
- Congratulations to Davin Kolderup ('13) who will be managing the Marketing and Communications Department for the Johnson County Public Library beginning in January.

Catching Up with Eric Klinkowski, LJC Class of 2012 So Eric, we just heard you received a promotion...tell us all about it!

I was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant serving the Greenwood Police Department on Oct 23, 2015. I successfully completed my probationary rank on October 23, 2016, and now hold the Merit Rank of Lieutenant. I currently manage one of the four Road Division shifts of our department and answer directly to Deputy Chief James Ison and the Administration of our department.
