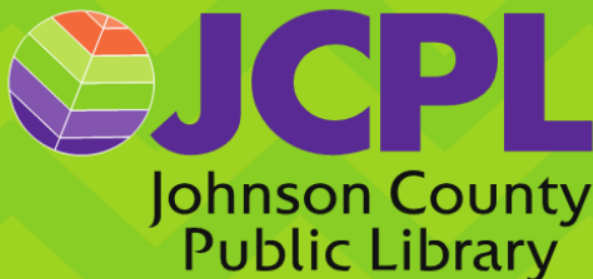

Conversation Starters

- What is race? A group of people who have in common some visible physical traits. This is different from a person's culture or ethnicity.
- Sometimes people say they are "colorblind" to mean that they believe everyone is equal. This idea may sound nice, but a lot of people feel like that idea isn't totally honest or ignores parts of them that they love.
- Race comes up a lot today. What have you heard about race? How does it make you feel?
- Talking about differences, especially race, can get uncomfortable. That's okay, but just because it's uncomfortable, doesn't mean it's not important. What do you think we can learn from talking about race?
- What are some ways we can celebrate our differences?
