



UNDERGRADUATE COUNCIL APPLICATION INFORMATION

DESIRED SKILLS

Candidates for the UGC should possess the following skills:

- Ability to model the Mission and Values, honor the *Ritual*, and adhere to the [Volunteer Code of Ethics](#) and the [Fraternity Code of Conduct](#)
- Strong interpersonal communication skills
- A history of chapter and/or campus leadership
- A desire to provide service to Delta Tau Delta beyond his own chapter

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

The Fraternity's *Constitution* requires all members of the UGC:

- Be a full-time student
- Be in good standing at his host institution

EXPECTATIONS

Members of the UGC attend scheduled Undergraduate Council meetings. In addition, UGC members will serve on one other Arch Chapter standing committee. UGC members are expected to attend Emerge each year during their term of service. All members of the Undergraduate Council must adhere to the Fraternity's volunteer code of ethics and adhere to the Fraternity's [Code of Conduct](#).

EXPENSES

The Fraternity's General Fund covers the travel, lodging and meal expenses of UGC members attending scheduled Undergraduate Council meetings. Most, if not all, meetings are expected to be conducted virtually. Expenses to attend Emerge are typically the responsibility of the UGC member or his home chapter. Other expenses relating to service may be covered with Central Office approval.
