FROM THE INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT

Strive to be Resolute Men



I am truly honored and humbled to have been elected as Theta Chi's International President at the 160th Anniversary Convention this summer. My journey began in January 1992, when I received an invitation to join Chi Chapter at Auburn University. Although we did not formally have initiatives, such as Sacred Purpose or The Resolute Man, the underlying values associated with these initiatives were alive and well. After graduation, I began my career and became involved with Chi Chapter again in 2000. I presided over Chi's house corporation for several years and became increasingly involved with the International Fraternity during that time. I served as a Counselor for six years and was elected to the Grand Chapter at the 154th Anniversary Convention in 2010.

This entire decade has been a very successful time for Theta Chi and I am grateful to the outstanding leadership that has been in place during that time. Brothers Doug Allen and Dick Elder each served admirably as International President. I want to thank them for their hard work and dedication, but more importantly, for their friendship and counsel. I also want to thank Executive Director Mike Mayer for his leadership in the interfraternal space and for the outstanding job that he and his staff do in running the day-to-day operations of the International Headquarters.

While I am very proud of Theta Chi's many accomplishments, there are two in particular that I want to mention. Theta Chi took a position of leadership in the interfraternal community by developing and articulating Sacred Purpose to our chapters. Discussing topics such as alcohol and drug abuse prevention, mental health issues, sexual assault prevention, and life safety can be very challenging, but our chapters have met that challenge. More importantly, our chapters have demonstrated leadership by sharing their sessions, workshops, and knowledge with other organizations at their respective institutions. This work has not gone unnoticed, as Theta Chi was awarded the North-American Interfraternity Conference's Laurel Wreath Award earlier this year, a distinction recognizing impactful programs within the fraternal world.

I was very excited to witness the official unveiling of The Resolute Man at the most recent Convention. We have always stated, "Theta Chi is for Life," but we now have The Resolute Man as a concise framework to ensure pledges, collegians, and alumni get the most out of their fraternal experience. I often tell my brothers that Theta Chi is more valuable to me now than it was when I was a collegian. Watching younger brothers grow from being wide-eyed freshmen to graduating from college and accomplishing amazing things in their personal and professional lives is absolutely my favorite part of being a Theta Chi. I hope that The Resolute Man can help many more brothers realize that same sense of satisfaction.

THOUGHTS ON HOUSING

Your chapter is doing great. The alumni are quite impressed with what they're seeing. Chapter membership is at an all-time high and Theta Chi is seen as a leader on campus in student government, philanthropy, and scholarship. Your house corporation sees this as the perfect opportunity to either build a new house or renovate the old one. You want to strike while the iron is hot, right? While there are a lot of positive factors that militate in favor of building new or renovating, several things need to be considered before a decision is made.

First, the house corporation needs to be realistic. As we all know, being at the top does not mean you stay there. Do not assume that growth is continuous. In fact, experience tells the opposite—that chapter size and performance goes up and down over time. In other words, develop a plan that you know you can afford and either a new home or addition that you can keep filled.

Before you get too far into the planning process, engage the collegiate leadership. It is important that they have a voice in the new house or the reconfiguration of the old one. If they do not have the opportunity to offer input, they may not fill the house to capacity in the coming years. Things that were important to you as an 18-22-year-old may not be very relevant today. Find out what the collegians see as important to them.

Make sure that the financial plan works. Do not set yourself up to fail. Will the increased rental income cover the costs of the project? Will it also cover operations, utilities, insurance, and taxes? What type of capital fundraising campaign do you have in place? You can defray the overall project costs by raising money from alumni, but you cannot pay construction invoices with pledges that you have yet to receive.

When those pledges do start coming in, however, consider setting up a maintenance fund so that you have money saved up when those necessary expenses arise. A capital campaign presents a great oppo<mark>rtu-</mark> nity to reconnect with alumni who have not been involved for a while. As we all know, jobs and family take priority in your 30s and 40s, so it is natural to have brothers who get further away from the chapter. It also gives you a platform for creating a chapter advisory board, an alumni association, or both, if you have not done so already.


Once the house corporation and the chapter leadership are in accord, make sure that you get at least three bids on the architectural planning and general construction contracting. Obtain input from your potential architects and contractors on what their vision is and what they think works and does not work in a fraternity house. Make sure that both the architect and the general contractor are familiar with the scope of the endeavor. A fraternity house is not a big box store, a residence, or even a dormitory.


Remember when deciding on professional services, you generally get what you pay for, so when it comes to fraternity house construction, you need to watch closely. If a brother is hired to do the work, the system of checks and balances that you would have with a general contractor/distributor/architect/framer in the open market is different. It can easily move down his priority list, because it is a "favor." If you opt to contract a brother for work, keep it professional for both sides' benefit. This should be established at the very beginning.


Understand that you are dealing with 18-22-year old fraternity men. Cinder block walls will last longer than sheetrock. Hanging panel ceiling tiles may save you money, but you will be replacing them often, as they do not last as long as the sheetrock ceiling. Individual or multiple bathrooms may be a good marketing tool, but will really spike construction costs. With every component, consider maintenance. The more items that are built in, the less there is of moving heavy furniture that can damage walls, floors, and doors.





Not your chapter? No problem!

Now is the time to volunteer for Theta Chi Fraternity, even if you no longer live near your chapter.

Over the years and across hundreds of universities, one thing remains true when it comes to fraternities: A major factor for the long-term success of a chapter is consistent local alumni support. Our collegiate brothers have a strong desire to have alumni with whom they can discuss ideas and receive guidance. Even though the collegiate membership changes year to year, alumni advisers provide consistent support to the group over a much longer period.

Theta Chi chapters across the country are constantly searching for local volunteers to mentor and advise by serving as an adviser, or by joining a chapter advisory board (CAB) or house corporation.

Even if it has been a long time since your collegiate fraternity experience, you still have invaluable insight and life experiences to provide. Additionally, the International Fraternity will provide in-depth training and resources to any alumnus who chooses to volunteer.

Recently, we asked two alumni brothers, Eric Shapiro (Gamma Rho/Florida State 2011) and Dr. Philip Pappas (Beta Chi/Allegheny 1979), to share the how, why, and what of volunteering with a chapter different from theirs. Brother Shapiro worked with Iota Pi/LSU and Kappa Beta/Long Island–Post. Brother Pappas currently advises Beta Iota/Arizona.

How did you get started? Who contacted you and why did you agree to volunteer?

Eric: "I always wanted my Theta Chi experience to extend beyond my four years as an undergrad. I was fortunate enough to be selected as a graduate adviser when I decided to get my master's degree from LSU. That really opened the door for me to help volunteer in a couple of different capacities both locally and nationally."

Philip: "I was sitting in my office one afternoon in 2010 when I received a phone call from someone who identified himself as Philip Thornton, a brother with Theta Chi, and asked if I could possibly spare a little time to speak with him. I was a little surprised and intrigued. It had been about 30 years since I had done anything for Theta Chi. I said sure why not! It dawned on me... it really was time to start giving back and I have not regretted it for one moment."

How has the chapter received you? Were they appreciative?

Eric: "Initially, I think the chapter was a little cautious and unsure. There was a learning curve on both sides. Just because certain things worked at my alma mater, doesn't mean they were right for the school I was advising. Communication and developing trust was critical to making the relationship work."

Philip: "Some may wonder what a nearly 60-year old man may find rewarding in doing this, after all I am at least as old as their fathers (and in one case, their grandfather), but these gentlemen have welcomed me into their life as a mentor, a teacher, an adviser, and above all. a friend and a brother."

What have you enjoyed the most about your time volunteering for Theta Chi?

Eric: "I found watching the chapter develop a plan, implement it, and have it succeed to be very rewarding. This was particularly true in recruitment. It can be a stressful undertaking. Celebrating their wins and working through the challenges was enjoyable to be a part of."

Philip: "During the six years I have worked with the chapter, I met some incredible young men. I have been with them as they struggled through adversity, as they recognized their accomplishments, and as they developed into the future leaders with the promise we continually tell them they should become. This has given me the opportunity to reconnect to a part of my life that had been lost and to re-embrace the ideals and gain a far greater understanding of brotherhood than I have ever had."

The four days spent in Atlanta this summer were made WELCOMF up of learning, leadership, and brotherhood. All attendees were able to experience the College Football Hall of Fame on the final night and partake in the vibrant downtown of Atlanta. The 160th Anniversary Convention and 37th School of Fraternity Practices also witnessed several milestones for Theta Chi Fraternity. Most significant of these highlights was the official launch THETACHI of The Resolute Man, Theta Chi's new membership initiative. Every Convention attendee received a hard FRATERNITY copy of The Resolute Man guidebook (available at Resolute Men www.thetachi.org/resoluteman) and learned about, for the first time, the program's expectations and obligations. Those who attended were able to complete portions of The Resolute Man curriculum, positioning themselves to become some of the first Theta Chis to be recognized as Resolute Men.

The Distinguished ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENTS (Recognized April 2016)

Mai. Gen. W. Russell Todd Ret. (Alpha/Norwich 1950)



Maj. Gen. Todd has had an established military career and education. Starting in the Armor Officers Career Course, Todd went on to attend Command and General Staff College,

Armed Forces Staff College, and Navy War College. Maj. Gen. Todd served in Korea from 1950-1961 earning the Silver Star, Bronze Star for Valor, Combat Infantryman Badge, and a Purple Heart. He also served in Vietnam from 1969–1971 earning a Distinguished Service Medal, Air Medal, Joint Services Commendation Medal, and two Combat Infantryman Badges. Following his service, Maj, Gen. Todd served as the President of Norwich University from 1982–1992.

Dr. Melvin D. George (Delta lota/Northwestern 1956)



Mel was President Emeritus of the University of Missouri System as well as President Emeritus of St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. After graduating from Northwestern, Brother

George received a doctorate in mathematics from Princeton University. Prior to these roles, George served as the Vice President for Academic Affairs and professor of mathematics. He also worked at the University of Nebraska as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

In a 1987 Rattle article, Brother George notes his passion for his profession. "After 26 years in higher education, I am more than ever convinced of its importance to America's future. It is an investment, not merely an expenditure." Throughout his longstanding career, Dr. Mel George was consistently recognized among educators as one of the nation's best. He was known to put his students above all else, at one point going so far as to move into a dormitory to better understand student life. Brother George passed away shortly after receiving the award. Bruce P. Bagge (Gamma Upsilon/Bradley 1959)



Brother Bagge spent 43 years in the investment business and was recognized repeatedly as a leader in his field. He was named Outstanding Broker of the year by Registered Rep magazine and also

earned a place in Research Magazine's Brokers Hall of Fame for placing his client's first. Bruce co-authored the book Ask the Conservative Investor, co-created/produced the publicly televised Chicago area show "The Conservative Investor," co-hosted "Straight Talk on Money" on the 38-state WMAQ-NBC radio network and for 27 years co-hosted the television show "Ask an Expert."

Bruce was named a philanthropic leader and received the Infant Welfare Society of Chicago's "Champion for Children" award for his efforts on behalf of poor, sick and abused children while serving as Chairman of the Children's Care Foundation. Bruce spent more than 30 years as a Board member and Chairman of Wyler Children's Hospital at the University of Chicago, where he founded and built their Ronald McDonald House. Bruce also served on the Board of Directors for the University of Chicago Hospitals & Clinics for many years.

In 1999, Bruce proudly received the prestigious alumnus award of Theta Chi Fraternity for his outstanding humanitarian efforts followed in 2002 by the honor of the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Bradley University and Bradley's Centurion Award.

Marvin R. Baxter (Beta Upsilon/Fresno State 1962)



Justice Baxter retired last year after serving as a California Supreme Court Justice for 26 years. While earning a degree in economics at Fresno State, he was active in student government, served as

Student Body President, and was awarded an Outstanding Senior Award. He was then selected and served as a Coro Foundation Fellow in San Francisco.

While practicing law in Fresno, Justice Baxter was active in bar association activities. He served on the board of directors of the Fresno County Bar Association, Fresno County Young Lawyers Association, Fresno County Legal Services, Inc., and California

Young Lawyers Association, and was president of the Fresno County Bar Association and Fresno County Young Lawyers.

In January 1983, Justice Baxter became appointments secretary to Governor George Deukmejian and was the governor's principal advisor on all gubernatorial appointments made to the executive and judicial branches of government. He served in this capacity for six years and assisted in the appointment of more than 700 judges.

Justice Baxter was appointed and confirmed as an Associate Justice of the Court of Appeal, in December 1988. He was elevated to serve as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of California in 1991, serving until January 2015.

Ernie Accorsi

(Gamma Omicron/Wake Forest 1963) Brother Accorsi was the General Manager for the New York Giants



from 1998 until his retirement in 2007. Prior to this, he was the General Manager of the Baltimore Colts and Cleveland Browns. Combined, his teams had nine playoff sea-

sons, including six divisional championships and 143 wins.

After graduating from Wake Forest University, Accorsi served in the U.S. Army. Following his service, he began a professional career as a sports writer for the Charlotte News, Baltimore Sun, and Philadelphia Inquirer. His transition to the NFL came after working in the Athletic Departments for St. Joseph's University and Penn State.

He was inducted into the Wake Forest Sports Hall of Fame, in the same class as Tim Duncan of the San Antonio Spurs. Accorsi is also an inductee of the Penn State Sports Hall of Fame, a recipient of the George Young Award from the National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame, and the 2009 winner of the Pete Rozelle Award from the Touchdown Club of New Orleans.

Arnold Hansmann (Beta Phi/Nevada 1966)



Hansmann spent a large part of his career as a leader in the world's largest fast food company: McDonalds. In a very short amount of time he was able to develop a worldwide organiza-

tion of financial professionals capable of

supporting double digit growth and large returns as partners. After ten years with McDonalds, he became the Assistant Vice President of Corporate Development. Currently, Hansmann works with MIRUS Information Technology Services, Inc. the leading provider of Business Intelligence applications for multi-unit restaurant chains.

Alan K. Saunders

(Gamma Xi/San Jose State 1969)



Alan Saunders was a model student athlete while attending San Jose State, earning Academic All-American Football honors as a three-year starter. After graduating from his alma mater, he

went on to earn a master's degree in education from Stanford in 1970. Following this, he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at USC under John McKay.

As a coach in the NFL, Saunders has been part of 15 playoff teams, five division titles, and one Super Bowl championship. His offense has ranked first in total offense twenty times over his career. Saunders' creative and innovative playbook reportedly has approximately 700 pages of various plays. Currently, Saunders serves as the Cleveland Browns Senior Offensive Assistant.

Col. Duane A. Lamb (Ret.) (Alpha Phi/Alabama 1976)



Brother Lamb received a BS degree from The University of Alabama in 1976. In 1983, he graduated with honors from Golden Gate University, earning a master's in Public Administration with a

major in Organizational Management. He is a resident graduate of four military education institutes: Squadron Officer School, Air Command and Staff College, Armed Forces Staff College, and Air War College.

Col. Lamb boasts a significant military career. He wears the Joint Chiefs of Staff badge, the master operator's missile and space badges, and the officer aircrew wings. His military decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Aerial Achievement Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Air Force

Commendation Medal. Air Force Achievement Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Combat Readiness Medal. National Defense Service Medal with star device, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal. He retired after 30 years of active duty in June of 2007 and currently serves as an Assistant Vice President at the University of Alabama.

Kevin Krepinevich

(Zeta Alpha/Slippery Rock 1966)



Brother Krepinevich served as the International Secretary of Kiwanis International from 1987-1994. At the time of his arrival. Kiwanis was facing a heavy decline in membership. After

extensive research, he was able to drive a 9,000-member increase in just one year. As a result of these efforts, the company earned the Associations Advance America Award of Excellence. Currently, Krepinevich is working with K2 Association Management Consulting.

Dennis A. Cardoza (Alpha Psi/Maryland 1981)



Mr. Cardoza served five terms in the U.S. House of Representatives from California's 18th District. His committee roles included serving four years on the powerful House Rules Committee.

Brother Cardoza also served as chairman of the House Agriculture Committee's Subcommittee on Horticulture and Organic Agriculture; ranking member of the Agriculture Committee's Subcommittee of Livestock, Dairy and Poultry; member of the Committee of Foreign Affairs' Subcommittee on Asia and the Pacific; member of the Subcommittee on the Middle East and South Asia, the Committee on Resources and its Subcommittee on Water, and the Science Committee.

Prior to his role in the House, Cardoza spent six years in the California State Assembly, where he chaired the Rules Committee. A number of organizations have honored Cardoza as Legislator of the Year for his efforts to cut taxes, help family farms and promote education and children's safety. He has also served as a council member in the cities of Merced and Atwater in California.

Marlon Longacre

(Eta Gamma/Morehead State 1986)



For Brother Longacre, community involvement is his passion. In 1997 he co-founded NorthStar Church in Kennesaw, GA where he worked as a Pastor of Community Development. NorthStar was

recognized as the fastest growing church in the Southern Baptist Convention, opening more than 22 since its inception. Recently, he began as the Associate Pastor at Piedmont Church in Marietta, Georgia.

Longacre has also played a major leadership role with numerous community fundraising initiatives. In 2007 he assisted in the formation of the Special Needs Development Group. To date, he has helped raise \$1.2 M for special needs playgrounds and athletic fields with concessions, giving opportunities for special needs students to gain valuable work experience. Taste of Kennesaw is an annual event Longacre was instrumental in starting, raising \$100,000 annually for families in need during the Christmas holiday. He also serves as the chairman for both Love the Lake and the Big Shanty Festival, raising \$900,000 for scholarships, children's programs, and educational programs for area schools.

Brig. Gen. Harrison B. Gilliam (Eta Gamma/Morehead State 1990



Gilliam became an infantry officer in 1991. After an assignment as the Platoon Leader of the 149th Infantry, KYARNG, he became a Special Forces Officer where he spent over a decade of his career.

Brig. Gen. Gilliam has had deployments in Europe, Africa, and the Middle East, commanding a special ops. task force in Afghanistan along with the European Engagement Group.

Brig. Gen. Gilliam has received two Bronze Stars, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Combat Infantryman Badge, and the Master Parachutist Badge.



eavy enemy fire poured down as the Bell UH-1 Iroquois helicopter, commonly known as "huey," attempted to extract a group of soldiers from the thick South Asian forest. It was March 28, 1968. in Laos, at the height of the Vietnam War, and a covert mission was underway. Sgt. Alan Boyer (Beta Epsilon/Montana 1965) was alongside fellow Green Berets Sgt. George Brown and Charles Huston, as well as seven South Vietnamese soldiers. The chopper was unable to land due to the hostile fire, so a hanging ladder was dropped. Six of the South Vietnamese soldiers made it safely onto the huey, as the remaining men provided cover fire. While the seventh soldier climbed, ground fire became so intense, the chopper was forced to retreat. Brother Boyer had started climbing the ladder as the helicopter made its exit. With only a few more feet to go, the ladder snapped after getting caught in the brush, and Boyer fell into the foliage with the two other Green Berets still on the ground. Reports account that the men were last seen safely holding their position in the dense forest. Although a search and rescue mission was conducted in the following days, no signs of the men were ever discovered. At the time, the general public was unaware of the classified mission. This is all Judi Boyer Bouchard knew of Alan's disappearance for more than 40 years.

The University of Montana

As his younger sister, Judi, followed Alan to the University of Montana in the sixties to study Anthropology, "I tried to do everything he did. He was the quintessential big brother," explained Bouchard. "He taught me how to ride a bike, drive a car—everything. I just adored him. For most of my life at that point, I was just Alan Boyer's little sister, which was wonderful." Brother Boyer initially enrolled in classes to study forestry, having an affinity for the outdoors. "Our family was big into camping," said Judi. "By the time we both began our studies in Missoula, we had camped in the contiguous 48 states." Despite being

born in Chicago, the family's focus on the outdoors stuck with Alan, working at Yellowstone National Park for several summers while growing up. After beginning his forestry studies to further his love of the outdoors, Alan decided to join Theta Chi at the University of Montana.

"I was impressed with Al from the start," recalls chapter brother and Montana native, Charles Hubbard (1966). "He seemed like a good man—serious, mature, caring, friendly, outgoing, and a good student and friend. We were not awfully close, but we related well, as I sometimes mentored Alan as an upperclassman." Alan was two years younger than Brother Hubbard, so, although they were in different stages of their collegiate careers, the two still became familiar as Theta Chis. "Our relationship was solid as fraternity brothers," and, according to Hubbard, the majority of Alan's friends were made up of Theta Chis.

At the onset of the American involvement in Vietnam, Alan had begun to reconsider his forestry career. He called his parents, Charles and Dorothy Boyer, who were still living in Illinois, and explained to them his uncertainty about college. "I don't know what I really want to do," Judi recalls Alan saying. "I know you're going to be disappointed, and I'll finish college at some point, but for now, I'm going to enlist —sorry Dad—in the Army. Charles

Boyer, Alan's father, had served for more than three years in the Navy in various locations across North America, but he accepted his son's decision. They were extremely supportive parents, according to Judi, and backed anything Alan or she did. They were understanding of Alan's desire, but would hold him to finishing his degree when he came back. Unfortunately, he never was able to keep that promise.

Prior to shipping off to Vietnam, Alan traveled to Missoula to visit his sister and Theta Chi brothers. "That was the last time I saw him, in the fall of 1967," recalled Judi. "In my mind and heart, he is frozen in time as the handsome 21-year-old Green Beret."

Vietnam and Laos

While he was overseas, Judi and Alan remained in touch. "I wrote him almost every day," she explained. "Amazingly, he wrote back to me as much as possible." Alan could never actually disclose where he was or what he was doing, because many of his missions were classified. Nevertheless, he did his best to keep Judi in the loop, describing his disbelief in how far he had traveled. "I never thought I'd see this part of the world," one letter explained. Alan also wrote of the fear that would accompany many of his highly tactical missions. "When I found out how dangerous the





missions were, and the way they were constantly on the move, I still do not understand how he found the time to write me," said Judi. In his last letter to his sister, Alan wrote, rather prophetically: "I'd just love to have someone call me Sarge before I die." He was promoted to Sergeant while still declared missing in action. To this day, the objectives of his final mission are classified.

The question remains, however, what was the United States military doing in Laos? For nine years, covert bombing campaigns were conducted across Laos in an attempt to prevent communist forces from entering Vietnam, which borders the country. Many of these secret campaigns were conducted in conjunction with the Central Intelligence Agency and their overarching objectives and details remain a secret. In total, over 2 million tons of bombs were dropped on the country. Millions remained unexploded for decades, causing hundreds of accidental deaths.

Despite the body counts from Vietnam being broadcast each night on the evening news, Judi never let it drown her positive thoughts about Alan's eventual return. As a Green Beret, he was one of the most elite and well-trained soldiers in the Vietnam War. To Judi, this was comforting.

A phone call came to Judi one night while in Missoula. It was her parents. Alan was missing. One might assume devastation to follow such a phone call, but Judi remained confident. "I kept thinking, he's bright, he's strong, he's in special ops. He's trained for these situations. This is horrible but...he's going to come back." Near the same time of Alan's disappearance, the United States was receiving reports of POWs being used in propaganda films/photos. A number of these were shown to the Boyers, but none held any sign of Alan. "Every night I prayed, Ok Lord, we didn't find him today. How about tomorrow?"

Years passed, and the Boyer family still yearned for answers. In late 1972, rumors about peace talks had begun to surface. "Finally, we thought Alan would be coming home," explained Judi. The Paris Peace Accords, after years of deliberation, were signed by all parties in January 1973. This was, in short, a treaty intended to end the war and restore peace in Vietnam. When the news reached the Boyers, they felt a sense of relief. The return of 591 American prisoners of war, known as

Operation Homecoming, followed the Paris Peace Accords and they thought Alan would certainly be on that list. The soldiers returned home, and Alan was not one of them.

The Fall of Saigon came on April 30, 1975, marking the end of all fighting amongst the Northern and Southern Vietnamese forces. It was also around this time that the Boyer family began to hear less and less on the status of those missing in action. Some communication resumed when General John William Vessey was appointed as the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and became heavily involved in accounting for those missing in action. This would become known as the prisoner-of-war and missing-in-action issue (POW/MIA issue). Remains would periodically come in, but in relation to the number of men still missing, it was a drop in the bucket. At the time, 1,350 Americans were still listed as POW/MIA and another 1,200 reported as killed in action (KIA), with no body recovered. It was at this time that General Vessey compiled a list of the 81 men who were still unaccounted for, last seen in Laos. Answers were sought out from the Vietnamese as to what happened to these men to no avail. At this point, Alan was still declared MIA. Throughout the remainder of the 1980s, the United States had increased its communications in relation to the POW/MIA issue. They were able to excavate numerous crash sites throughout Vietnam and Laos, but where Alan was last seen brought no answers.

In the early 1990s, the United States opted to normalize relations with Vietnam, and for many POW/MIA families, this was difficult. "Thousands of family members were still searching for answers," said Judi. "To give up this bargaining chip was truly a large blow to me and my family, and to so many others." The years passed, and although the Boyers remained vigilant in their search for answers, the outlook continued to appear bleak. In 1994, Charles Boyer passed away on the operating table during a routine bypass surgery. "My father was not one to show grief," explained Judi. "I think the weight of Alan's disappearance played a big role in the deterioration of his health."

Visiting Laos

In 2001, Judi and her mother, Dorothy, decided to travel to Laos. A tour group was

heading to Southeast Asia and would be passing through the country. "The site where Alan was last seen was no longer accessible, and we knew that, but we felt compelled to go, regardless," explained Judi. Upon their arrival, they called the United States Embassy in Vientiane, the Laotian Capitol. Judi and her 81-year old mother didn't know what to expect as unannounced visitors, but an officer came to pick them up and the three of them went to lunch before heading to the Embassy. Incredibly, the officer realized that the office had just installed a large picture of the exact spot that Alan was last seen. Although the trip did not necessarily bring any answers, Judi and her mother left with a certain degree of comfort. Several years later, some hope came. A tooth with a DNA match for George Brown, one of the Green Berets last seen with Alan, was discovered. Nothing about Alan surfaced, and it did not bring any sense of closure, but it was a hopeful sign. It allowed them to keep holding on.

In 2013, while Judi and her mother, Dorothy, were attending a conference in Phoenix, Dorothy Boyer fractured her hip. Initially, it seemed like a rather minor incident, and they would be in and out of the hospital in a few days. Several months later, Judi's mother had yet to leave the hospital. Shortly before they were about to discharge her, a phone call came to Judi from the doctor treating Dorothy: "You need to get to the hospital. Your mother is dying."

In her final moments, Dorothy turned to Judi. "I just want to go home," she said. "Then go. Go home," replied Judi.

The last word she spoke was "Alan."
"She knew. Alan was there to greet her, and she knew," said Judi.

March 7, 2016

On the night of March 7, a day after what would have been Alan's 70th birthday, a phone call came and Judi answered. A deep voice responded, "May I speak to Judith, please?"

"This is she," she replied.
"This is the U.S. Army..."


It was at this moment that Judi knew. "You guys found Alan."

"We did."

For decades, graves were looted by remains traders, the goal being to sell back to their countries of origin. In this case,

a Laotian peace activist had come into possession of Alan's remains and returned them to the U.S. Government. Not only were the remains a DNA match for Alan, but it was the most powerful match the military staff administering the test had ever seen. Several days after the phone call, special forces soldiers, as well as Michael Linnington, the Director of the Department for POWs/MIAs Accounting Agency (DPAA) came to Judi's Central Florida home. "For 48 years, I didn't know anything," said Judi. "Now I'm able to grieve. I never was able to do it."

While Charles and Dorothy were both alive, they made it clear that they wanted Alan to be buried at Arlington National Cemetery, and Judi was sure to make that happen. On June 22, 2016, Alan was finally laid to rest with full military honors. The turnout for the funeral was remarkable, according to Judi, with high school classmates and friends from over 50 years ago in attendance, as well as Special Forces soldiers from all over the country. Most significant was the turnout of Theta Chi brothers from Beta Epsilon/Montana. "You saw that it was a true brotherhood that they had," noted Judi. "He always mentioned Theta Chi in his letters to me, and the men who attended the service truly speak to how important of a role it played in his life."

The night before the service, the brothers who traveled met up for drinks and food. Bill Thomas (Beta Epsilon/Montanta 1969) and his wife traveled from Europe just to attend the service. "Al and I were brothers in the truest sense," explained Thomas. Both men had found their way to Montana from Illinois, and realized that

their interests and spirited personalities were identical, quickly becoming friends and moving in together. "At dinner, I stood up and said how proud I was to be a Theta Chi then, and how proud I still am to this day," said Thomas. There were six Beta Epsilon brothers from Alan's era who were able to attend the ceremony, three of which came from his same pledge class. "Those guys who were at the Arlington ceremony were my support, said Thomas. "They knew that, of all of us, Alan and I were probably the closest. So I needed to rely on them. They were there for me, they were there for Judi, and they were there for Al." Thomas went on to describe the lasting impact the Fraternity has had on his life. "Being in the Fraternity at Montana was a wonderful experience for all of us. None of us had any doubt about being in Theta Chi. It was a great experience."

Judi Bouchard is a persistent advocate on the POW/MIA issue, speaking to groups across the country. "Our country's soldiers need to know that they won't be forgotten, they won't be left behind, and they will always be accounted for," explained Judi. Prior to her passing, Dorothy Boyer was heavily involved in Vietnow, a group dedicated to assisting families with issues stemming from the Vietnam War. The Boyers also had started a scholarship fund in Alan's memory, which continues to this day. The annual fund helps students attending the University of Montana and is based on financial need and academic performance. To remember Brother Boyer, a resolution was read to the 500 attendees this past summer at the 160th Anniversary Convention in Atlanta.



DELTA/RPI In October, the Rensselaer Alumni Association (RAA) honored Richard O. Bollam (1966) with its Distinguished Service Award. The Distinguished Service Award, the highest award given by the Rensselaer Alumni Association, was created in 1967 by the RAA Board of Trustees to recognize distinguished service by alumni or friends of Rensselaer, to a profession, to the nation, or to humanity. The criterion for this award is a continuous record of distinguished service in a chosen field of endeavor that is related to the objectives and purposes of Rensselaer.

Although the Distinguished Service Award is bestowed on any alumni or friends of RPI, and not just alumni from Greek organizations, Delta Chapter is extremely proud to have four other recipients: Carl J. Thomsen (1938), C. Sheldon Roberts (1948), W. Robert McIntosh (1960), and Nicholas M. Donofrio (1967). Since only 47 awards have ever been presented, that means that more than 10% have been given to Delta Chapter alumni—an amazing accomplishment. This just emphasizes Delta's allegiance to Theta Chi's maxim of "Alma Mater First and Theta Chi for Alma Mater."



Dan Fleetham, Sr. (Alpha/Norwich 1934)

February 5, 1912-September 6, 2016

Grateful for his life and brotherhood, it is with great sadness that Theta Chi Fraternity announces the passing of Daniel W. Fleetham, Sr. to the Chapter Eternal. Brother Fleetham was 104 years old.

After enrolling in classes at Norwich University in the 1930s, he faced hardships as a result of the Great Depression. By 1934, he was forced to leave school after his bank failed and left him with no savings to continue his education. Facing an uncertain future, Brother Fleetham enlisted in the United States Navy, serving aboard the USS Lexington. It was during this time that Dan Sr., a longtime fan of



competitive high diving, helped train numerous naval athletes for the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, Germany. When World War II came, Brother Fleetham, by then a chief petty officer, trained naval gunners to bring down enemy planes.

Though he held numerous jobs throughout his lifetime, Brother Fleetham is perhaps best known for having served 30 years on the bench as a lay judge, dispensing "common sense" and ruling on minor misdemeanors, resulting in fines. Court would normally be held at his family's inn, sometimes in the dining room, when the space got too crowded. Many in the small town of Canaan, NH, knew him as the "25-buck judge," a nickname that he earned as a result of the typical fine given after a ruling. The lay judge system was discontinued in New Hampshire in 1982, and Brother Fleetham retired shortly thereafter.

In retirement, Brother Fleetham became a regular fixture at Theta Chi events. In 1992, he made it a point to attend the installation of the Theta Pi Chapter at Bridgewater State College when the soonto-be initiates elected to hold their installation ceremony more than 160 miles away in Norwich, VT. Following his hosting duties at the 150th Anniversary Convention at Norwich in 2006, Brother Fleetham declared that he would continue to represent Alpha Chapter at each of the International Conventions that followed, traveling across the country by train to the 152nd Anniversary Convention in Indianapolis, the 154th Anniversary Convention in Orlando, the 156th Anniversary Convention in Palm Springs, CA, the 158th Anniversary Convention in Minneapolis, and finally the 160th Anniversary Convention in Atlanta. Brother Fleetham was also a celebrated guest at regional Mid-Year Leadership Conferences throughout New England and a fixture at Theta Chi Founders Day events held every April at Norwich University.

Brother Fleetham has been recognized many times over for his dedication to Theta Chi, having been awarded the Golden Guard in 2005, the Diamond Brigade in 2007, the Citation of Honor in 2008, and the Theta Chi for Life Award in 2012. At the 160th Anniversary Convention in Atlanta, he received a standing ovation following the passage and reading of a resolution recognizing his truly lifelong

Beyond Theta Chi, Brother Fleetham was a member of numerous service-based organizations, including the Boy Scouts, Masons, and Scottish Rite Masons. He also founded the Canaan's Lion Club and was a member of Weld-Webster American Legion Post 55. In 2012, his service was recognized by New Hampshire Governor John Lynch, who declared February 5, 2012 as "Daniel W. Fleetham Day."

Theta Chi members throughout the world join in prayerful support of the Fleetham family. Our Fraternity is much better for having counted Daniel Fleetham, Sr. as a member. He was the true embodiment of Theta Chi for Life.

Dr. Mel George (Delta Iota/Northwestern 1956)

Dr. Mel George, who received the Distinguished Achievement Award in early April, recently entered the Chapter Eternal. Mel was President Emeritus of the University of Missouri System, as well as President Emeritus of St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. After graduating from Northwestern, Brother George received a doctorate in mathematics from Princeton University. Prior to these roles, George served as the Vice President for Academic Affairs and professor of mathematics. He also worked at the University of Nebraska as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

In a 1987 Rattle article, Brother George notes his passion for his profession. "After 26 years in higher education, I am more than ever convinced of its importance to America's future. It is an investment, not merely an expenditure." Throughout his longstanding career, Dr. Mel George was consistently recognized among educators as one of the nation's best. He was known to put his students above all else, at one point going so far as to move into a dormitory to better understand student life.

"Not only was Mel accomplished in higher education, he was also an outstanding Theta Chi," remarked Executive Director Mike Mayer. "When we established our colony at the University of Missouri in 2007, Mel stepped up as chapter adviser. He was held in very high regard among the collegians and played a critical role in helping the colony achieve chapter status." Mel was also a guest speaker at Theta Chi's Presidents Conference in 2009.

Mel is survived by his wife of 57 years, two daughters, one granddaughter, and his biological brother.


