12	company is being compensated, therefore be it

14	RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) request the American Academy of
15	Family Physicians (AAFP) to petition the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to create
16	a reimbursement mechanism that fairly compensates a physician who has been asked by an insurance
17	entity to participate in a peer to peer or prior authorization.
