved to Central time?
