Indiana Academic Standards

Have you ever wondered why the expectations for your child's reading and writing skills have become so challenging? Below are examples of what the *Indiana Academic Standards* for *Reading* in grades K-5 expect...

RN.2: KEY IDEAS AND TEXTUAL SUPPORT- Students extract and construct meaning from <u>nonfiction texts</u> using a range of comprehension skills.

- <u>Kindergarten</u>: With support, ask and answer questions about important elements of a text (e.g., events, topics, concepts).
- <u>1 Grade</u>: Ask and answer questions about key details to clarify and confirm understanding of a text.
- <u>2 Grade</u>: Ask and answer questions about the main idea and supporting facts and details in a text to confirm understanding.
- 3 Grade: Ask and answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text, referring explicitly to the text as the basis for the answers.
- 4 Grade: Refer to details and examples in a text when explaining what a text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text.
- <u>5 Grade</u>: Quote accurately from a text when explaining what a text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text
