
Jump Rope for Heart Day

- THINKING DEEPLY: The Indiana
 Academic Standards emphasize critical thinking. It requires students to analyze more, discuss more, justify more and explain their thinking and understanding, both verbally and in writing.
- Take —Away: Really thinking deeply is hard. Let it BE hard, and help students talk it out and explain their thinking.
- <u>INTEGRATING LEARNING</u>: The Indiana Academic Standards emphasize learning across disciplines (Ex: reading with math and social studies standards combined into one task). Students spend more time working together with different settings, structures and tools.
- <u>Take-Away:</u> Problems and solutions happen every day in the real world. Students need to use what they've learned in all their classes to explain their line of thought.
- SHOW HOW THEY KNOW: The Indiana Academic Standards emphasize proof and evidence.
- <u>Take-Away:</u> Students will be required to EXPLAIN HOW they know something. They will be

required to use evidence from text to support their answers.

MIDTERM GRADE REPORTS

The school will not be sending home midterm grade reports. Parents can go on to Power School to check their child's grades at any time. If you do not have the Power School app or have internet access, and you would like a paper copy of your child's grades, please let the office know. We will send a paper copy home.

MATH

One of our school improvement goals for this year focuses on math skills and fact fluency. Each grade level is responsible for mastering certain facts. The following list shows the facts your child is responsible for mastering:

• Kindergarten: + & - (0-5)

• 1^{st} : + and - (0-10)

• 2nd: + and - (0-20)

• 3rd: +, - and X

• 4th: x and division

• 5th: x and division

The end goal is for every child to leave LES being fluent in all their math facts! We ask that parents take just a few minutes each day (in the car, during commercials, standing in the check-out line, at the dinner table, etc.) to ask your child a few of his or her math facts. The facts are considered mastered when they are answered automatically- that's what fluency is. We would greatly appreciate parents joining us in this effort to improve our students' math fluency.
