





Franklin College Professor Publishes First Poetry Collection

Callista Buchen, creative writing professor and author, released her first poetry collection, the culmination of eight years of creative research and reflection. Buchen describes the collection of prose poems as a series "about the early days of motherhood and challenges in those days." She began drafting the poems when she was pregnant with her first child as an attempt to make sense of the uncertainty she experienced as a new mother. The title – Look Look Look – is her attempt to reconcile her personal history with the lack of

FC Students to Present Holiday Concerts
