2 **ENTITLED:** Compensation for Physician Assistants, Peer to Peer

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5 WHEREAS, Board-certified physicians already have a layer of expertise capable of making complex  
6 judgment and recommendations for their patients,

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8 WHEREAS, with increasing amounts of prior authorizations and peer to peers adding to increased  
9 administrative burden, and

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11 WHEREAS, work must be adequately compensated as the physician working for the insurance  
12 company is being compensated, therefore be it

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14 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) request the American Academy of  
15 Family Physicians (AAFP) to petition the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to create  
16 a reimbursement mechanism that fairly compensates a physician who has been asked by an insurance  
17 entity to participate in a peer to peer or prior authorization.
