

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Alternatives Incorporated engages the community in our work. We participate in awareness events and provide education and training opportunities. These are customized to the audience and focused on how to help break the cycle of violence and connect survivors to our programs. In addition, we provide prevention programming in middle and high school classrooms. Sessions are focused on helping youth identify red flags of unhealthy relationships, discuss boundaries, and learn about consent.






