### **Classroom News:**

<u>Mrs. Snyder – 6<sup>th</sup> LA</u> - 6<sup>th</sup> Grade ELA classes are reading and learning about non-fiction. The students are learning about text structure.

We will not have school in the building on Monday! **It is an e-Learning day.** Please be sure to complete your e-Learning assignment on Monday, on Canvas. I will be available through canvas from 10AM-2PM on Monday for any questions.

**P3** is into the 6&7 chapter of the Hobbit adventure and will continue onto chapter 8&9 this week.

Mr. Taylor – 6<sup>th</sup> Social Studies - I was out two days for a conference this week. So the students used that to take their Brazil "Quest," it went fairly well. We finished up with the geography of Brazil and have moved towards the history. Next week the students and I will finish up with Brazil and move on to more countries in South America.

Mr. Taylor-7<sup>th</sup> LA- Students this week worked on direct and indirect objects. They also learned the best ways to utilize Read works and Common lit websites. We started a new vocab unit and will finish that next week! Students will also hear from the UC Public Library next week, that's always a highlight!

<u>Mr. Gulley – PE/Health-</u> Test on Chapter 9, then pass out locks and lockers for PE. Then start doing Physical fitness exercising, sit-ups, pushups, jumping jacks and running.

Mrs. Fields- 6<sup>th</sup> Math- Period 2 finally wrapped up coordinate planes this week and is moving on to percent equation, percent proportion and percent of change next week. Period 3, 4, 6 will focus on distance and reflections on a coordinate plane. Be sure to see Canvas for guidance on Monday for eLearning!

Mr. Hofmann-6<sup>th</sup> Science-. 6<sup>th</sup> Science has been working with how mass will change the acceleration of an object rolling down a ramp. We've also practiced using a triple beam balance to make precise measurements of objects in grams.

<u>Miss Severance – 7<sup>th</sup> Language Arts-</u> This week, students finished learning about direct and indirect objects and continued practicing nonfiction texts by doing assignments on readworks.org and commonlit.org. This is great practice for real-life, every day reading found online and in newspapers and magazines. They also started a new vocabulary lesson which will be test next Thursday, the 21<sup>st</sup>. We will continue to work on nonfiction and grammar for the next few weeks. Don't forget to be reading for your book reports; reports will be due on April 2<sup>nd</sup>.

<u>Mr. Bruns – 7<sup>th</sup> Social Studies – This week the students were working on their Middle Eastern country projects.</u> Presentations started on Friday and will take us into next week. We will continue to learn about this region next week as well. If your student has questions over their E-learning assignment please have them message me on Canvas on Monday and I will attempt to get back with them as fast as I can.

<u>Mrs. Dannaker – 7<sup>th</sup> Science-</u> Science-We will be starting a new unit this coming Tuesday. Don't forget elearning on Canvas for Monday.

### Mrs. Persinger – Art – Mrs. Persinger – 6<sup>th</sup> Art

On Monday, all students will have an art assignment available on Canvas to complete. Students will practice how to draw bubble letters using a step by step process and then apply that to drawing their name using bubble letters. We will begin our Sculpture in the Round project this week and hopefully all the clay faces will be dry enough to fire in the kiln, so we can paint them next week! Sketchbook Assignment #6 will be due on Friday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>.

<u>Mrs. Graham -</u> All classes are working with SLOPE as a new concept. We have learned so far that slope is the "slant" of a line and that linear functions have a constant slope. Next week we will continue learning about different types of linear functions and how to calculate the slope of a line.

The Math-RED, GREEN, ORANGE classes have been using PEMDAS to solve integer problems. Next week, we will move on to linear expressions.

The Math-YELLOW and BLUE classes got behind this week. We have practiced setting up equations based on word problems. We will work with inequalities next week.

<u>Mrs. Goodwin</u> -8<sup>th</sup> Grade Business: Students will begin a Unit on Personal and Employability Skills. Students will investigate various skills needed for success in school, life, and their future careers.

<u>Mrs. Sutter – 8<sup>th</sup> Language Arts-</u>Students will continue their novel study: Mississippi Trial, 1955 by Chris Crowe. They will also be working on vocabulary unit 7.

<u>Ms. Estep – 8<sup>th</sup> Math –</u> A reminder to all students to complete their e-learning assignments found on Canvas on Monday, 2/18. The deadline is 2/25. If students have not completed the work by 2/20 they will be given time in Catch Up Café to get the work done.

8<sup>th</sup> Grade Math- Students are learning about linear relationships.

Algebra-Students are continuing work with linear relationships. Then we will move on to systems of linear equations.

<u>Mrs. Crumley – 8<sup>th</sup> Science-</u> Students are working on Sesame Street characters! We will be moving on to our study of DNA.

Mr. Gutzwiller – 8<sup>th</sup> Social Studiespertaining to Great Britain and the Natives. In addition, students embarked their way through the War of 1812. <u>Mr.Nash-8<sup>th</sup> AG-</u> This week in 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Ag we finally took our animal science Unit test on Tuesday. For the rest of the week we have been working on Plant and Soil science chapters 15 Plant structures and taxonomy and 16 Plant physiology. Next week we will wrap up with those 2 sections and start with chapter 17 Plant reproduction.
