## Celebrating MCCF Grant Awards!



The cheers were joyful and the smiles were wide as the confetti rained down on the first round of 2021 MCCF grant recipients! As we continue to enjoy 30 years of working for the good of Montgomery County, it seemed only fitting to throw some confetti in celebration of the \$178,414 we awarded to eight local nonprofits. (Note: though the confetti is biodegradable, we made sure to pick up, sweep up or suck up every piece!)

Though we've been awarding grants for 30 years, it never gets old to do so. It is encouraging and energizing to be that bridge between donors and their desire to help our community. Every donor that gives to an unrestricted fund helps make these grants a reality, and we are so grateful.

With the lingering effects of the pandemic on our nonprofits, we continued to offer COVID-19 Operating support applications in this grant cycle. During reviews, we learned that Montgomery County United Fund received Emergency Relief funds from Lilly Endowment and the Indiana United Way. As we did last fall, we were thrilled to partner with MCUF to meet these COVID-19 grant requests, and a total of \$60,000 was awarded to three nonprofits.

Early childhood education continues to be a major focus for the MCCF. In this grant cycle, we awarded \$60,279 to three local child care facilities.
