Her personal mission is to ensure that each client's health and wellness is being supported by all staff. Beth gives all her clients emotional support and helps to promote growth in their abilities. Furthermore, she makes sure to communicate with everyone involved in the care of all clients, including doctors, nurses, family members, and other staff members.

While, on paper, her duties include personal hygiene, housekeeping, transportation, medication administration, shopping, and cooking, Beth always goes above and beyond basic needs by infusing her work with purpose and a genuine care for those she serves.

She worked 36 hours without relief, never complained, and made sure that the individuals in the home were not only well taken care of, but that they had plenty of activities to keep them busy while they were snowed in.

Beth is always focused on the wellbeing of clients and never lets her personal life interfere with her work. She attends every monthly staff meeting equipped with valuable feedback and innovative ideas about how to improve the lives of our clients. She also assists the program manager in all aspects of running the group home, and especially excels in maintaining open lines of communication between all key players.
