2021 brings new ISPROUT features. You may have noticed the new interface prior to winter break. You can learn more about the changes <u>here</u>. The new window for entering student ratings opens January 5 and remains open through April 1. Additionally, the scan sheet is now available for you to utilize for scoring students if you choose.

Also, there is a new individual student report (ISR) for families. It shows growth for the 2020-2021 school year and provides talking points to share with families. The ISR for Families is a report specifically designed for families that displays how children are performing throughout the year. The report provides information about a child's strengths and provides families with ideas for supporting their child at home. This report will show scores starting from the first data collection of the 2020-21 school year. The following resources provide important information on generating the report and utilizing the information with families.
