Franklin College Featured For Efforts with Core Curricula Reform

An article was published on September 24 on the website of University Business featuring Franklin and Harvard as examples of efforts to reform core curricula. University Business is a publication for presidents and other senior officers at nearly every two- and four-year U.S. college and university. The magazine covers all aspects of college and university management and reaches, by request, more than 45,000 print subscribers and 41,000 digital subscribers. On the Big Screen

Professor of Fine Arts and Theatre Department Chair Gordon Strain announced two movies he produced had their Indiana premiere at the Heartland International Film Festival in October 2019. First was *The Miseducation of Bindu*, filmed at Broad Ripple High School in Indianapolis. The film had its world premiere October 9 at Mill Valley Film Festival (just outside of San Francisco) and premiered at the Heartland International Film Festival on October 12, earning the Indiana Spotlight Award. The second film was *Ms. White Light*. This film had its world premiere at SXSW last March and its Indiana premiere on October 16 at the Heartland International Film Festival, to be followed by a festival in Santa Fe and then on to Italy and Poland in November. A total of 15 faculty, staff, alumni and students participated in this project in a variety of ways, including production assistants, stand-ins or extras. Both films will be widely distributed in 2020.
