Classroom News:

<u>Mrs. Hertel – 6^{th} LA</u>-We have had a great beginning to our school year. We have done a few "Get to Know You" activities and an "Investigate the Teacher" activity. We made a trip to our school library to choose a book. Next week we will be doing NWEA testing.

<u>Mr. Hofmann – 6^{th} SS -</u> 6^{TH} Grade Social Studies has started the year by looking at the concepts that Geographers use when studying our world. They should be able to differentiate between a political map/globe vs a physical map/globe. They've also been working on Latitude and Longitude skills.

Mrs. Fields- 6th Math-What a GREAT start!! I've enjoyed getting to know your child. Everyone seems to be adjusting to UCMS, their locker and changing classes. NWEA Math testing begins next week. This will give me a baseline of your child's math abilities and give me an understanding of their strengths and weaknesses. **Period 2** - We will dive into a review of adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions next week after testing. **Period 3**, 4, 7 – We will begin with a review of place value, multi-digit multiplication and division after testing.

Mrs. Beiser–6th ScienceSixth graders are off to a "scientific start" with lab safety and learning equipment. Labs begin on Wednesday. Students will practice using lab equipment and study for their quiz. The quiz is Thursday over lab rules and equipment. Students can study their notes from their science journals. Next 6th grade science learns the metric system.

<u>Miss Severance – 7^{th} LA-</u> This week, students began learning about non-fiction. We've covered text features and text structures so far. Next week, we will be doing our first round of NWEA testing. So, there will be no homework during that time. However, the following week, we will hit the ground

running with a new Flocabulary program as well as assignments and practice dealing with non-fiction and informational text. Welcome back to school! It's going to be a great year.

Mr. Hawkins – 7th SS – We are off to a great start in Social Studies reviewing the basics on maps and time zones as well as reviewing land forms and land marks. Next week we are gearing up to travel to the past of Early Civilizations as well as our first big project involving planning your own garden paradise. So buckle up 7th grade!

<u>Mrs. Dannaker – 7^{th} Science-</u> Students have done a great job at labs so far this year. We will continue working on lab skills and procedures this week as well as having our first assessment over form and function of plant and animal cells.

Mrs. Persinger –7th grade art- We have had a SUPER start to the school year in the art room! I can see great things happening in here all year long. This week we will be reviewing one point perspective and then experimenting with two point perspective with a final project due on Friday, August 23rd.
